Methods of Instruction: Lecture, verse-by-verse study, homework, discussion, and opportunities for questions and student testimonies relating to salvation and gifts

Assignments: Students will need to review the extensive lecture handouts weekly and should have read, at least, one half of the book by week four when we begin to discuss the "Person and Work of the Holy Spirit." This is especially important due to the extensive material being covered. Without review, reading and at home meditation each week, it is unlikely students will be able to absorb the material. (With testimonies, this material, as given, is designed to be covered in a 90 minute period. If you only have a 60 minute time period, you will need to divide some of the lessons.)
