

#### A Note from Pastor, Rev. Kevin Channell

As my ministry with Collierstown Presbyterian Church comes to a close, I would like to share some parting words with you.

These past four years have been a time of spiritual growth for me and I hope for you as well. We have laughed together. We have wept together. We have lifted our voices in praise to Almighty God together. We have gathered at the table, at the baptismal font, and at the grave together. In my family's time of need you have responded with love and support. I thank you for welcoming us into your homes, your families, and your hearts. Collierstown is a unique, and gifted congregation. God is doing great things in your midst, and I look forward to hearing of your continued work in his kingdom.

Leaving a congregation is difficult for both the pastor and congregation. We have opened our hearts and shared ourselves with each other. We have made good and lasting friendships that will continue for years to come.

There are some ministerial boundaries that will now need to be established. As of September 30, I will no longer be your pastor, but I will always be your friend. There are ethical guidelines established by the PCUSA and the Presbytery of the Shenandoah that must be adhered to. The Book of Order offers brief but important guidance in the matter of transitions:

"After the dissolution of the pastoral relationship, former pastors and associate pastors shall not provide their pastoral services to members of their former congregations without the invitation of the moderator of session (G-2.0905).

This means that I cannot be involved in any way in the life of CPC. I should not participate in funerals, weddings, baptisms, etc. without the invitation of the session moderator. I know this sounds harsh, but this boundary is crucial to the life and health of the congregation and your new pastoral leadership. This will enable her/him to become the one you call upon, and allow for the growth of a healthy relationship between the congregation and the pastor. According to the presbytery guidelines,

"The former pastor's participation in significant life events inhibits the ability of the new pastor to build pastoral bonds with members of the congregation.".

A second guideline that I must follow concerns our connections through social media. The presbytery guidelines state that we will covenant to

"refrain from all intentional pastoral interaction in person or online"

Therefore, those of you with whom I am friends with through social media will/may be receiving notice that you have been "unfriended." PLEASE do not take this personal. Those of you who wish to reconnect with me may do so after one year. You must make the invitation to do so, I cannot. I hope to reconnect with many of you as time goes on.

It has been an honor and privilege to be your pastor. I will always joyfully cherish our time together in the service of our Lord Jesus Christ. May the Holy Spirit's blessings strengthen you in all good things to the glory of God the Father.
