A Note from Pastor Carl... The following words were written by a very dear friend of mine, an elder at another Presbyterian congregation in Rockbridge County, Henry Schreiber. May you find them providing meaning to our church family at Collierstown Presbyterian.

"The size of Collierstown is less important in determining its future than what it 'does with what it has'. Collierstown will continue to be attractive as a place of worship, if Collierstown is built on a set of shared beliefs about its future and if good leadership stimulates broad participation in its affairs.

"Collierstown will thrive when their Christian fellowship, worship, and education programs are accepted not only by its current members but also by the community. Collierstown has room to grow. Most potential members expect ample facilities for worship and spiritual growth.

"Collierstown will benefit when other area churches prosper, and suffer when other local churches stumble.

"The biggest threats to the future of Collierstown are resistance to change and apathy.

"Individual leadership is perhaps the single most important factor influencing success. Leadership plus passion can displace apathy and fear of change to make things happen. Good leaders serve as role models for the next generation. Natural leaders not only present new ideas and paths for positive change but also begin by reaching consensus about what the Collierstown congregation wants for their future.

"Everyone knows everyone else at Collierstown. Though we may be ambivalent about everyone knowing our business, this is one of the most comforting attributes of Collierstown.

"Resistance to adequate stewardship, coupled with reduced aid from the central church, may threaten the sustainability of the infrastructure of small churches such as Collierstown. In times of financial hardships, the congregation of Collierstown must take care not to accept lower expectations about what it can achieve, and must guard against such becoming a self-fulfilling prophecy. Collierstown must not undervalue its potential impact.

"Finally, there is no substitute for optimism. Someone has said that 'we become who we think we are.' Believing in Collierstown and what it stands for can make all the difference, and if we are successful, our children and grandchildren will be able to fulfill their spiritual needs at Collierstown.

"The take-away message in order to maintain as well as to enhance the Christian worship at Collierstown is for us to build on our shared Christian beliefs. Our leadership must be agents of positive change, establish high standards and expectations for our Church, and be passionate in serving our Lord to meet the Church's needs. Collectively and optimistically, 'we become who we think we are."


CELEBRATING THE PW'S BIRTHDAY!

Witness and Congregational Care Committee Session Update May 2022-CPC NEWSLETTER

The Witness and Congregational Care Committee completed FOUR initiatives/projects during the month of April. They were:

- 1. Collection of a 4 cents a meal offering was taken each Sunday of March and donated to the Effinger Community's Rise Against Hunger Packing Day. Funds collected totaled \$985.00 and will be used to purchase the food supplies that will be packaged on Saturday, June 4 at the Effinger Firehouse. The plans for the Packing Day are being coordinated by the Collierstown United Methodist Charge.
- 2. An introduction to the One Great Hour of Sharing, a special offering of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A) was given to the Church family on Sunday, March 27 during the 11:00 a.m. worship service. This offering was taken on Palm Sunday, April 10 during the morning worship hour. A total of \$1159.00 was received surpassing the congregational goal of \$1000. Funds will be divided and given to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, Presbyterian Hunger Program, and the Self-Development of People program.
- 3. Plans for the celebration of Nellie Leech's 95th birthday on May 11 have been made. The congregation will give her a floral bouquet. A representative of the committee will take her cards, notes of encouragement, and small gifts from the church family when they visit.
- 4. A review of the church's active member roster has been done to identify and reach out to those not participating through attendance (virtually or in person) or financial giving during the past two years. Those identified were contacted by letter making them aware of ministry opportunities and programming available virtually and in person. The goal of the contact was to draw members not participating back into fellowship. Those contacted were asked to respond by April 15 if they wanted to continue as an active member. A report and recommendation to the Session will be made at the May Session meeting.
