JAMIE MARTIN SCHOLARSHIP



An account has been established at Bank of Botetourt with a tax ID number. The Jamie Martin Memorial Scholarship Fund. Money will be accepted into this account from now until we disburse it in May 2020. This will be a onetime scholarship given to a member of her graduating class, not an annual one. We are still working on the requirements & plan to provide an application to the school by the end of October.

Here are the ideas we have so far:

- 1. A GPA of at least 3.0.
- They will be asked if they are obtaining an Advanced Studies Diploma, but have not yet decided if we want it to be required
- We will ask how they plan to use their education/degree to help others or animals ☺
- 4. Financial Need

We plan to put something in the News Gazette for the general public to be informed it exists if they would like to donate to it. We are open to any ideas for the scholarship requirements.
