## Part 7

### The Significance of Knowing One's Identity

- Matthew 6:9 emphasizes the importance of praying in a specific manner, following a particular example.
- The phrase "Our Father who is in heaven" indicates that God, the Father, is in heaven.
- The term "Hallowed is your name" is a part of the prayer and emphasizes the reverence and sanctity of God's name.
- The story of Helen of Troy is mentioned, with the main focus on her losing her identity due to amnesia.
- Helen's identity is rediscovered when someone mentions her name, leading to a transformation and a return to her true self.
- This story serves as a parallel to the transformation experienced by the individuals at First Harvest Ministries, who have been awakened to their true identity as Israelites by the ministry.
- The ministry's purpose is to help individuals rediscover their true identity and find their way back "home."
- Last Friday Night's teaching touched on the impact of growing up without a father and the importance of knowing one's identity.

### The Importance of a Father Figure in Identity Formation

- Boys raised without a father figure may struggle with understanding their identity.
- Many Christians find their identity in Jesus or Yahweh, but not in their earthly father.
- It is important to have a relationship with one's father in order to fully understand and pray to God.
- Modern Christianity tends to focus on knowing the Holy Spirit and Yahshua, but neglects the relationship with the father.
- It is important for parents to be parental figures rather than just friends to their children.
- The concept of gender is defined by the word of God, with only two genders created in the beginning: Adam and Eve.
- People who don't have a father figure may seek validation and acceptance from other sources.
- Personal anecdote about the speaker's experience with a father figure and the importance of understanding one's gender identity.

## **Fatherhood and Sonship in Christianity**

- The voice of a father is emphasized in this ministry, and it is not comforting or concerned with how one feels.
- The fatherly voice speaks the word of God and calls for obedience and humility in prayer.
- Understanding the fatherhood of God is crucial to understanding one's sonship in Christianity.

- Mothers are responsible for developing boys, while fathers raise sons in the Hebrew culture.
- As one matures in their faith, they must transition from being coddled by the church to being guided by the word of God.
- It is important to understand one's position as a son of God and the duties associated with it.
- Without a proper understanding of the fatherhood of God and the duties of a son, Christianity can become haphazard.
- Growing in sonship requires letting go of the "Buddy" mentality of God and submitting to His discipline and correction.

### The Importance of God's Correction and Finding a True Church

- The correcting Rod of almighty God and the song "Beautifully Broken" are discussed.
- The second verse of the song includes the narrator's mugshot to depict being "Beautifully Broken" by God.
- When God wants to bring someone closer to Him, He will separate them from their mother and friends.
- Churches that preach a comfortable, non-confrontational message are referred to as "buddy churches."
- Buddy churches focus on God's love and understanding, regardless of one's actions or lifestyle.
- The narrator experienced tough love from their grandfather, who always pushed them to do better.
- The idea of continuously striving and overcoming is emphasized in one's walk with God.
- The issue of same-sex parents raising children is mentioned.
- The narrator suggests that being taken out of the comfortable "Mama church" and into a true church, where one is held accountable, is the best thing one can experience in their spiritual life.

### Understanding the Role of Relationship in Faith Development

- The initial stage of faith development is characterized by a child-like perspective, where individuals have no responsibilities except to be saved.
- The church plays a maternal role in raising believers during this stage, ensuring their salvation and spiritual growth.
- The concept of approaching God as a father is emphasized, as it allows believers to understand their sonship and move towards maturity in their faith.
- The role of a father figure is distinct from that of a friend, as fathers speak with authority and may sometimes confront uncomfortable truths.
- Having a father figure angers the world, as it challenges societal norms and expectations.
- The current societal emphasis on female empowerment has led to a shift towards feminine values, thus marginalizing traditional masculinity.

- The speaker draws a comparison between Donald Trump's authoritative voice and the anger it provokes in the world.
- Understanding the importance of having a father figure and embracing patriarchal values is encouraged.

### Understanding the Importance of Sunship and Distinguishing Identity

- People can undergo a "sex change" without undergoing physical changes, instead transforming their mindset to identify as a different gender.
- The speaker mentions that many male pastors act like women and are submissive to tithe payers.
- The speaker discusses their own preaching, stating that they have no friends and only view the congregation as their "sons."
- Sunship is emphasized as important, as it helps distinguish oneself from the rest of creation.
- The order of creation is listed as angels, animals, and humans, with humans being closely connected to animals.
- Animals are described as having the lowest nature of creation, waking up to "get" rather than give.
- Identifying as just a man can limit obedience to authority figures.
- The speaker suggests a different belief in transgenderism, emphasizing the importance of voices like theirs.

