

The Church as a Circus and the Importance of Teaching

- The word "church" comes from the Latin word "cir c i r CE," which is where the English word "circus" originates from.
- The modern church is compared to a circus, emphasizing the concept of a spectacle rather than a spiritual institution.
- Many people believe that the purpose of the church is to save souls and provide healing, but this mindset limits the growth of believers.
- The preacher often focuses on preaching to sinners, neglecting the spiritual growth of the entire church.
- Believers and worshippers go to church, not sinners.
- Simplifying the gospel to reach the lost leads to a church filled with ineffective and simple-minded Christians.
- The teaching is relevant because of the upcoming celebration of Shavuot, a celebration of the first harvest.
- Many attendees of the celebration may be unaware of the significance of what they are celebrating.

Understanding the Purpose of the Church

- The purpose of the cahal (church) is to teach the true meaning of Shaba WOTE.
- The wrong church can keep individuals from their true calling and position.
- The people in churches are not bad, but the teaching is wrong.
- Yahweh instructs his people to come out of the wrong church.
- The Zoom class can provide spiritual nourishment without the need for dressing up.
- Teaching produces right thinking, which leads to right understanding and right living.
- The previous perception of the church included ideas of it being a Soul Saving Station, a hospital for the hurting, and a place of no judgment.
- The church is not ruled by democracy, but by organization and hierarchy.
- The absence of Deb Tuttle in the Zoom class is mentioned.
- The mindset of going to church as a victim and in need should be overcome, and individuals should go as overcomers in training.

Understanding the Cahal and Ecclesia in the Church

- The church, or Cahal, is described as a living organism that must continuously grow and increase. If it does not, it is considered dead.
- The modern church is often portrayed as a circus where everyone is welcome, as long as they contribute financially. Entertainment and happiness are prioritized over order and judgment.

- The word "Cahal" refers to the legislative body of God's court on earth, indicating that the church is meant to be a government in training.
- The Cahal is a righteous and law-abiding body of leaders within the larger Ecclesia, which represents the entire church.
- The Cahal is referred to as the first harvest and the firstborn, demonstrating its leadership role within the Ecclesia.
- Yahweh, or Yua, did not seek to convert people directly, but rather taught through dark sayings and parables, seemingly hiding the gospel from the masses.
- When the church opens itself up as a ministry, it catches a variety of people and influences, both clean and unclean, similar to a fisherman's net.

The Purpose of the Church and Salvation

- The church is not born at Pentecost but has always existed since Abraham.
- The word "cahal" and "eklesia" refer to an assembling or gathering of citizens called out from their homes into a public place.
- It is important to regularly attend church and not become isolated in ministry.
- Yahweh will call all men to Salvation, but there is a time order for salvation.
- Satan is still the God of this age, so saving all men right now would be a waste as they would still be susceptible to deception.
- If all men were saved immediately, they would fall back into deception and become even more susceptible to Satan's influence.
- Yahweh does not convert the world right now because it would be futile and a waste of grace and mercy.
- The purpose of the assembly and the role of the pastor/shepherd is to bring individuals from a place of deception to a place where they can recognize and withstand deception.

The Role of Believers in Overcoming Satan's Deception

- Satan is no longer able to undo the work of Christ.
- There will be a thousand years of training before Satan is released to try the faith of believers.
- Believers will be taught just as they have been taught.
- The focus is on a predestined seed of Israel with a specific purpose and work.
- Believers are celebrating a select chosen group of people that Yahweh has sent his Spirit to, to overcome Satan.
- Believers are called to overcome deception and religious lies.
- Believers are compared to the Marines of the kingdom of God, going in first to pave the way for the rest.
- The purpose of the church is to train believers intensely, similar to boot camp, for the task of converting the entire world to Yeshua hamashiach.

- Believers may feel picked on or like they're being attacked when hearing from a true man of God, just like in boot camp.
- Believers are urged to not be easily offended and to overcome their weaknesses.

