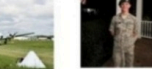
Currently, Kyle is diligently working on completing the remaining requirements for his license, which include:

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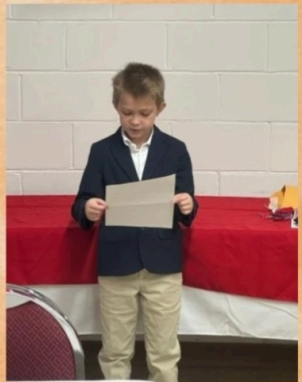

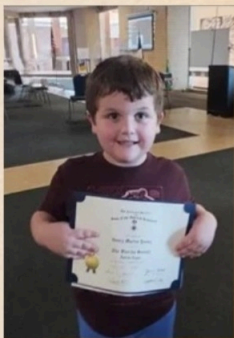

FRAGRANCE

THE ORANGE BLOSSOM IS ONE OF THE MOST FRAGRANT FLOWERS IN FLORIDA. DURING THE BLOOMING SEASON, MILLIONS OF WHITE FLOWERS FILL THE AIR WITH THEIR SWEET SCENT.

ECONOMIC VALUE

FLORIDA'S ECONOMY IS BASED ON CITRUS, ESPECIALLY ORANGES, AND THE ORANGE BLOSSOM SYMBOLIZES THE STATE'S CITRUS INDUSTRY.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

SPANISH EXPLORERS INTRODUCED ORANGE TREES TO FLORIDA IN THE 1500S, AND BY 1909, THE UNITED STATES HAD MORE ORANGE TREES THAN ANY OTHER COUNTRY IN THE WORLD.

THE ORANGE BLOSSOM IS ALSO ASSOCIATED WITH GOOD LUCK AND IS OFTEN USED IN BRIDAL BOUQUETS. IT'S THE ONLY STATE FLOWER THAT'S USED TO MAKE COMMERCIAL PERFUME.

HERE ARE SOME OTHER FACTS ABOUT THE ORANGE BLOSSOM:

THE ORANGE BLOSSOM'S PEAK BLOOM IS FROM APRIL TO JUNE.

THE ORANGE BLOSSOM IS ALSO A SYMBOL OF FERTILITY BECAUSE IT'S ONE OF THE FEW CITRUS TREES THAT PRODUCES FLOWERS AND FRUIT AT THE SAME TIME.

THE ORANGE BLOSSOM IS USED IN MANY WAYS, INCLUDING IN ORANGE TEA, ORANGE BLOSSOM WATER, AND TO SEASON GRILLED MEAT.

Veteran Corner

The attacks killed 2,977 people from 90 nations: 2,753 people were killed in New York; 184 people were killed at the Pentagon; and 40 people were killed on Flight 93.

Greetings, Everyone!

I'm Caleb Golden, your 2024-2025 Florida Society Children of the American Revolution State President. As winter descends upon us and the holiday season approaches, I find myself reflecting on the lives of children during the year 1776. While we embrace the joys of winter break, let's remember how children of the Revolutionary era spent their time.

The children of the Revolutionary era played many of the same games we enjoy today, such as tag, hide-and-seek, and hopscotch. With no factories for mass-produced toys and store-bought items being quite costly, most toys were crafted from materials found in nature or around the house. Dolls were made from cornhusks and rags, while small pieces of wood and leftover string were fashioned into spinning tops. Many games required no equipment at all, showcasing the creativity of colonial children. On chilly winter days, when staying warm was a priority, colonial children often played board games or engaged in tongue twisters and riddles if they weren't busy with chores. With many families having five or six children, playmates were always close by.

Adults, often too busy to supervise closely, allowed children the freedom to play in gardens, fields, and homes once their chores were complete. Many of the games played helped children develop essential skills for adulthood. They learned problem-solving, manual dexterity, how to follow directions and rules, the importance of fairness, and the value of patience. Life in colonial times was filled with hard work, but it was also lively and engaging. Early Americans knew how to infuse joy into their labor through singing, storytelling, contests, or communal activities like spinning or quilting bees.