### The Importance of Prayer for Sons of God

- According to the context, the word of God says that humans are placed above the angels and are referred to as the sons of God.
- Identifying as a human allows one to engage in various vices like alcoholism, drug addiction, and sex addiction.
- However, there comes a moment when a voice calls individuals to recognize their true identity as sons of God and to put on the robe of righteousness.
- This recognition is essential as it signifies a greater identity than just being a human.
- Satan wants individuals to believe that they are mere animals, but humans are created to have dominion over their flesh and to rule over angels and creation.
- In order to know who their father is, individuals must understand what it means to be a son.
- Prayer is emphasized as a crucial aspect of sonship and an integral part of the sons of God's existence.
- Dominion only requires basic necessities like food, water, entertainment, and vices, but Jesus states that he has a different kind of food that humans do not understand.
- This implies that prayer is the sustenance for sons of God, while humans rely on material provisions and vices.

- Being a son of God means not acting common but recognizing one's royalty and identity as a daughter of Troy.
- Sons of God exist in a realm of prayer and faith, whereas humans solely focus on fulfilling their physical needs.
- While humans require money and budgets, the sons of God are provided for by the Raven and have a never-ending supply.
- The concept of budgeting is foreign to sons of God, as they trust in the provision that comes on time.
- Personal anecdote: The speaker claims to never have had a budget in their life and admits to not knowing their bank balance because they rely on the continuous provision without needing financial planning.

#### **Building a Prayer Chapel with Faith**

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of not focusing on the financial aspect and instead having faith that bills will be paid.
- Son of God should depend on faith rather than budgets.
- Sons of God should pray about everything.
- The speaker asserts that believers have been transfigured and now have the mind of Christ.
- Prayer is the key to moving from a human mindset to a Son of God mindset.
- The speaker mentions a conversation about the cost of building a prayer chapel, which is \$10,000.
- The speaker expresses confidence in building the prayer chapel despite not having the money for it.
- The speaker receives two unexpected checks totaling \$10,000 to fund the construction.
- The speaker attributes the provision of the money to prayer and faith in God's provision.
- The speaker mentions not manipulating or begging for money but trusting in God's guidance and provision.

#### The Power of Being a Son of God

- Being a Son of God means finding our position as brothers and sisters.
- Material possessions and wealth do not bring true happiness for Sons of God.
- Sons of God find their joy and fulfillment in the Lord.
- Despite being broke or wealthy, Sons of God can still experience happiness.
- Sons of God exist on a different plane of understanding compared to humans.
- Dogs and cats communicate in ways that humans cannot comprehend.
- Humans have a tendency to speak negatively and put others down.
- The power of prayer allows Sons of God to confound and confuse others.

Humans have a natural inclination to run each other down and find faults.

### The Importance of Prayer and Being Praying People

- When we are praying people and love what God loves, our main focus should be loving people.
- It is important to love people regardless of their current situation or state of mind.
- As praying people, we are able to see and believe in the future of others.
- Rebellion is a human trait, but through prayer, we can overcome it.
- Trying to demand respect from others is a human tendency, but prayer helps us realize that we are not defined by others' opinions.
- Prayer allows us to connect with God and seek His guidance and protection for the things we love and are important to us.
- Prayer helps us to transcend our human nature and align ourselves with the mind of Heaven.
- Being praying people means recognizing that we are not human beings confined to our bodies, but sons of Yahweh, coming into a higher level of sonship.
- Prayer is crucial in our journey towards spiritual growth and becoming true sons of God.
- The "Our Father" prayer is not just a prayer to recite, but a lesson in becoming true sons of God through prayer.

### The Importance of Differentiating between Children and Sons in Christianity

- It is emphasized that not all of Yahweh's children are equal.
- The speaker's grandmother had 10 children with differing paths in life, including drug addicts, alcoholics, businessmen, and business women.
- Despite their differences, the grandmother loved all her children equally.
- However, on her deathbed, she only chose one child to take her church.
- The Christian church is criticized for not understanding that Yahweh is not looking for children, but for Sons.
- The speaker uses Abraham and his two sons, Ishmael and Isaac, as an example.
- Ishmael represents the son of the flesh, while Isaac represents the son of promise.
- Abraham loved Ishmael, but eventually had to take him out to the Wilderness and leave him with his mama for the sake of Isaac, the son of promise.
- The speaker warns against falling in love with one's flesh self and not being willing to let it die for the sake of the son of promise.
- Abraham loved Ishmael more because he was the black sheep and felt sorry for him.
- The speaker emphasizes the need to love one's destiny of promise more than any addiction or negative aspect of oneself.

