### MEDICAL MINISTRY




#### Kevin

Last week Kevin 8, fell and broke his arm while having a seizure. Kevin has learning difficulties and began having seizures this past year. He's now on medication and on a waiting list to see a neurologist in 2 months. He, his mom and siblings live near our bodega and regularly come to help out with small jobs. *Right:* A couple of weeks ago, while accompanying the team to buy supplies, Kevin was excited to have his picture taken with 2 National Guard soldiers. #### Maria and Jesús

Maria has diabetes. Earlier this year she came close to amputation of her right foot due to severe ulceration. Following instructions, she worked hard to gain control over her blood sugar levels and managed to avoid the amputation. However, her foot is now quite deformed and walking is very difficult. She needs to continue working at her factory job to provide for her son Jesús 12, who is on the autistic spectrum. Jesús and his mom have a close bond, helping each other with their disabilities. Last week V&O helped Maria with a podiatrist appointment to have special inserts made for her shoes. It's not certain if this will be enough to save her foot long term, but we're praying it will help to improve her mobility for as long as possible. Maria has been given a seated position at her job for now. Jesus was also suffering from a rash on his skin. V&O was able to provide funds for medication that cleared it up.

#### Anai

An overwhelming situation for this family. Anai 30 has stage 3 cancer. On top of that, about 5 weeks ago, her sister Lucero was shot and killed in a bus hijacking in Southern MX. Anai and her husband now have custody of her 6 children as well as their own 4. With 10 children in the household (ranging in age from 4 -17), their small income is stretched beyond its limits. V&O has helped Anai apply for financial aid to assist with raising Lucero's children and we're also helping with food and grocery cards.

With Anai's situation though, the future care of Lucero's children is uncertain. Much prayer needed. Thank you!





## SIMNSA CHILDRENS HOME

Over the last 5 years we've been visiting and teaching the kids at Simnsa Children's Home, (formerly known as Manantial de la Esperanza). Recently they lost their source of income for food, which wasn't a lot to begin with, but sure helped! Since then, they've been relying on leftover food from a school lunch program. Their director has been working on securing food donations from nearby businesses, but the logistics are not so easy, as they are in a semi-rural location. This month, thanks to your generosity, V&O was able to step in and provide some much needed and welcomed food supplies.
