Job and Program Responsibilities

A day in the life of a Junior Energy Auditor involves supporting energy efficiency incentive programs in New Jersey by:

- Assisting with residential energy assessments and helping homeowners understand opportunities to improve comfort and energy efficiency in their homes
- Identifying common energy-related issues such as drafts, air leakage, insufficient insulation, and uneven temperatures
- Explaining findings to homeowners
- Collecting and documenting home information using mobile devices, software, photos, and field notes; supporting audit documentation, reports, scheduling, and follow-up

A successful Junior Energy Auditor also will be able to demonstrate:

- Excellent communication skills; after training, ability to explain technical information professionally and in basic terms
- Ability to learn technical concepts and apply information through training and field experience
- Strong observation, organizational, and documentation skills; problem-solving and critical thinking
- Teamwork and ability to work independently
- Computer, mobile device, and technology literacy
- Curiosity and willingness to continuously learn and grow
- Reliability, punctuality, and ability to follow direction
- Strong safety awareness and attention to detail

Qualifications:

- Ability and willingness to follow safety procedures while working in residential and field environments, including attics, crawlspaces, and confined spaces
- High school diploma or equivalent
- Valid driver's license and reliable transportation for traveling to job sites
