Part 5

The Importance of Prayer and Seeking the Kingdom of Yahweh

- The significance of prayer in the church has been emphasized, as it is considered the missing element in worship.
- The purpose of previous teachings on prayer was to address questions such as why we need to pray if God already knows everything and has plans for our lives.
- The model prayer taught by Yua is being studied, with the focus on the first two words, "Our Father."
- The scripture passage in Matthew 6:31-33 emphasizes that worrying about material needs is characteristic of Gentiles, while Israelites are called to seek the kingdom of Yahweh and His righteousness.
- Seeking the kingdom of Yahweh and living according to His ways should take priority, as other necessary things will be provided.
- The importance of not being anxious about tomorrow is highlighted, as Yahweh will take care of our needs.

Laws of God and Putting the Kingdom First

- The speaker discusses the concept of not worrying about tomorrow and focusing on the present moment.
- They argue that there is a difference between a promise and a law, where a promise can be broken but a law cannot.
- Using the example of a drum sitting on the ground, the speaker explains that for the drum to jump off the platform, it needs thrust, which abides by the law of physics.
- They state that a law of Nature and a law of the spirit can never be broken.
- The speaker emphasizes the importance of recognizing and understanding laws, using the example of patterns and rhythms that eventually become laws.
- They assert that a law of the kingdom of Yahweh is established forever, and the law that never fails is seeking first the kingdom of God.
- Putting the kingdom of God first ensures that everything one is worried about will take care of itself.
- The speaker encourages trust in this law and the assurance that putting God's kingdom first will lead to the resolution of worries and concerns.

Importance of Trusting in the Kingdom of God and the Purpose of Prayer

- It is emphasized that trusting in the law of the Kingdom of God is essential, as it never fails.
- Pastor encourages putting the Kingdom of God first, which is demonstrated by bringing tithe and offering before anything else.
- Learning and practicing the right ways of Yahweh are emphasized, with people traveling to learn obedience and participate in the Feast of Yahweh and Shabbat.

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- Assurance is given that anyone, regardless of their financial situation, can trust in the law and promises of God and will be taken care of.
- The purpose of prayer is to ask the Father and believe that He delights in providing everything needed.
- Resting in work is possible when Yahweh is acknowledged as the ultimate source, rather than relying solely on one's job or work.
- A distinction is made between those who know and have a relationship with the Father and those who do not.
- Those who do not know the Father are described as seeking after things and being caught in the "Rat Race" mentality.
- Coming to God confidently as a child and seeking Him as a loving Father is emphasized.

Putting Yah (God) First and Trusting in Him

- When you trust in Yah (God), you can come boldly before your father and Heaven and ask for what you want.
- Trusting in Yah makes other things in life become secondary, as they are just added to you.
- The whole world is driven by greed, with Israelites emphasizing giving and gentiles emphasizing getting.
- You can identify someone's mindset by whether they are a giver or a taker.
- Greed motivates people to win at any cost, pushing and shoving others to get ahead and seeking personal gain.
- The spirit of the world is based on seeking things at any cost.
- The speaker mentions their wife's name brands and clarifies that they never paid for them, as the brands find them.
- They do not prioritize buying name brands and often shop on platforms like Poshmark or Goodwill.
- Despite not focusing on material wealth, the speaker dresses well and mentions buying a suit for \$2 on Poshmark.
- The principle is to seek first the kingdom (Yah) and let everything else be added to you.
- By prioritizing Yah, one's life is not consumed by things, and they are provided for without actively seeking or knowing how they obtained it.
- The speaker encourages putting Yah first in all things and assures that everything will be added to you.
- Putting Yah first leads to blessings such as a roof over one's head and meals to eat, without even knowing how they were obtained.

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Seeking the Kingdom of Yahweh First

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of putting Yahweh first in order to find true happiness and fulfillment.
- Seeking the kingdom of God is described as a denial of oneself.
- Being in business with God means that one does not have to push, manipulate, or take advantage of others.
- Those who are not part of the kingdom are described as busy seeking after worldly things.
- True happiness is found in Yahweh and not in this world.
- Finding true happiness means having everything and not having to worry about anything else.
- The speaker references John 14:13 to teach about the importance of prayer and the pathway of sonship in developing a relationship with Yahweh.