The Need for Personal Growth and Discouragement in the Church

- The text highlights the importance of personal growth and discouragement in the church.
- Encouragement should not be the sole focus; individuals should encourage themselves through the Word of God.
- It is suggested that the church has become an "encouragement station," and that the need for constant encouragement indicates weakness in the spirit.
- The author emphasizes the message of repentance for the coming Kingdom of God as the true source of motivation.
- The text calls for maturity and growth in order to be part of the first resurrection.
- The role of preachers is challenged, suggesting that they should discourage rather than constantly encourage, in order to prompt self-reflection and growth.
- The idea of being part of a company of Elijah is introduced, emphasizing that Elijah is a message and an anointing, rather than a specific individual.
- The author denies ever claiming to be Elijah but states that the message preached is the Elijah message, encouraging others to embrace this message and become "Elijah" themselves.

Examination of 2 Corinthians 4:4 and the Power of Satan

- The verse 2 Corinthians 4:4 talks about how the God of this world (interpreted as Satan) has blinded the minds of those who do not believe in the Glorious gospel of Christ.
- The author questions why God, who is in control of all things, would allow Satan to blind people's eyes if His intention is for the whole world to see the truth.
- By replacing "God of this world" with "Satan," the author concludes that Satan is more powerful than God, based on this verse.
- The verse implies that Satan has hindered the gospel from reaching those who need it, suggesting that Yahweh does not want the gospel of the Kingdom to be accessible to the world yet.
- The author suggests that Yahweh created Satan to blind the eyes of the world until a group of people (referred to as "Marines") is prepared to overthrow Satan.
- It is implied that God's primary goal is not to save the entire world, based on the author's interpretation of the verse.

Predestination and the Kingdom Message

- The church emphasizes the importance of filling the pews with specific individuals, such as snails, quails, and crocodile tails, to align with the Kingdom message.
- Keeping a clean church is essential, and the pews are wiped off every six months.
- God allowed Satan to blind certain individuals' eyes to prevent them from seeing the Kingdom message, as he is selective about who enters the net.
- Only the elect and predestined seed, Israel, are allowed in the net of believers.
- The celebration of Shavuot is tied to the predestined first harvest of believers.
- The Baptist Church's belief in predestination differs from the concept presented. Predestination is not about people's eternal destination but about being part of the predestined seed to rule and reign over the world.
- The message attracts smart individuals, but once they encounter the message's focus on obedience and submission, it may become bitter to them, causing them to fall out of the net.
- Only the predestined seed will be allowed to be part of the company of believers, and church buildings will not be filled with them.
- Revelations 12:9 explains why the church cannot comprehend the concept of the cahal, as the devil and his angels deceive the whole world.

The Purpose of Messiah's First Coming and The Role of Adam

- Messiah's first coming was not to establish his kingdom, but to qualify for it. This understanding changes one's perspective on life.
- He had to be the second Adam, meaning he had to avoid making the same mistakes as the first Adam.
- If the first Adam had not fallen, there would have been no need for a Messiah.
- The first Adam was meant to govern the Earth through prayer on behalf of Yahweh.
- The first Adam would have been a representation of the Father, just as the second Adam claimed to be.
- The first Adam had the same capabilities as the second Adam.

Qualifying for the Throne and Overcoming Temptation

- Adam only had to reject temptation in order to qualify for the first Adam's Throne.
- The reason individuals are called into the cahal is for ministry and to be trained to reject temptation.
- The primary temptation that everyone faces is the temptation to be disobedient and rebellious.
- The ministry at First Harvest Ministries aims to break individuals out of this temptation and bring about submission to God's will.

- The ministry will cause individuals to lose their old ways and develop a new identity.
- Example of April Rickman's transformation after initially resisting the ministry.
- Overcoming temptation is necessary in order to subdue the Earth and remove the influence of the god of the earth, Hashan, and his rebellious human family.

