Examples:

- Music releases
- Merchandise
- Sponsorships
- Live performances
- Digital products
- Brand partnerships
- Licensing opportunities
- Creative services

☐ Who is my audience or customer?

Understanding your audience helps you make better business decisions.

Step 2: Establish Your Business Structure

Many creators begin as individuals, but building a formal business structure can help create separation between your personal and creative activities.

Common business structures include:

Sole Proprietorship

A simple structure where the individual and business are legally connected.

LLC (Limited Liability Company)

A common structure that may provide liability protection and help establish a more formal business presence.

Corporation

A more advanced structure typically used by larger businesses.

The right structure depends on your goals, situation, and professional advice.

Step 3: Register Your Business

Creating a legitimate business foundation helps establish credibility.

Consider:

- ☐ Choosing a business name
- ☐ Registering your business with your state (if applicable)
- ☐ Obtaining an EIN from the IRS
- ☐ Applying for required licenses or permits
- ☐ Creating professional business contact information

A professional setup can help when working with partners, vendors, platforms, and potential funding sources.

Step 4: Separate Personal and Business Finances

One of the most important steps for any creator entrepreneur is separating business activity from personal finances.

Consider:

- ☐ Opening a business bank account
- ☐ Tracking creator income separately
- ☐ Recording business expenses
- ☐ Keeping receipts and financial records

Examples of creator business expenses may include:

- Equipment
- Software subscriptions

- Marketing
- Studio expenses
- Travel
- Production costs
- Website expenses
- Professional services

Step 7: Protect Your Creative Assets

Consider organizing:

- ☐ Copyright registrations
- ☐ Music publishing information
- ☐ Ownership agreements
- ☐ Licensing agreements
- ☐ Contracts with collaborators
- ☐ Royalty information

Keeping records of ownership and revenue can help protect your creative business.

Step 8: Build Business Credit