Relationship with Yahweh and Headship Union

- The entire service has been fought by the enemy, with efforts to distract the mind and discourage.
- The pathway to a relationship with Yahweh involves levels of repentance, baptism in his name, prayer life, and obedience.
- Headship Union, also known as the ultimate piece of furniture in the Ark of the Covenant, is a step that has not been taught before but is crucial.
- The message being shared is changing the world and should not be interfered with.
- The next step after obedience to Yahweh is headship union with Yahweh's will.
- Prayer life needs to align with Yahweh's progressive will in every aspect of life.
- A scripture from John 14:13 is referenced, where asking in Jesus' name promises results.
- However, the problem arises when prayers made in Jesus' name do not come to fruition.
- Examples are given of prayers for a new home, healing, and casting out demons that did not see the desired outcomes.

The Importance of an Anointed Teacher in Understanding Scripture

- The speaker shares their personal experience of praying fervently using various names of God but not seeing the desired outcome.
- The lack of an anointed teacher is identified as the underlying problem for not understanding and correctly interpreting the scripture.
- Satan takes advantage of the confusion caused by the misunderstood scripture and uses it to plant doubts in the individual's mind.
- The speaker acknowledges that the scripture promises that anything asked in Jesus' name will be done but acknowledges that it has not always worked for them personally.

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- An anointed teacher is presented as a solution to keep the devil's influence out of one's mind and to guide in understanding and correctly applying scripture.
- It is emphasized that not all ministries are anointed to understand scripture, and listening to inexperienced or unanointed teachers can perpetuate false teachings.
- The speaker warns about being defeated in one's walk with Yahweh due to a lack of understanding the word.
- The speaker addresses the need for a proper response when others point to the scripture and expect it to "work" in their lives.
- The speaker shares a personal example of someone asking for a Cadillac like the pastor but highlights that their own Cadillac was given to them rather than asked for.
- The concept of favor not always being fair is mentioned, hinting that the speaker has received undeserved blessings.
- The speaker compares understanding scripture to opening a jewelry box - initially, it may not seem special, but once unlocked, it reveals its true beauty and worth.
- The speaker mentions a recent experience where studying and discussing the scripture with Yahweh led to a newfound understanding and appreciation of its meaning.
- The speaker reaffirms their authenticity and realness in relation to their faith.

The Importance of Praying in the Name of Jesus

- Praying in the name of Jesus carries significant importance and is emphasized in Scripture.
- Certain people are said to be able to receive anything they ask for from God, as long as they ask in a certain way, specifically in the name of Jesus.
- The effectiveness of prayers depends on understanding and following God's commandments, as stated in verse 15.
- Praying in the name of Jesus means invoking the name that Yah (God) gave to his son, which is Yahshua, not Jesus.
- The name Yahshua means "Yah is my salvation" and represents all that we know about a person.

The Importance and Meaning of Names

- A person's name is said to encapsulate their entire character and is considered an important aspect of their identity.
- The Bible emphasizes the significance of a good name, stating that it is worth more than rubies.
- Certain names, like Adolf Hitler, evoke negative thoughts and emotions due to the association with the character of the person.
- In a specific town, the name "Kendrick Frank Kendrick" is associated with characteristics such as faithfulness, loyalty, and trustworthiness.

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- When Moses wanted to draw closer to Yahweh, he asked to see God's face, not realizing that knowing God's name is equivalent to knowing His character.
- Yahweh tells Moses that no man can see His face and live because knowing Him will require a transformation and a letting go of one's own identity.
- Yahweh promises to teach Moses His name, which is considered to be His face, or the essence of His character.
- The message emphasizes that encountering Yahweh and knowing His name will bring transformation and the shedding of one's old self.

The Importance of Knowing God's Name

- Moses wanted to know God's name, but initially he was not ready to fully comprehend its significance.
- Yahweh revealed himself to Moses partially, instructing him to tell Pharaoh that "I am" sent him.
- Moses desired to know God more deeply, beyond the name taught by the church.
- Yahweh incrementally revealed his name to Moses, with each revelation signifying a deeper understanding of his character.
- The church often sings about loving God's name but may resist actually learning and using it.
- Yahweh promised Moses that he would make his righteousness pass in front of him by proclaiming his name Yahweh.

