

FROM THE PASTOR

Thomas Merton wrote these words in Zen and the Birds of Appetite, "Saint John of the Cross compares man to a window through which the light of God is shining. If the windowpane is clean of every stain, it is completely transparent, we do not see it at all: it is 'empty' and nothing is seen by the light. But if a man bears in himself the stains of spiritual egotism and preoccupation with his illusory and exterior self, even in 'good things,' then the windowpane itself is clearly seen by reason of the stains that are on it. Hence, if a man can be rid of the stains and dust produced within him by his fixation upon what is good and bad in reference to himself, he will be transformed in God and will be 'one with God."

Henry D. Thoreau wrote this piece, "I saw a delicate flower had grown up two feet high, between the horses' path and the wheel track. An inch more to right or left had sealed its fate, or an inch higher; and yet it lived to flourish as much as if it had a thousand acres of untrodden space around it, and never knew the danger it incurred. It did not borrow trouble, not invite an evil fate by apprehending it."

Eugene H Peterson wrote Praying with Jesus this devotion: "All Matthew 13: 44-46 'The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which someone found and hid; then in his joy he goes and sells all that he has and buys that field. Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls, on finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it.'

"The two parables have one word in common: 'all.' there must be no equivocation, no hesitation, no calculation, before God's offer of new life. Everything we have is traded in for everything that God has for us. What, for you, is included in the 'all'?

"PRAYER: O God, I don't want to bring a bookkeeper's mind to the life of faith, anxious adding up columns of what I must give, columns of what I might get. I give all and accept all. Amen."

Are we as trusting as the "delicate flower" of Thoreau to give "ALL" of ourselves, and as Peterson invites us to do to God, and thus, becoming that pane of glass which is not seen but allows others to see God in Jesus Christ revealed? May others truly give honor, praise, and glory to the Holy One because of our faith and behavior.



CPC WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDIES BEGIN IN SEPTEMBER

As we enjoy the first days of summer, the Presbyterian Women at CPC are making plans for a new year of Bible study and fellowship with other women in our congregation and community. The PW supports two Bible Study groups, the C & F Circle and the Night Circle, that meet monthly to study God's Word, fellowship with one another, and support various outreach programs. This year both groups will be involved in a study of the Sabbath. The C & F Circle will be using the PW Horizons study entitled "Celebrating Sabbath: Accepting God's Gift of Rest and Delight" written by Reverend Dr. Carol Bechtel, a professor of Old Testament at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan. The Night Circle will also be involved in a Sabbath study that emphasizes "keeping the Sabbath" as a vital part of the believer's life. Tentative plans for the Night Circle study include the use of the book, Sabbath Keeping: Finding Freedom in the Rhythms of Rest by Dr. Lynne Baab. Dr. Baab, an ordained Presbyterian minister, is a teacher and an author. She is currently teaching as an adjunct professor at Hope International University in California.

Our Circles are small groups of women of all ages that have found their faith and Christian walk grows and matures when they actively seek to know God by studying His Word in a consistent way. The Circles are groups that celebrate joys, share burdens, and offer encouragement and support. Laughter and friendship are several of the fringe benefits enjoyed by members. The Night Circle meets the **first Thursday of each month from September through May at** 7:00 **p.m. in the Fellowship Hall**. A time of hospitality that includes a light supper precedes the study starting at 6:30 p.m. The Night Circle shares its Bible study virtually at 7:00 p.m. from the CPC Facebook page using FaceBook Live for those who can't attend in person. The C & F Circle meets on **the third Tuesday of each month beginning at** 1:00 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. The C & F meetings also include a hospitality time.

Both Circles would like to extend an invitation to each CPC woman to join one of our groups for the new Bible study year.
