The Importance of Prayer and Submission

- Paul emphasizes the importance of prayer and giving thanks as the first priority.
- Prayer should be made on behalf of all individuals, both those who are doing good and those in authority.
- Praying for those in authority helps cultivate a spirit of submission and love towards them.
- Prayer allows for a quiet and peaceful life, as it helps release worries and concerns to God.
- A prayerful life leads to holiness and reverence, as it draws individuals closer to God.

Importance of Reverence and Prayer for Salvation

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of shutting down all distractions and focusing on the presence of God in the church.
- Learning how to operate equipment is meaningless if one does not learn to reverence the sanctuary.
- Reverence is achieved through prayer and entering into the presence of God.
- Praying for all men, including those in authority, is a righteous act.
- God desires for all men to be saved and come to the full knowledge of truth.
- Prayer is the tool chosen by God to bring about His will for salvation.
- Without prayer from the church, God's plan for salvation will not come to pass on earth.

The Importance of Praying for All and Praying with Truth

- God's will is for every person to be saved and come to a full knowledge of Him.
- The church plays a vital role in making God's will for salvation possible through prayer.
- Prayer is the process by which God's will comes to pass on Earth.
- The problem is that people tend to pray only for specific individuals rather than praying for all as God desires.
- Prayer must be based on truth rather than emotions to be effective.
- Prayer based on the will of God, as found in the Bible, becomes powerful and effective.
- Many people prefer lies with slippery slopes over truth with rough edges, leading them to be offended by truth from ministers who boldly speak it.
- A ministry with rough edges often signifies the presence of truth, as they prioritize delivering God's message over seeking approval or popularity.

The Power and Purpose of Sunship Prayer

- The truth about tithing and prayer: The speaker mentions that they can't pray with someone who is not a tither and is mocking prayer. They explain that if someone is living in fornication and asks for prayer, they cannot pray because they would be joining in their sin.
- Specific people not meant to be prayed for: The Bible states that there are some people one should not pray for because they are joining in their sin and cannot pray blessings on them when God has cursed them.
- Requirement of truth: The speaker emphasizes the importance of learning the truth and mentions that they will only pray for someone if they receive the truth. They believe that people tend to come for prayer after their world falls apart but do not want to hear the truth.
- God's desire to save all men: The speaker states that God desires to save all men and emphasizes the need for individuals to have the same desire. They explain that if one does not have the same desire as God, they cannot work with Him.
- Sunship prayer: The speaker distinguishes between children's prayers and sunship prayers. They explain that sunship prayer aligns oneself with God's will and allows them to creatively speak the truth with God. This type of prayer focuses on all men and all of creation.
- Enlarging one's vision: The speaker encourages the audience to enlarge their vision from their own family to God's family. They believe that praying for all men and all of creation is what God wants individuals to do, rather than focusing solely on their own children or grandchildren.
- Moving from a human mind to the mind of God: The speaker emphasizes the need to change one's mindset from a human perspective to align with the mind of God. They suggest that God has a big vision and individuals should pray for all men, believing in God's ability to fulfill it.

The Importance of Praying for All Men

- Many people pray for their own needs instead of focusing on God's needs
- God desires for all men to be saved and we should have a burden for humanity
- The church has lost its burden for humanity, believing that people are too far gone
- God's arm is not short and His ear is not heavy, he can reach everyone through prayer
- We must pray for all men, including the homeless and the lost
- The purpose of prayer is not to ask God to do something, but to become a conduit for His work
- Prayer should be based on truth, and we have the truth in God's word to confidently pray for all men

The Power and Purpose of Prayer

- When praying, it is essential to pray for all humanity, regardless of their religious beliefs
- Praying for all men is a powerful act, as it includes praying for loved ones, family members, and even enemies
- One must have faith and believe in the power of prayer when approaching God

