Steven Grammer, age 19, was a first-year Redding Smokejumper. The son of the Calaveras County undersheriff in Northern California, he started his fire service in 1968 with the California Department of Forestry before working for the Stanislaus National Forest. A Forestry student he attended Delta College and American River College. He was survived by his family.

Brief description

Steven, a Redding Smokejumper, was detailed to the Redding Hotshot crew. He along with two other members of the crew and two others died in a helicopter crash. The five-place Alouette helicopter was attempting to land and establish a second helispot for a 4,000 acre fire, when it tumbled 800 feet into the canyon below.


Also killed in the accident were Redding Hotshot crew members Ronald Scott and William Wales along with George Lopez, Helitack Foreman Angeles National Forest and the pilot Ed Henderson.