The Purpose of the Church in Announcing the Coming Government

- The purpose of conquering a group of people under Satan's control is to transform them into followers who can multiply and create a government that will rule when the individual becomes king of the earth.
- The purpose of the cahal is not only to qualify individuals but also to announce the future establishment of the kingdom of Yahweh.
- Repentance for the kingdom of God is a message preached by Jesus, indicating that the kingdom is approaching and not yet present.
- The word "at hand" in Matthew 3:2 means to come to approach, suggesting that the kingdom is not already here.
- First Harvest Ministries preaches the message of repentance and obedience to the Commandments in preparation for the coming kingdom.
- Jesus' purpose in announcing the coming kingdom was to qualify for the throne and to prepare the world for the government that is coming.
- The church has the responsibility of building and preparing the government that will rule in the coming kingdom.

The Purpose of Church and the Tree of Knowledge

- The purpose of the church is to prepare and establish the government of God on Earth.
- The church's sole purpose is to bring perfection to the government before the kingdom comes.
- Jesus accomplished this purpose by facing the same temptations and choices that the first Adam faced.
- The tree of knowledge represents choosing a way other than God's way, including believing in a better or easier way.
- When one determines what is good and evil based on their own thinking, they have eaten from the tree of knowledge.
- People have begun to determine what is good and evil based on their own preferences and opinions.
- The tree of knowledge grows in the mind, and individuals have a choice between the Tree of Life (total obedience and surrender) and the Smart tree (figuring things out on their own).

The Influence of Satan's Lies on Eve and Yeshua

- The snake manipulates Eve by making her question whether God is fair and withholding knowledge from her.
- Satan appeals to Eve's desire for independence and free will, encouraging her to make her own choices and not submit to any authority.
- The snake suggests to Eve that she can be equal to God and even become a god herself by disobeying God's command.
- Satan also tempted Yeshua by offering him power and authority over the nations of the world if he would worship him instead of God.
- Satan claims to be the ruler of the earth, stating that it was given to him by God, and he tries to deceive Yeshua into accepting his offer of power without having to go through suffering and sacrifice.
- The snake's lies and manipulation can infiltrate the minds of individuals on a daily basis, leading them astray from God's truth.
- The speaker claims to provide greater revelation than any church, suggesting that they have insight into the temptations faced by biblical figures such as Yeshua.
- Satan's ultimate goal is to deceive and lead individuals away from God's plan for their lives.

The Power of the Cross

- The speaker emphasizes the importance of facing temptation and not giving in to it.
- Satan will try to get individuals to rebel when they are tired or worn out.
- The idea is that temptation is faced daily, particularly in relationships (e.g., wives and husbands) and in the church.
- The message of Christianity is that Jesus Christ was a man who overcame temptation.
- The power of the cross lies in the fact that Jesus was a man and not a superbeing, demonstrating that humans can also overcome temptation.
- The speaker expresses the importance of resisting temptation and not letting it hinder personal growth.
- Christianity, if misunderstood, can offer a cop out rather than a way out of temptation.
- Christ's victory over temptation occurred at the Mount of Temptation, not Mount Calvary, where he was crucified.
- The ultimate reward, the crown, is won through overcoming temptation.

The Kingdom Message and Developing a King Mentality

- The Kingdom message could not be preached until the Mount of Temptation, as there was no King for the Kingdom prior to that moment.
- A Kingdom cannot be announced without a legitimate King.
- Earth was not designed for God Kings, but for Adam and his descendants.
- The living creatures on the land symbolize the kingship of Yahweh and mankind.
- Driving on the land should inspire a kingly mentality, identifying with the eagle, lion, and ox.
- Developing a king mentality means not showing hurt feelings and being unaffected by wrongdoing.

