6	AN ACT
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8	Relating to the waters of the state impounded by Lewis
9	Smith Dam (Lewis Smith Lake) and to the waters of the state
10	impounded by R.L. Harris Dam (Lake Wedowee); to regulate and
11	prohibit wakeboarding and wakesurfing under certain
12	conditions; to provide penalties for violations; and in
13	connection therewith would have as its purpose or effect the
14	requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds
15	within the meaning of Section 111.05 of the Constitution of
16	Alabama of 2022.
17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA:
18	Section 1. (a) This section shall apply only to the
19	waters of the state impounded by Lewis Smith Dam (Lewis Smith
20	Lake) and to the waters of the state impounded by R.L. Harris
21	Dam (Lake Wedowee or the R.L. Harris Reservoir).
22	(b) For purposes of this section, the following words
23	have the following meanings:
24	(1) MOTORBOAT. A motorized recreational vessel.
25	(2) WAKEBOARDING. Either of the following:
26	a. To use a board with or without foot bindings on
27	which a rider is towed by a motorboat across a wake.
28	b. To operate a motorboat in a manner that creates a



- wake while towing a person using a board with or without foot bindings to be towed by the motorboat across the boat's wake.
- 31 (3) WAKESURFING. Either of the following:
- a. To surf a motorboat's wake, regardless of whether
 the person is being pulled by a tow rope attached to the
 motorboat that is producing the wake.
- 35 b. To operate a motorboat in a manner that creates a 36 wake that is, or is intended to be, surfed by another person.
- 37 (c) On the waters of this state impounded by Lewis
 38 Smith Dam (Lewis Smith Lake) or on the waters of the state
 39 impounded by R.L. Harris Dam (Lake Wedowee or the R.L. Harris
 40 Reservoir), a person may not engage in wakeboarding or
 41 wakesurfing under any of the following conditions:
- 42 (1) Between sunset and sunrise.

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- 43 (2) On any portion of the impounded waters where the width of the portion is less than 400 feet.
- 45 (3) Within 200 feet from any shoreline, dock, pier, 46 boathouse, or other structure located on the impounded waters.
- 47 (4) When not wearing a personal flotation device 48 approved by the United States Coast Guard.
- (d) (1) On a first violation of this section, a person shall be guilty of a violation punishable by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100).
 - (2) On a second or subsequent violation of this section during a single calendar year, the person shall be guilty of a violation and shall be fined not less than two hundred dollars (\$200). In addition, at the discretion of the court, the person shall be subject to the revocation or suspension of his



or her boater safety certification or vessel operator's

certification or vessel operating privileges upon the waters

of this state for the duration of the calendar year.

- (3) Any prosecution for a violation of this section shall be commenced by a citation issued by a law enforcement officer.
- (e) Nothing in this section shall apply to any regatta,
 race, trail run, parade, tournament, or exhibition on the
 waters of this state impounded by Lewis Smith Dam for which a
 written marine event application has been submitted to and
 approved by the Marine Police Division of the Alabama State
 Law Enforcement Agency.
- (f) The Alabama State Law Enforcement Agency and the
 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall take
 steps to notify the public of the requirements and
 prohibitions of this section.
 - (g) Notwithstanding the other provisions of this section, for one year following the effective date of this act, a person who violates this section on a first violation shall receive a written warning of the violation; and on a second or subsequent violation during the calendar year, the violation shall be treated as a first violation under subsection (d).

Section 2. Although this bill would have as its purpose or effect the requirement of a new or increased expenditure of local funds, the bill is excluded from further requirements and application under Section 111.05 of the Constitution of Alabama of 2022, because the bill defines a new crime or
