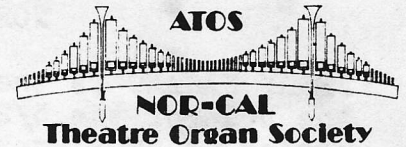
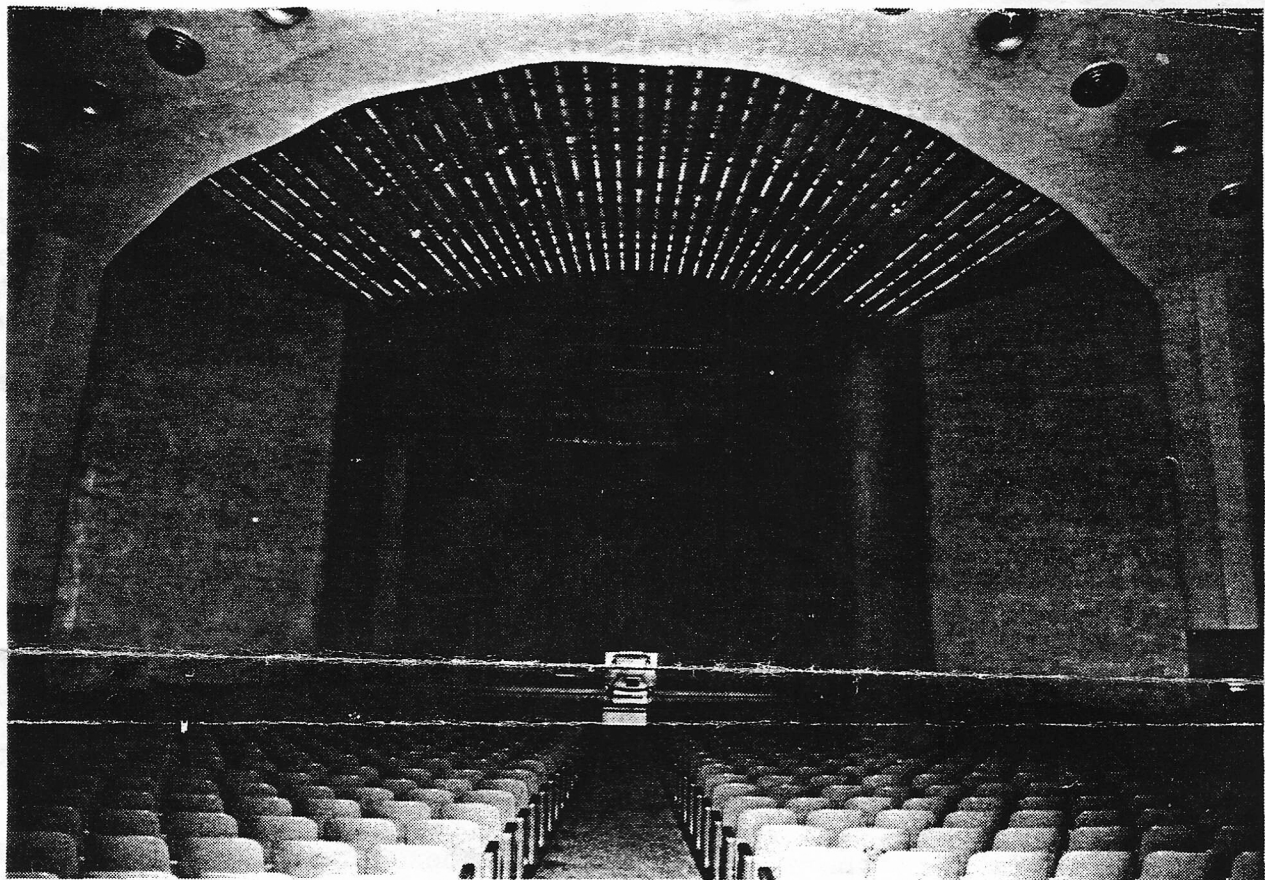

NOR-CAL SEPTEMBER PROGRAM CONT'D

JERRY NAGANO is the resident organist at the Pasadena Civic Auditorium, the home of the 5/28 Foort/BBC Moller organ. He has been a featured artist at ATOS conventions in Los Angeles and Detroit, and has played concerts in Philadelphia, Detroit, Rochester, Honolulu, New York, Columbus, and Las Vegas.

BOB VAUGHN after retirement from a vocation outside the music world, returned to his first profession and love, playing theatre organ accompaniment for silent movies. There are few organists who are still performing as they did in the 1920's and 30's. Bob is one of them, actively keeping this art form alive. He played regularly at the Avenue Theatre in San Francisco from 1968 to 1984; has played nearly every convention for the Society for Cinephiles for the past 12 years, and continues to play periodically at the Castro Theatre in San Francisco as well as for the U.C. Theatre, Pacific Film Archives, ATOS Chapters, schools and private organizations.

To reach the Berkeley Community Theatre:

VIA BART, Exit at the Berkeley station, located on Shattuck Ave. between Center and Alliston Way. Walk $\frac{1}{2}$ block South to Alliston Way. Walk one block West on Alliston Way, to Milvia St. Ahead on your left you will see the large white auditorium of the Berkeley Community Theatre, which is bounded on the East by Milvia St. and on the North by Alliston way.

DRIVING SOUTH on Interstate 80 in Berkeley, exit at University Ave. and drive East on University Ave. 16 blocks to Martin Luther King Memorial Dr., turn South on MLK Dr. and proceed 3 blocks and turn East on Alliston Way. The theatre will be on your right as you face East on Alliston way. Free parking is available on the streets on Sunday. Paid parking is available in a garage on Bancroft Way, on the east side of the Berkeley Community High School campus, which interrupts Bancroft way.

DRIVING NORTH on Interstate 80 in Berkeley, exit on Ashby Ave, and drive East on Ashby approximately a mile, crossing San Pablo & Sacramento. Turn North on Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Drive, and proceed 12 blocks (counting on the right hand side) and turn right on Alliston Way.