Understanding the Importance of Knowing the Name of God

- When Yahweh wanted to reveal his face to Moses, he did it through his name.
- Knowing the name of God goes beyond the pronunciation or spelling. It is about understanding the character contained in the name.
- Some people may know the letters of the name but lack an understanding of its life and character.
- Praying in the name of Jesus without truly understanding the character of God may result in unanswered prayers.
- Praying for vengeance or harm to others in the name of Jesus goes against the longsuffering and forgiving character of God.
- The name of God is not a magical incantation but should be used with the understanding of its meaning and character.
- Yahweh revealed his name to Moses while delivering the Commandments, emphasizing the importance of understanding the character contained in the Commandments.
- The focus should be on understanding the depth, breadth, and width of the name of God rather than arguing over pronunciation or spelling.

The Significance of the Name Yahweh and the Commandments

- Yahweh's name holds deep meaning and should be internalized rather than just spoken.

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- There is division among Messianics over the name, but true understanding comes through personal experience with Yahweh.
- Knowing Yahweh's name requires love and unity towards others.
- Praying in Yahweh's name means aligning with his character and showing mercy.
- Yahweh's progression in revealing himself to Moses is seen through the commandments.
- The commandments contain Yahweh's character and will, making them his name.

Understanding the Meaning of Yahweh

- The angel of Yahweh is teaching Moses about Yahweh and the importance of his name.
- The name Yahweh means Almighty, Merciful, and Compassionate.
- The church often hides the true meaning of Yahweh from people.
- It is important to have a spiritual awakening where Yahweh's name comes out of one's mouth and life.
- Prayers should be filled with Mercy to be considered in Yahweh's name.
- Many people think of Yahweh as a mean God, but he is actually merciful and compassionate.
- It is not just about learning how to pronounce Yahweh, but also living out its meaning.
- The first meaning of Yahweh's name is compassionate and merciful.
- Praying in Yahweh's name means praying with mercy and compassion.
- Praying for revenge or harm to others is not in Yahweh's name.
- When praying according to Yahweh's character, prayers will be answered.

The Importance of Praying in the Name of Yahweh

- Praying in the name of Yahweh brings teachings of mercy and compassion.
- Some churches wrongly emphasize attributes of mercy and compassion in Jesus but not in Yahweh.
- Going to the Old Testament is viewed as irrelevant or associated with a "bad" version of God.
- Some churches believe that God intentionally created laws that humans couldn't keep, leading to judgment.
- Yahweh means merciful and compassionate.
- Praying with mercy and compassion in Yahweh's name guarantees answers to prayers that align with His character.
- Hypocritical behavior can hinder healing and prayer effectiveness.
- It is important to make things right and repent before seeking healing in the name of Yahweh.
- The audience's lack of excitement about this revelation surprises the speaker.

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The Importance of Praying in the Name of Yahweh

- Yahweh commands not to simply quote His name, but to truly understand and embody its meaning.
- The name Yahweh means merciful, compassionate, patient, longsuffering, loving righteousness, and loving truth.
- When prayer is conducted in the character of Yahweh's name, He promises to answer every time.
- The pronunciation of the name Yahweh is not the key; the key is embodying its meaning through mercy, compassion, patience, and longsuffering.
- Simply knowing how to pronounce the name does not suffice; true understanding comes through personal transformation to match the character of Yahweh.
- Yeshua (Jesus) exemplified the character of the name Yahweh through his merciful, compassionate, patient, and longsuffering nature.
- Personal prayers made since understanding the meaning of Yahweh's name have been answered.

