Seven minutes, 24 seconds.

That's how long it took a gunman who opened fire at a Baptist church in rural Sutherland Springs, Texas, to kill 26 people. Many in the church on November 5, 2017 took cover under the pews. Tragically, that made them an easier target for the gunman. The gunman later died by suicide after an armed passerby confronted him.

During religious services on Sunday, Dec. 29, 2019, a man clad in black with a shotgun hidden under his coat opened fire on the parishioners of the West Freeway Church of Christ in White Settlement, Texas. Thanks to the training, vigilance and heroic bravery of the church's security team, the attacker was stopped in just six seconds.

From Sutherland Springs to Pittsburgh to Poway, it's becoming sadly common: worshippers gunned down during their religious services. Faith-based organizations are open and welcoming to any and all individuals, providing both comfort and a sense of community. Sadly, this can also leave the place of worship susceptible to be targeted in an act of violence.