Duty of Kings and Commoners in God's Church

- Common People submit to their feelings, while Kings submit to their Duty in God's church.
- The Duty of Kings includes dancing, showing up, and being faithful.
- Commoners are takers who withhold their tithes from God and struggle to pay their bills.
- Kings have a duty to protect the Sabbath and tithe, as they belong to God.
- Responding to enemies and seeking personal vindication is acting common and accomplishes nothing.
- The duty of Kings is to become the kings of the coming Kingdom.

The importance of not responding or reacting

- The mantra of the speaker is to never respond, engage, or react.
- The speaker believes that displaying emotions is not acceptable for kings, who must perform their duty stoically.
- The audience is advised to hold their position and not react or respond to any negativity.
- Instead, they are encouraged to turn to prayer and leave their concerns to the Lord.
- The speaker emphasizes that those who are chosen to be part of this class are not meant to be common.
- Complaining or explaining oneself is discouraged, as it is believed that no matter what is said, it will not be good enough.
- The truth is seen as liberating, and the audience is urged to live a life guided by the truth.
- The question is raised about why the church in the speaker's town cannot see the teachings being presented.
- The answer is suggested to be found in John chapter 3, verses 1-2, which will be explored further.

- A short break is taken before delving into the answer, allowing the audience to take a break.
- The speaker expresses gratitude for being able to dance during a recent event, emphasizing the importance of not being afraid of what others think and yielding to worship.
- The speaker mentions their inclination towards loud shouting and the desire to praise and worship Yahweh through dance.

Tony's Dancing Miracle and Journey to Healing

- Tony had a strong desire to dance for Yahweh and prayed for months to be able to dance freely.
- Yahweh granted Tony's prayers and allowed her to dance, which she considered a miracle.
- Tony expressed gratitude for being able to walk again after experiencing difficulties due to her illness.
- Tony planned to attend the upcoming May 31st event, hoping to fully recover by then.
- Tony's recent eye operation was successful, and she no longer needs to wear glasses.
- The conversation between Tony and Sister Tony reflected their mutual love and appreciation.
- Tony's dancing was not limited to a single day but a continuous expression of joy.
- The mention of the ranch and the sighting of an eagle confirmed to Tony that she was in the right place.

The Misunderstanding of Nicodemus and Modern Churches

- Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews and part of the Sanhedrin, approached Jesus, acknowledging him as a teacher sent from God who performs miracles. However, the Jewish people only understood one coming of the Messiah, expecting Jesus to establish his kingdom immediately.
- The modern church, similar to Nicodemus, struggles to see the message that individuals have been able to see. They fail to grasp the concept of Jesus' presence and work beyond their traditional beliefs.
- This misunderstanding prevents acceptance of Jesus as the Messiah, as they expect him to fulfill their specific expectations rather than recognizing his true identity and purpose.

The Blind Spot in Understanding the Two Comings of Messiah

- The church the writer came out of believes that Jesus is the Christ and many believe he is God.
- They believe Jesus already came and shed his blood for sinners, providing a way of salvation.
- However, they can only comprehend the first coming of Jesus and have no comprehension of his next ministry.
- The religious leaders in Jesus's time also knew who he was but were confused about the two comings.
- The writer's previous pastor also believed in Jesus as the only way to be saved but could only comprehend the first coming.
- The church the writer came out of has no comprehension of the millennial reign.
- The blindness in understanding the two comings is compared to wearing sunglasses that hinder vision.
- The ministry of Jesus was just getting started after his sacrifice was finished.
- Starting with the booklet "What is the true gospel" is recommended when sharing this message.
- Nicodemus was looking for a warrior and modern Christianity is focused on the Rapture, hindering understanding of the second coming.
- Destroying the belief in the Rapture can help others see the message more clearly.

