MARINA GET-TOGETHER

For those of you who were not present at the Orpheum Concert, we take this opportunity to remind you of the Jam Session to be held this Saturday morning, May 1st, 9:00 a.m. at the Marina Theatre on Chestnut Street just beyond Fillmore. This will be strictly a fun session, with refreshments in the lobby for everybody. In order that the members might be more prepared to derive a greater measure of satisfaction from their efforts, we offer for your inspection the complete schedule of tonal resources available on the organ as read from left to right around the Horseshoe. You'll notice also that we have provided you with a list of the stops to be found on the various thumb pistons, in order that one might make more complete use of the tones. Larry Vannucci, who has arranged for the use of the organ and Theatre, has also consented to lead off the program with three of his fine organ solos. Tiny James and Jim Roseveare will follow Larry at the console to help break the ice. From then on, it will be up to you, the members, to keep things swingin. A strict five-minute time limit will be observed; we suggest that those members who wish to play prepare two or three selections to fit this limit. After all, everyone should be given a chance to play. All those wishing to play will place their names on small cards in the foyer. These names will be chosen at random from a hat.

NOTICE TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: There will be a meeting of the officers and Board of Directors subsequent to the Marina session. This is of utmost importance as final plans for our thind meeting will be discussed along with proposals for an A.T.O.E. regional convention to be held in July. Register Crescendo Pedal Left Chamber expression pedal - Controls Tibia, Trumpet, Diapason and Vox. Right Chamber expression pedal - Controls String and 4' Flute Master expression control to cause both expression pedals to be coupled to right expression pedal.
