## Subject: Storage and Protection of Argeton Materials

Argeton materials consist of terracotta clay and aluminum. Both materials are suitable for prolonged exposure to weather. However, for storage purposes, precautions should be taken to preserve the protective crating, boxing, and labeling of the shipments.

- Tiles are palletized, shrink wrapped and side edge protected.
- Pallets should not be stacked and should be stored on a flat surface avoid leaning and the possibility of sliding of pallets or tiles.
- If being offloaded or crane lifted with straps, place separator pads on the top edge of the tiles to prevent the lips from being fractured.
- If stored for a long period of time, cover tile pallets to prevent mold growth of the cardboard edge protectors and deter atmospheric staining of the tile.
- Cover wood crated and boxed accessories from water damage to reduce deterioration.
- Ensure labels on crates, pallets and boxes are protected for identification as during prolonged site exposure may deteriorate.