- A narrow mindset limits the effectiveness of prayers, understanding the need for universality in prayer
- Prayer is not limited to personal needs but also includes being a representative of Heaven on Earth
- The enablement of the Holy Spirit helps us to identify with the heartbreak and sorrow of others and bring their needs before God
- Knowledge about prayer is not necessary, as the most important aspect is the act of praying itself
- It is essential to care for and feel compassion towards humanity when praying
- Praying should not be limited to those who are easy to care for, but also for those who are neglected or forgotten
- Seeing someone in need, such as someone addicted to drugs or in prison, should move us to pray for them rather than judge them

The Power of Prayer and Compassion

- Praying with faith and belief in God's ability to change lives
- Encouraging others to pray for people instead of simply saying "all I can do is pray"
- Having compassion for others in order to effectively pray for them
- Understanding that everyone has their own struggles and temptations

- Business partnerships fail when there are different visions, one big and one small.
- We should align our vision with God's vision to become effective in prayer.
- God has a vision for the world, and we should not limit Him with our small thinking.

Vision and Mindset in Ministry

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of having a clear vision in ministry.
- They express their determination to knock down any obstacles in order to fulfill their vision.
- People are encouraged to align themselves with the speaker's mindset and increase their vision.
- The speaker shares a personal belief of starting a worldwide movement for the last day revival.
- The focus is on moving forward and not being deterred by the workload or other people's opinions.
- The speaker rejects the idea of catering to people's feelings or begging them to stay.
- The example of Coach Sabin is given to illustrate the importance of having a vision and raising others up to meet it.
- The ministry is described as not operating like a traditional church but as a ministry with a clear vision.
- Retirement is not a concept embraced in the ministry, with examples of Bishop Kendrick and Mama Kendrick still actively involved.

Prayer Warriors and the Purpose of Prayer

- Prayer for all men is commanded by Paul, regardless of who they are or what they've done.
- Brother Swagger's fall was met with criticism and condemnation, but the narrator's grandmother responded with immediate prayer, showing the true spirit of a prayer warrior.
- Rejoicing over someone's downfall is a sign of a problem, whereas prayer warriors should aim to prevent others from falling.

- The narrator's grandmother's reaction to Brother Swagger's fall resonated deeply, as she was heartbroken despite their doctrinal differences.
- Rejoice over people's rise and success, not their failures or losses.
- Our burden in prayer should extend beyond our own lives and encompass the well-being of the whole world.
- God already knows everything, so prayer is not about informing Him of our situation, but rather about aligning ourselves with His solution.
- Prayer should not be focused on suggesting how God should work things out, but on believing that He already has a solution for us.

The Power of Prayer and Trusting God's Plan

- Prayer is a powerful tool, especially in times of trial and uncertainty.
- The speaker emphasizes the importance of trusting that God already has a plan for one's life.
- The speaker recounts personal experiences of praying for specific outcomes, such as getting out of prison, but realizing later that God had a greater plan in store.
- The speaker highlights the role of others praying for one's well-being and asks the audience to pray for others, even if their prayers may not align with God's plan.
- The key message is that when praying, one should focus on expressing faith in God's love and trusting his plan, rather than simply asking for specific outcomes.

Prayer and the Power of Words

- Prayer is not about making God aware of our problems, but about trusting in His love and finding solutions.
- Yahweh loves us and has provided a way for us to escape our difficult situations.

The Importance of Respect and Honor in Ministry

- Lack of belief and disrespect towards Jesus prevented him from performing miracles in his hometown
- Similar lack of respect towards pastors can diminish the effectiveness of their ministry

- Satan tries to diminish respect for pastors to reduce their influence in individuals' lives
- People may try to run others down by spreading rumors or laughing about them, but it can have a negative impact
- Honor is the currency of the Kingdom and is important for effective ministry
- Prayer is not just about speaking, but also about listening and sharing what one has heard in prayer meetings for effective change.