Understanding the Power and Meaning of Names in Prayer

- The power of prayer lies in the belief and understanding of the meaning behind the name being invoked.
- The name "Yahweh" alone does not guarantee answered prayers; one must deeply connect with and embody the essence of the name for it to be effective.
- The name "Jesus" represents the character and meaning of the Son of God, and invoking this name signifies belief in his sacrifice for sins.
- Moving beyond the pronunciation, it is the meaning behind a name that truly matters in prayer.
- Learning the meaning of a name deepens one's faith and strengthens their connection with the divine.
- Faithfulness to the house of God and to the work is more important than simply knowing how to pronounce a name.
- Understanding that the name "Yahweh" is hidden in the name "Jesus" allows for a greater understanding of the Father.
- Invoking the name "Yahweh" should be accompanied by a true understanding and embodiment of its meaning.

Importance of Names and Misunderstandings in the Church

- The name of the father is Yahweh, which represents mercy and compassion. Jesus came in his father's name and fulfilled the attributes of Yahweh.
- Despite performing miracles, Jesus never said "be healed in the name of Yahweh", as he knew he was the fulfillment of that name.

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- The constant repetition of saying "in Jesus name" or "in Yashua's name" without living up to the character of that name is a violation of the fourth commandment, which states that the name should be revered and not said foolishly.
- The emphasis should be on embodying the character of the name rather than constantly repeating it. Praying for personal glory instead of genuine healing is why no one is getting healed.
- Names hold significance, and when a person's name is taken away in prison, they become dehumanized.
- The problem in the church is a lack of understanding of the power and importance of names. Naming a child something contrary to their abilities is a misunderstanding.

The Importance of Embodying the Name of God

- When naming someone, it is important to understand that the name does not necessarily dictate their abilities or characteristics.
- Just as naming a child "Baker" does not automatically make them a skilled baker, calling on the name of Jesus or Yahweh requires a deeper understanding and connection.
- As believers, we are called to embody the nature and character of God, not just quote his name.
- Praying in the name of Jesus is not a magical incantation, but a recognition of our identity and authority in Christ.
- Paul's effectiveness in casting out demons came not from simply quoting Jesus' name, but from his embodiment of Jesus' nature.
- To have our prayers answered, we must align ourselves with God's nature, love what he loves, hate what he hates, and obey his commandments.
- Quoting the name of God without reflecting his character is ineffective and unrecognized by those we encounter.

The Power and Meaning of Names

- People's names often represent their character traits or qualities.
- Acting in accordance with the character of one's family or name is important.
- The use of a name in prayer should not be superficial or empty but should carry meaning and significance.
- The pronunciation of a name is not as important as understanding and appreciating its meaning.
- The power of a name lies not in the name itself, but in the love and feelings associated with it.
- The name of Jesus carries great significance and power because it represents his character and the love of the Son of God.
- Condemning others for using the name of Jesus, even if not pronounced correctly, is not justified.
- The same memories and feelings can be attached to different variations or pronunciations of a name.

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Teaching a More Perfect Way

- The speaker aims to teach a more perfect pronunciation and meaning of the name of the son of God.
- When praying, saying "in the name of Yeshua" carries significance and can be prayed in his place and position.
- Names carry meaning in the Christian world, and Jesus holds great meaning for them.
- It is not their responsibility to condemn Jesus, but to introduce a more perfect way.
- An example is given of a young preacher, Brother Shane Su, who was not preaching correctly, and Aquilla and Priscilla waited until later to teach him a more perfect way.
- First Harvest Ministries seeks to teach a more perfect and wonderful way, without condemning others.
- The story concludes with a young boy enlisting in the Army during the Civil War and his parents receiving letters from him every day.

A Heartbreaking Note and a Lesson in Kindness

- The parents receive a letter from the government informing them that their son has been killed in a battle.
- The home becomes dark and lifeless for the parents, who grieve their son's death.
- One morning, a maid informs the parents that there is a poor and ragged man at the door who wants to speak to them.
- The man hands them a crumpled note and explains that he is the dying soldier's most intimate friend.
- The father opens the note and recognizes the handwriting of his son. The note reveals that the friend will deliver it after the war.
- The note asks the parents to be kind to the friend for their son's sake.
- Initially hesitant, the parents welcome the friend into their home for Charlie's sake.
- The narrator highlights the importance of understanding that it was Charlie who asked for kindness to be shown to his friend, not the friend himself.
- This story teaches the lesson that we can ask God for something for someone's sake, just as Charlie did for his friend.
