REDUCE - REUSE - RECYCLE

DID YOU KNOW

- The average American generates 4.4 pounds of trash & recyclables per day. That adds up to 250 million tons per year in the U.S.
- Although 75% of America's waste is recyclable, we only recycle around 30% of it.
- Landfills are among the biggest contributors to soil pollution roughly 80% of the items buried in landfills could be recycled.

THINGS YOU CAN DO

- SHOP WITH REUSABLE SHOPPING BAGS To minimize or eliminate the use of plastic store bags
- PLASTIC BAGS AND WRAP ARE RECYCLABLE While they are not allowed in the Recycle Dumpster, you
 can take them to a retailer near you and deposit in bins provided. Walmart, Kohls and Pick N Save are
 a few of the local retailers that have bins available.
- WORN OUT CLOTHING AND TEXTILES ARE RECYLABLE If you have items that are too worn to donate or sell, you can recycle them. If you take them to St. Vincent DePaul, for example, just let the attendant know that the items are not in saleable condition. They will place them in their recycle trailer and receive a cash benefit from recycling them.
- **USE REUSABLE BEVERAGE CONTAINERS** To eliminate some of the 2.5 million plastic bottles that are disposed of every hour.
- **RECYCLE JUNK MAIL and PAPER** To reduce some of the 4 million tons of junk mail that we receive and dispose of in landfills each year.
- **REVIEW TRASH DISPOSAL AND RECYCLE GUIDELINES** To insure you are doing all you can to properly dispose of trash and recyclables.