God's Promise of a Million Dollars to Build the Church

- The speaker recounts a personal experience where they were riding down the road and heard the voice of the Lord speaking to them.
- The Lord told them that someone is going to send them a million dollars to build their church.
- The speaker emphasized the repetition of the Lord's message, confirming its certainty.
- Despite not praying for money, the speaker acknowledges and accepts the promise of a million dollars from God.
- The speaker emphasizes the power of speaking what God says and how it activates the will of Heaven on Earth.
- The speaker acknowledges the potential skepticism due to the abuse of similar teachings but distinguishes their experience as genuine.
- The speaker shares their plans for the church, which include prayer chapel and boardwalk, despite not having the funds yet.
- The speaker refers to Mother Kendrick and Lady Karen as examples of God's provision and care in their lives.

The Power of Prayer and the Role of Laborers in the Harvest

- Prayer is not just begging, but decreeing a thing and seeing it established in the Earth.
- It is important to keep the message of prayer separate from the messiness of the world.
- The truth of prayer can be used for selfish desires by others.
- When speaking, it is important to only say what God has said.
- Speaking the word of God activates its power in the Earth realm.
- Hearing from God and speaking His words happens in prayer.
- When praying, God will talk back to you as you talk to Him.
- Speaking God's will in prayer enables His will to be done on Earth.
- In Matthew 9:37, Jesus tells his disciples that the Harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few.
- Prayer is considered labor in the Kingdom of God.
- Even though the Harvest is ready, it will not be picked unless prayer is offered.

• The act of prayer is necessary to bring about the fulfillment of the Harvest.

The Power of Prayer and its Elements

- Prayer is necessary despite God's omnipotence
- Prayer allows humans to partner with God in governing the Earth
- A landlord analogy is used to explain the relationship between God and prayer
- Prayer is the power itself, regardless of the person praying
- Prayer includes four elements: adoration, confession, thanksgiving, and petition
- In upcoming weeks, there will be a focus on the mechanics of prayer and these four elements
- The act of praying is a participation in the process of recreating the world
- Praying allows humans to be effective partners with God in the Divine program of the Harvest
- Luke 11 verse 1 is referenced for further teaching on prayer.

The Disciples' Request for Prayer Instruction

- In this verse, the disciples approach Jesus and ask him to teach them how to pray.
- The disciples had previously been taught by John the Baptist, but they recognized that Jesus prayed in a different way.
- Being Jewish, the disciples already prayed four times a day, but they desired to go deeper and improve their prayer life.
- Jesus' prayer was distinct because he addressed God as "Our Father" and emphasized a personal relationship with God.
- The disciples realized that Jesus knew the Father intimately, which made his prayer different from theirs.
- Despite their regular prayers, the disciples confessed that they did not know how to pray after hearing Jesus pray.
- They observed that Jesus prayed differently and did not focus on requests or repetitive rituals.
- The disciples recognized that there was another level of prayer that they had not yet reached.
- This conversation took place later in Jesus' ministry, after three years, which raises the question of why the disciples waited so long to ask for instruction on prayer.

The Power of Prayer

- Prayer is essential in deepening one's relationship with God and unlocking spiritual growth.
- Some individuals have the ability to pray on a different spiritual level, inspiring others to seek a deeper understanding of prayer.
- The disciples, although already praying regularly, recognized the need to learn how to pray on a new level and asked Jesus to teach them.

- The first mention of Jesus praying in the Bible, in Luke 3:21 through 22, reveals the impact of prayer the heavens opened, and a heavenly voice spoke.
- When one prays, the heavens open, allowing a connection with God and the manifestation of His glory.
- Jesus continues to pray for all people and seeks prayer partners to join Him in interceding for others.
- Prayer is a powerful tool that unlocks doors and moves the mountains that are impossible for individuals to overcome on their own.
- It is important to understand God's love and care for the world in order to effectively participate in prayer.
- Through prayer, one can find strength and navigate through life's challenges.
