PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN TO SPONSOR BLANKET SUNDAY

January 23, 2022 is "Blanket Sunday" at Collierstown Presbyterian Church! Each year the CPC Presbyterian Women have set aside a Sunday in January to encourage our church family to donate funds to purchase blankets for distribution by Church World Service. The blankets purchased will be given to needy people around the world. Blankets serve many purposes for those in need. They are used to shelter a homeless family, they become a way of transporting and storing a family's belongings when a move becomes necessary, and of course they provide warmth when the temperatures drop. Sometimes blankets are used to cover an individual when clothing is inadequate. Ten dollars will provide one blanket to an individual or family.

Ten dollars is a significant sum of money but when examined in light of how that sum is often spent, it is easy to see how little it takes to make such an important provision. Many will spend ten dollars for snacks, coffee, and entertainment that has no lasting value. Why not use that amount to make a lasting investment?

As we begin a new year let us resolve to put our money with our witness and give ten dollars to buy a blanket or two or three or . . .? In the last four years the CPC PW has purchased 617 blankets by raising \$6170. Our 2021 goal was 105 blankets, and we received enough funds to purchase 330 blankets with the help of the Pike Pod families and the community. This year we are setting the 2022 goal at 120 blankets. We know 2021 was a difficult year here in our community and around the world as we confronted and dealt with the ravages of the COVID-19 crisis, inflation, and a sagging economy. We are however committed to doing amazing things and we ask for your prayerful support as well as for your donations. Offering envelopes are available in the church sanctuary for members to start placing the money they are saving for their gift. On Sunday, January 23 during the 11:00 a.m. worship service the donation envelopes will be collected, and our offering dedicated for the purchase of blankets that Church World Service will distribute to those in need. Members who are worshipping virtually with us and friends of the community can mail donations to Collierstown Presbyterian, 31 Church Drive, Lexington, VA 24450 designating them for "Blanket Sunday." Luke 1:37 says "For with God nothing will be impossible." We give because we care and want to help others by extending God's love and provision to them in a tangible way. Your support is needed and is most appreciated!