Rapture and the Second Coming

- The text mentions the Rapture as a belief that can contradict the teachings of going to heaven in the event of a Rapture.
- The suggestion is made to start a conversation to critique the idea of the Rapture, asking for evidence from the Bible.
- The lack of obedience is highlighted as a common theme behind the idea of loving without work in the church.
- The belief is clarified that some only believe in the Rapture and not the second coming of Christ.
- It is suggested that if one truly believed in the second coming, they couldn't believe in the Rapture.
- The mental block of equating the second coming with the Rapture is mentioned.
- The importance of understanding and questioning the concept of the Rapture is emphasized.

The Importance of Understanding the Rapture and Resurrection

- The Rapture is a fundamental belief in the Christian faith and is often seen as a building block of the Christian faith.

- Lack of understanding about the Rapture can be a mental block for some individuals.
- Nicodemus and Yu's conversation is used to help explain the mental block and the importance of understanding the two comings of Christ.
- Some people mistakenly believe that John the Baptist was the fulfillment of the prophecy of Elijah, leading to a misunderstanding about the future Ministry of Elijah.
- Malachi 4 emphasizes the timing of Elijah's ministry before the great and terrible day of the Lord, which corresponds to the millennial reign.
- Understanding the resurrection is essential to comprehending the second coming of Christ.
- The begotten sons of Yahweh will be born again and will rule the Earth during the second coming.
- The teaching of being "born again" is seen as a controversial and damaging teaching in the Christian church.
- The importance of understanding the concept of being born again is emphasized and recommended for further study.

The Kingdom and Divine Humans

- The kingdom or government will not be composed of mortal humans, but rather Divine humans who are born again of the spirit.
- These Divine humans will have Spirit bodies that look human.
- There are teachings and resources available on the concept of Spirit bodies, such as the video titled "Yahweh Invisible".
- Christianity struggles to comprehend this concept and may deny the message because they only understand the first coming of Messiah.
- Only Israelites, who are Overcomers with God, will rule in the Kingdom.
- Yahweh is reproducing Himself through His sons and daughters.
- The ideal scenario for a business owner is to have reproductions of themselves working for them.
- When Yahweh had a rebellion in heaven, His plan was to create reproductions of Himself and fill the galaxies with them.
- The same mind or spirit that was in Yahweh and Christ must also dwell in believers.

Yahweh's Plan for a Divine Government

- The Christian church believes that Yahweh, depicted as a figure sitting on a throne with a crown, will rule billions of people alone.

- However, the speaker argues that in order for Christ to effectively rule and change the world, he needs an organized body of divine beings called Elohim or the god family.
- These divine beings must reject Satan and prove their loyalty.
- The speaker emphasizes that when selecting elders, preaching or miraculous abilities are not the primary criteria. Loyalty and love for the message are the key qualities sought after.
- Loyalty is essential for effective governance, and disloyalty or bitterness are signs that someone cannot be trusted.
- Elders play a crucial role in caring for and supporting the church members, allowing the ministry to run smoothly without constant worries about loyalty or betrayal.
- Yahweh also requires an organized and matured body of divine beings, which cannot simply wake up in the resurrection fully developed.
- The purpose of the church is seen as being the keepers of the cahal (meaning congregation or assembly), contributing to Yahweh's plan for a divine government.

The Importance of the Five-Fold Ministry

- According to Ephesians 4:11, the five-fold ministry consists of Apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers.
- The purpose of the five-fold ministry is to perfect the Saints and organize the body of believers.
- Becoming a Divine being requires the presence of the five-fold ministry.
- Straying away from the five-fold ministry can lead to isolation and vulnerability.
- Once the five-fold ministry is done with someone, they are left without support or guidance.
- Rejecting the five-fold ministry means rejecting the organized body of believers.
- The gifts of the Holy Spirit and the five-fold ministry are interconnected.
- The five-fold ministry is meant to help believers overcome their humanity and practice living in harmony with one another.
- The organized body of believers, led by the five-fold ministry, will aid in offering salvation to the world.
- Training and organization are essential before establishing schools.