- The speaker shares personal experience of having an "Ishmael" in their life, a rebellious side that was catered to, but Yahweh encouraged them to let it go and embrace the "Isaac" within, their destiny of promise.
- Praying is seen as a way to learn about this transformation into a promised son.

### Sons of God vs Creation of God

- Prayer is crucial in distinguishing between the sons of God and the creation of God.
- Ishmael represents the flesh, while Isaac represents the chosen son of promise.
- God chooses sons of promise, not based on flesh.
- Yahweh is the father of all men, but only those who have a personal relationship with Him are considered sons.
- Every man in the world is loved by God and has a plan for redemption.
- Ishmael was not God's firstborn son, even though he was technically the firstborn. The first shall be the last.
- Understanding Yahweh's plan requires moving into an understanding of what Abraham did with Ishmael and Isaac.
- Just like Pinocchio in Geppetto's shop, the sons of God have a relationship with their Creator through prayer.
- The difference between the sons of God and the creation of God is their prayer life.
- Daily prayer is a sign of being a son of God, while the absence of prayer indicates being an old dead creation.

### The Difference between Created Children and Spirit Begotten Children

- Created Sons do not receive the spirit of adoption, while Spirit Begotten Sons do.
- Pinocchio is given the spirit of adoption, differentiating him from other toys.
- Spirit Begotten Sons can cry out to their father in prayer, indicating their relationship with God.
- By receiving the spirit of adoption, Spirit Begotten Sons are not limited to being mere humans, but can claim the 30-fold, 60-fold, and Spirit of Adoption.
- The measure of sonship achieved by Jesus is available to anyone who is willing to take up their cross and follow him.
- Jesus' baptism symbolizes the descent of the Holy Spirit, which is the same Spirit that rests upon believers.
- Believers have the potential to become the full measure that God desires them to be with the help of the Holy Spirit.

#### The Purpose and Power of Prayer

- The difference between being dead in sin and being alive in Christ is awareness. While a dead man still exists, he is not aware, whereas Christ was aware of his relationship with God.
- Before coming to life in Christ, individuals are dead and unaware of a different life beyond human existence.
- The Holy Spirit plants a seed of awareness and a down payment of inheritance in the mind, awakening individuals to a new dimension of sonship with God.
- This seed of awareness continues to grow through a life of prayer.
- Many people remember the day they received the Holy Spirit, but the true importance lies in becoming what God has planned for them through prayer.
- The purpose of prayer is to shift focus away from the past and onto the present and future development in one's spiritual journey.

#### **Transformation and Faith**

- The speaker discusses the transformative power of the Holy Ghost and how it can change a person's life.
- The speaker emphasizes their personal experience of being changed and no longer being a "dead man walking."
- The speaker expresses their lack of interest in what others say about them and their indifference towards negative opinions.
- The speaker attributes their change to becoming a "Son of God" and highlights the difference between humans and sons of God.
- The speaker mentions their devotion to a life of prayer and suggests that it sets them apart from others.
- The speaker criticizes the world's priorities and suggests that they cannot understand the mindset of believers.

- Christ was once lower than the Angels but now has all power in heaven and earth.
- We have been resurrected together with Christ into Heavenly places.
- The Holy Ghost is as powerful as our last prayer meeting.
- Prayer is essential to protect our position as children of God.

- The Remnant Ranch experience shows the difference in the soil and the power of the seed.
- There are threats and challenges faced by the writer, as indicated by hate mail received.

#### Importance of Words, Letters, and Numbers

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of words, letters, and numbers in developing knowledge and abilities.
- He compares brain surgeons to regular individuals and states that the only difference between them lies in the words, letters, and numbers they have chosen to read and learn.
- Brain surgeons and other successful individuals have ingested a set of words that regular individuals have not chosen to read.
- The speaker highlights the impact of words, letters, and numbers on one's ability to respond and achieve higher levels of success.
