RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Materials identified as recyclable **SHOULD NOT** be placed in dumpsters with household waste!!
 Place all recyclables in the Recycle Dumpster or in the appropriate area in the Recycle Building
 Recycling Guidelines follow DNR Requirements

Material	Required Preparation
RECYCLE DUMPSTER	
PLASTIC CONTAINERS #1 & #3-7 Plastic bottles and containers; Water, soda, juice or drink bottles; Yogurt containers; Cottage cheese containers and lids; Salad dressing similar; Ice cream pails; 5 gallon buckets; Laundry baskets	Plastic rings and caps may remain on drink bottles Plastic containers may be flattened to save space NO plastic bags of any type
GLASS BOTTLES & JARS Sauce, spice or other food jars; Alcohol or drink bottles	Rinse and remove any food debris or dirt All colors of glass are acceptable NO lightbulbs, Pyrex or heat resistant glassware, crystal, ceramic dishes or pottery, mirrors or glass windows
PAPER Newspapers & magazines; Wrapping & tissue paper; Junk mail; Office paper; Books, paperbacks, phone books; Paper bags	Paper may be loose or placed in a paper bag NO tape, twine, string ties or plastic bags NO shredded paper NO paper cups with laminated coating
RECYCLE BUILDING	
CARDBOARD Food products boxes-cereal/cake/cracker; Corrugated cardboard; Toilet paper and towel rolls; Kleenex boxes	Must be free of food debris Flatten boxes
# 2 PLASTICS Milk jugs; Dish soap and laundry detergent containers	Containers should be rinsed and free of debris Remove caps
STEEL & TIN CANS Soup, vegetable, and fruit cans; Pet food cans; Coffee cans	Rinse and remove all food debris Lids should be placed inside the can prior to placing in recycling area
ALUMINUM Aluminum cans; Foil; Disposable aluminum baking pans	Remove all food debris May be flattened to save space
WASTE OIL & OIL FILTERS	Waste oil must be transported to the drop off site in a container that contains no contaminants and placed in appropriate container at drop off site.
LIGHT BULBS Fluorescent tubes, Compact fluorescent bulbs, Ultraviolet lamps, LED lamps	Unbroken light tubes only SEE ATTENDANT FOR PROPER PLACEMENT IN RECYCLE AREA
SMALL APPLIANCES Vacuums, Mixers, Blenders, Fans, Toasters, Toaster Ovens, Coffee Makers, Computer Mouse or Keyboard, Radios	SEE ATTENDANT FOR PROPER PLACEMENT IN RECYCLE AREA

ITEMS NOT ACCEPTED AT TOWN DROP-OFF SITE

THE FOLLOWING ARE NEVER TO BE PLACED IN DUMPSTERS

These Guidelines follow DNR Requirements

Material	Disposal Options
CARPETING	Y's Way Carpeting – Watertown
YARD WASTE	Consider composting. The WI DNR web-site is a resource for composting information.
CONSTRUCTION DEBRIS Glass, brick, concrete, lumber, drywall, insulation, shingles, wiring, piping or plumbing fixtures, ballasts, etc	Contract a dumpster from a local waste hauler to insure proper handling and disposal of construction debris. Contact Habitat for Humanity ReStore
HAZARDOUS WASTE: Enamel & Oil Based Paints, Pesticides, Kerosene, Gasoline, Chemicals, Varnish, Thinner, Stripper, Automotive Fluids and Cleaners, Lithium Batteries, Mercury	See Dodge or Jefferson County Web-sites for Clean Sweep dates and details regarding hazardous items
LEAD ACID BATTERIES: Car, Power Tools, etc	Lueck Recycling in Watertown
LP TANKS	Ask about disposal options when purchasing United Cooperative - Watertown
VARIOUS RECYCLABLE AND RESTRICTED WASTE ITEMS	American Metal & Paper, West Bend, WI (262)334-9542

REDUCE - REUSE – RECYCLE

DID YOU KNOW

- The average American generates 4.4 pounds of trash & recyclables per day. That adds up to 250 million tons per year in the U.S.
- Although 75% of America’s waste is recyclable, we only recycle around 30% of it.
- Landfills are among the biggest contributors to soil pollution – roughly 80% of the items buried in landfills could be recycled.

THINGS YOU CAN DO

- **SHOP WITH REUSABLE SHOPPING BAGS** – To minimize or eliminate the use of plastic store bags
- **PLASTIC BAGS AND WRAP ARE RECYCLABLE** - While they are not allowed in the Recycle Dumpster, you can take them to a retailer near you and deposit in bins provided. Walmart, Kohls and Pick N Save are a few of the local retailers that have bins available.
- **WORN OUT CLOTHING AND TEXTILES ARE RECYCLABLE** – If you have items that are too worn to donate or sell, you can recycle them. If you take them to St. Vincent DePaul, for example, just let the attendant know that the items are not in saleable condition. They will place them in their recycle trailer and receive a cash benefit from recycling them.
- **USE REUSABLE BEVERAGE CONTAINERS** – To eliminate some of the 2.5 million plastic bottles that are disposed of every hour.
- **RECYCLE JUNK MAIL and PAPER** – To reduce some of the 4 million tons of junk mail that we receive and dispose of in landfills each year.
- **REVIEW TRASH DISPOSAL AND RECYCLE GUIDELINES** – To insure you are doing all you can to properly dispose of trash and recyclables.
