Recycling Tips

Paper: newspapers, magazines, catalogs, white and colored paper (lined, copier, computer, staples OK), mail and envelopes (any color, window envelopes OK), paper bags, wrapping paper

Cardboard: soft-cover books, telephone books (e.g. paperbacks, comics, no spiral bindings), cardboard egg cartons and trays, smooth cardboard (food and shoes boxes, tubes, file folders, cardboard from product packaging), corrugated cardboard boxes

Metal: Empty and rinse before recycling cartons, bottles or cans, plastic food containers

Empty and rinse aluminum trays

Aerosol cans can be recycled

Glass: bottles & jars only

Plastic: plastic bottles; rigid plastic caps & lids, food containers, non-food containers; rigid plastic housewares (flower pots, mixing bowls, plastic appliances, etc.), bulk rigid plastic (crates, buckets, pails, furniture, large toys, large appliances, etc.)

Cartons: milk, ice tea, soy milk, soup, etc.)



NYC Recycles

Mixed Paper **Cardboard**

Flatten & bundle or bag boxes. Staples & window envelopes ok. Put in clear bags, bins labeled MIXED PAPER, or any bin with green NYC Recycles decal.

No hardcover books; waxed, soiled, or soft paper

All NYC residents, government agencies, schools, and institutions serviced by the Department of Sanitation must recycle the materials listed above. Ask your building manager how to set out recyclables. Certain items can't or shouldn't be discarded in the trash or recycling; see nyc.gov/wasteless/disposal for donating, take-back programs, and other disposal options.

Metal **Rigid plastic**

Glass **Cartons**

bottles & jars

No batteries, plastic bags, squeeze tubes & pouches, or plastic foam

Put in clear bags, bins labeled METAL, GLASS & PLASTIC, or any bin with blue NYC Recycles decal. Empty and rinse containers. Caps & lids ok.

All NYC residents, government agencies, schools, and institutions serviced by the Department of Sanitation must recycle the materials listed above. Ask your building manager how to set out recyclables. Certain items can't or shouldn't be discarded in the trash or recycling; see nyc.gov/wasteless/disposal for donating, take-back programs, and other disposal options.
