**The following ARE NOT Household Waste and
ARE NEVER TO BE PLACED IN DUMPSTERS:**

- Tires*
- Lead Acid Batteries*
- Carpeting
- Scrap Metal
- Mattresses

- Hazardous Waste*

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Materials identified as recyclable **SHOULD NOT** be placed in dumpsters with household waste!!

Place all recyclables in the appropriate area in the Recycle Building

Recycling Guidelines follow DNR Requirements

Material	Required Preparation
CARDBOARD Food products boxes-cereal/cake/cracker; Corrugated cardboard; Toilet paper and towel rolls; Kleenex boxes	Must be free of food debris Flatten boxes
CARTONS Juice, milk, soup or broth cartons; Egg substitute cartons; Drink boxes	Rinse cartons, and remove any plastic or straws Flatten
PLASTIC CONTAINERS #1-7 Plastic bottles, jars and jugs; Milk jugs; Water, soda, juice or drink bottles; Yogurt containers; Cottage cheese containers and lids; Dish soap and laundry detergent containers	Plastic rings and caps may remain on drink bottles Plastic containers may be flattened to save space
# 2 BULKY RIGID PLASTICS Ice cream pails; 5 gallon buckets; Laundry baskets; Children's toys	Containers should be rinsed and free of debris See Recycling Attendant for Proper Placement in Recycling Area
PLASTIC FILM Grocery store, retail or newspaper bags; Produce and bread bags; Case wrap from water, napkins, paper towels, toilet paper; Ziploc or similar storage bags; Air pillows used for packaging **Plastic Film may also be recycled at various retail locations	NOTE: Recyclable plastic film should stretch when pulled apart with both hands. If it doesn't stretch, it is not recyclable as plastic film. Bags and plastic should be free from debris and dry Remove any paper label, tape or adhesive strips
GLASS BOTTLES & JARS Sauce, spice or other food jars; Alcohol or drink bottles	Rinse and remove any food debris or dirt All colors of glass are acceptable
ALUMINUM Aluminum cans; Foil; Disposable aluminum baking pans	Remove all food debris May be flattened to save space
PAPER Newspapers & magazines; Wrapping & tissue paper; Junk mail; Office paper; Books, paperbacks, phone books; Paper bags	Paper may be bundled or placed in a paper bag Paper should be kept dry
STEEL & TIN CANS Soup, vegetable, and fruit cans; Pet food cans; Coffee cans	Rinse and remove all food debris Lids should be placed inside the can prior to placing in recycling area
STYROFOAM Cups; Packing materials; Food containers	Rinse and remove all food debris Must be clean and dry
AEROSOL SPRAY CANS	Should be empty – remove caps
WASTE OIL & OIL FILTERS	Waste oil must be transported to the drop off site in a container that contains no contaminants and placed in appropriate container at drop off site.
LIGHT BULBS Fluorescent tubes, Compact fluorescent bulbs, Ultraviolet lamps, LED lamps	Unbroken light tubes only SEE ATTENDANT FOR PROPER PLACEMENT IN RECYCLE AREA

RESTRICTED ITEM GUIDELINES & FEES

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS HAVE SPECIAL HANDLING AND FEE REQUIREMENTS

PLEASE SEE TOWN DROP-OFF SITE STAFF PRIOR TO DISPOSAL

FURNITURE Couches, chairs and furniture Steel frames must be removed from hide-away bed couches prior to disposal Item must be broken down and fit entirely in dumpster	Chair - \$3.00 Sofa - \$5.00
MATTRESSES & BOX SPRINGS	\$15.00 Each
TIRES	Car Tire - \$6.00 Car Tire with Rim - \$10.00 Pickup Truck Tire - \$8.00 Large Truck Tire - \$15.00 Large Truck Float Tire - \$25.00
LARGE HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES Refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, freezers	Refrigerators & Freezers - \$35.00 Washers & Dryers - \$5.00 Air Conditioner & Dehumidifier - \$10.00
SMALL HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES Vacuums, Microwaves, Mixers, Blenders, Fans, Toasters, Toaster Ovens, Holiday Light Strings	Microwave - \$3.00 No Fee For Other Items
TELEVISIONS – All Sizes and Types	\$25.00 Each
ELECTRONICS Video Player, Computer, Monitors, Mouse, Key Pads, Copiers, Printers, Cell Phones, Radios	Video Player (VCR, DVD, DVR)- \$2.00 Each Computer or Monitor - \$10.00 Each Printer, Copier or Fax - \$10.00 Each
SCRAP METAL Metal cookware, wiring, hitches, lawn chairs, treadmills, bikes, lawn mowers, metal cages or traps	NO FEE

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT TOWN DROP-OFF SITE

THE FOLLOWING ARE NEVER TO BE PLACED IN DUMPSTERS

These Guidelines follow DNR Requirements

Material	Disposal Options
CARPETING	Y's Way Carpeting – Watertown
YARD WASTE	Consider composting. The WI DNR web-site is a resource for composting information.
CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS Glass, brick, concrete, lumber, drywall, insulation, shingles, wiring, piping or plumbing fixtures, ballasts, etc	Contract a dumpster from a local waste hauler to insure proper handling and disposal of construction debris. Contact Habitat for Humanity ReStore
HAZARDOUS WASTE: Enamel & Oil Based Paints, Pesticides, Kerosene, Gasoline, Chemicals, Varnish, Thinner, Stripper, Automotive Fluids and Cleaners, Lithium Batteries, Mercury	See Dodge or Jefferson County Web-sites for Clean Sweep dates and details regarding hazardous items
LEAD ACID BATTERIES: Car, Power Tools, etc	Lueck Recycling in Watertown
LP TANKS	Ask about disposal options when purchasing United Cooperative - Watertown
VARIOUS RECYCLABLE AND RESTRICTED WASTE ITEMS	American Metal & Paper, West Bend, WI (262)334-9542

Contact the Dodge County Dispatch and the Watertown Fire Department and inform them of your intention to have a controlled burn and that they should not respond to a fire on your premises during the designated burn time UNLESS they are notified by you.