The Role of Saviors in Yahweh's Plan

- In Obadiah 1:21, it is stated that saviors shall come up on Mount Zion to judge the Mount of Esau and the kingdom will be Yahweh's.
- The Bible suggests that Yahweh is raising up multiple saviors, not just one, to save the world.

- These saviors are described as those who have died at Passover every year and have become the burden and bearers of the world.
- There is a discussion among individuals about the role of Yahweh and the authority of the Bible in determining the existence and nature of saviors.
- There is also a personal conversation between Pastor and Lucenda Lawrence, who shares her family's recent difficulties after her father's passing. The pastor offers prayers for her and her family, seeking peace and resolution in their situation.

The Purpose and Meaning of Shavuot

- The Tree of Life is only accessible to a specific group of people who have been invited back to it.
- According to John 6:44, "no man can come to [Yahweh] except the Father which hath sent me draw him."
- The first harvest, consisting of teachers drafted by Yahweh, has been invited to the Tree of Life.
- These teachers have been chosen by Yahweh and are not volunteers.
- The author, along with other teachers, came "Kicking and Screaming" to this calling.
- Shavuot, also known as the Feast of Weeks or Pentecost, is a celebration of the first group of humans who will be transformed into spiritual beings.
- It is a celebration of the Elohim, the Divine family, the royal family of Eternity.
- Shavuot signifies the presence of the law of Yahweh, The Ten Commandments, being written in the hearts of the chosen people.

The Purpose and Structure of the Church

- The church's purpose is to prepare minds for Kingdom Life.
- The church is not a secular organization or a social gathering, but a spiritual gathering.
- The church is intended to bring people into a new way of thinking focused on the kingdom.
- The church should have a kingdom mentality and prioritize the Kingdom of Yahweh.
- The church should strive for organization, structure, and order.
- The church is a training center for the kingdom, not just a place for spiritual experiences.
- The family's destruction leads to the destruction of organization and the church's effectiveness.

Importance of Titles and Hierarchy in the Church

- Elder Karen King emphasizes the importance of maintaining order and hierarchy in the church.
- Titles are used to denote honor and respect, and calling someone by their title is seen as a sign of honor.
- The use of titles like Elders, Pastors, and Ministers in the church is required in order to maintain structure and hierarchy.
- Satan opposes the use of titles and seeks to attack and shame those who hold titles.
- The Bible supports the use of titles such as Bishops and Elders in the church.
- Being against titles reflects a lack of honor and respect for authority.
- Disregarding hierarchy and titles can lead to a disorganized and chaotic church.
- Elder Karen King's father-in-law, Frank Kendrick, is referred to as Bishop, highlighting the significance of titles.
- People who oppose or criticize titles often have deep-seated issues and can be harmful.
- A certain individual has attacked Elder Karen King for using the title Elder, questioning her eligibility for the role and qualifications.
- Removing dishonor from one's heart is necessary in order to address the problems within the church.

Honor and Hierarchical Order in Society

- The House of Representatives and the Senate in America are lacking honor and resemble a chaotic jungle.
- The speaker expresses a preference for the respectful curtsies seen in Britain and emphasizes the importance of acknowledging higher stature.
- Divine order and honor should be observed in the military and also within the Church community.
- The speaker encourages showing honor to spouses, children, and parents, even if one does not necessarily like them.
- The absence of honor can lead to a spirit of Dishonor.
- The speaker warns against wrong thinking and emphasizes the need to change from a mindset of societal equality to recognizing hierarchical order.

Structure of the Church and Government

- The importance of honoring and respecting others in the church, referring to each other as brother and sister.
- The significance of Lady Bon and her preeminent position in the ministry, earned through her efforts.
- The desire for the church to return to honor and integrity.
- The idea of the church growing into a holy Temple and being united together.

- The type of government Israel had and its hierarchical and theocratic structure.
- Moses's role as the leader of the government established by Yahweh.
- Acknowledgment of Moses's mistakes and God's judgment.

