This month our congregation has an opportunity to support retired Ministers and their families with a special Joy Gift offering December 22.



Tired legs and sore feet may have been the order of the day but were quickly forgotten with the satisfaction of a "Dinner Day" well done. COLLIERSTOWN COOKS

The CPC ladies are launching a new column in our monthly newsletter. This month features a few of our favorite Christmas recipes.

Raynelle's favorite cookie recipe Old Fashion Peanut Butter Cookies

2 1/2 cups flour

1 tsp Baking Powder

1/2 tsp salt

1 cup butter, softened

1 cup creamy peanut butter

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup packed brown sugar

2 eggs

1 tsp vanilla

1. Preheat oven to 350°F.

2. Mix first 4 ingredients until well blended. Beat butter, peanut butter and sugars in large bowl with mixer until light and fluffy. Blend in eggs and vanilla. Gradually add flour mixture, beating well after each addition.

3. Drop tablespoonfuls of dough (I use a cookie scoop), 2 inches apart, onto baking sheets sprayed with cooking spray. Flatten each, in crisscross pattern, with tines of fork. If you prefer, stick a chocolate Kiss in the middle.

4. Bake 8 to 10 min. or until golden brown. Cool on baking sheets 3 min.; remove to wire racks. Cool completely. ENJOY!!!

Donna's favorite pumpkin bread

From Taste of Home - double for 2 loaves

1-2/3 cups all-purpose flour

1-1/2 cups sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1 teaspoon allspice

3/4 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

2 large eggs, room temperature

1 cup canned pumpkin

1/2 cup canola oil

1/2 cup water

1/2 cup California Walnuts, optional

1/2 cup raisins, optional

Preheat oven to 350°.

Combine first 8 ingredients. Whisk together eggs, pumpkin, oil and water; stir into dry ingredients just until moistened. Fold in walnuts and, if desired, raisins.

Pour into a greased 9x5-in. loaf pan.

Bake until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean, 65-70 minutes.

Cool in pan 10 minutes before removing to a wire rack.

Debbie's favorite Cranberry pie

In a buttered pie pan or plate place:

2 cups of washed whole cranberries ½ cup of chopped nuts (I use pecans.) 1/3 cup of sugar

In a mixing bowl, combine:

2 eggs

1 cup of sugar

1 scant cup of flour

1/8 tsp. salt

½ cup of melted margarine or butter

1/4 cup of vegetable oil

<u>Preparation Directions:</u>

1. Pour contents of mixing bowl over the ingredients in the pie pan.

2. Bake 50 minutes in a 325 degree oven. Top will be lightly browned.

I often make this in a 9 inch square baking dish and cut into bars.

If you have a meeting scheduled or another function that requires use of the church building, please make a note on the calendar in the main hallway. Doug uses this calendar as a guide.