Leadership in a Torah Observant Community

- In a Torah observant community, it is expected that there is a designated leader to guide the congregation.
- Torah observant believers should not promote the idea of everyone being equal in terms of leadership.
- Moses is cited as an example of a leader in the Torah observant community.
- The presence of democracy in a church is seen as a sign of a Babylonian influence.
- American ideals should not be brought into the cahal (Torah observant community).
- Democratic decision-making can lead to confusion and disunity.
- Leaders must be willing to make mistakes and take responsibility for them.
- Despite making mistakes, a leader still holds the authority in the community.

The Structure and Government of the Church

- The members of this church do not have the authority to choose their own officials or elders.
- Yahweh decides and appoints the elders for the church.
- Yahweh also determines the members of the church.
- The authority of the church, including its government, is designed to guide and mature its members.
- The government of the church is responsible for teaching Kingdom thinking, Sabbath observance, and the holy days.
- The church governs its members to encourage growth and maturity.
- The members are accountable and submissive to the church government.
- The Scripture, specifically 1 Thessalonians 5:12, supports the idea of submitting to and honoring church leaders.
- The role of church leaders is not about being superior but about the work they have done.
- Word study on "to know them" is suggested to gain a deeper understanding.

The Importance of Understanding and Cherishing Others

- The word "know" in the context refers to the Greek word "ido," which means to perceive, understand, and have regard for others.
- "Knowing" someone involves cherishing and paying attention to them.

- The word "over" in the scripture does not imply dominance or control, but rather to set before, be a superintendent, and be a protector and guardian.
- The issue with households and churches today stems from a lack of order and proper authority.
- It is important to have order and proper authority in order to rule in the Kingdom.
- The purpose of ministry is to admonish and guide according to the scriptures.
- The titles used in ministry serve to organize and serve the church.
- The story of Abraham's two sons illustrates different types of relationships and the importance of proper organization in serving the church.

Importance of Honoring the Church and Church Government

- The Bond woman and the free woman represent two covenants in an allegorical sense.
- The Bond woman represents bondage and is associated with Mount Sinai in Arabia.
- The free woman represents freedom and is associated with Jerusalem above.
- The problem in the church today is the rejection of the relationship with the Church as a mother figure.
- A personal relationship with God cannot be fully achieved without honoring and loving the Church.
- The Church is meant to protect, nourish, correct, and transform individuals.
- One-parent spiritual relationships have become a trend but are not desirable.
- Satan wants to cause individuals to despise and reject church government.
- Walking after the flesh and despising government are signs of not honoring the Church.
- The purpose of the Church is to cultivate Kingdom thinking.
- The Church teaches and prepares individuals for the Kingdom setting.
- The Kingdom setting is represented by animals and communal chores.
- Limited resources and help on the land shouldn't hinder progress but should promote collaboration in a Kingdom-like manner.
- The mentality of the world should be left behind in favor of embracing the Kingdom mindset.

Kingdom Work and Relationship Advice

- The goal is to become Kingdom workers and save the world in the Kingdom of Yahweh.
- The speaker is trying to show the audience what they will be doing in the Kingdom by recreating a barren piece of land.

- A daily routine is established on the land, starting with prayer from 8 am to 9 am, followed by chores from 9 am to 10:30 am, and concluding with a shared evening meal.
- The speaker emphasizes the need to break free from the independent streak imposed by the world and submit to Yahweh's plan.
- Hurt and hate must be let go of in order to fully embrace Yahweh's plan.
- A plea is made to young girls in the ministry to avoid media influences, such as the Kardashians, that may lead them astray from their intended path.
- The world is seen as trying to influence young girls to pursue independence and careers over being a wife to their husbands.
- Husbands are advised to be loving, kind, and supportive to their wives to prevent them from desiring other men.
- Ensuring financial security and a safe home for wives is seen as a way to inspire loyalty and submission in marriage.
