## Review of the Mini Concert & Open Console at the Grand Lake Saturday, August 13<sup>th</sup> 9AM

The Grand Lake [Theatre] graciously opened its doors early for a halflength concert by NorCal Member **Gordon Pratt** followed by open console by NorCal members. Gordon alternates with **Kevin King** in presenting pre-show and intermission concerts at the theatre on Friday and Saturday nights. Kevin owns and maintains the *3-manual*, *18-rank Wurlitzer* originally installed by the late **Ernie Wilson** and his crew. Thanks to Kevin's talented ear, this instrument has an exceptional tonal finish and is a real joy both to hear and to play.

Gordon played many of the numbers heard in his delightful pre-show presentations, including works by **Cole Porter, John Williams**, and many others. Among the **Cole Porter** numbers were *'True Love'* and a beautiful *'In the Still of the Night'*. The **John Williams** numbers included a medley of themes from *'Superman'*.

Gordon allowed time for two rotations of open console. Those who played included **Tom Mathiesen, Craig Browning, Al Norman, Jeff Porto, Wayne Joseph,** and **Art Woodworth**. We then heard a set by **Kevin King** in his upbeat, jazzy style.

It was a wonderful morning filled with a great variety of music on truly great theatre organ.

A s most of you know, Sierra Chapter had to remove their *Mendenhall Wurlitzer* out of its Sacramento home, and the organ was donated to the *State Theatre Arts Guild* in Oroville, CA, where it will be restored and installed in the historic *Oroville State Theatre*.

**Dave Moreno** was in charge of a crew of volunteers who have gotten about 85% - 90% of the pieces moved. Dave figures about one more day of work is needed to finish the operation.

The job was especially hard since they were not allowed to use a forklift inside the museum. The crew got around this by building a scaffold up to the shutters to get the heavy chests and a piano down.

**David** and **Linda Dewey**, members of both the *Sierra and Mt. Shasta Chapters of ATOS* have done much to help make the move a success.

#### **Buddy Cole Live**

Recorded directly from **Buddy's** home tapes of standard tunes and his own original compositions and improvisations. Features three selections Buddy played at his studio for the *1962 ATOE convention* and Buddy talking about the installation of his *27 rank Wurlitzer/Morton*. George Wright Plays New York From mint condition copies of very rare LPs featuring George Wright at the legendary New York Paramount Theater's 4/36 Wurlitzer and George playing the Jesse Crawford studio Wurlitzer upstairs at the Paramount building with legendary jazz drummer Cozy Cole. Really swings!

#### George Wright at the Kearns Wurlitzer

In 1957 while under contract to Hi Fi Records, George Wright recorded two albums for RCA Victor's budget label, Camden Records. These were made at the beautifully voiced, former Warner Bros., studio Wurlitzer at the home of veteran radio and television actor Joseph Kearns. Beautifully played and long unavailable. From mint condition copies!

#### Leon Berry: His First and Rarest Recordings Vol 1 & 2

There was never a better, or more well loved skating rink organist than **Leon Berry**. These recordings predate his later Audio Fidelity albums and were made on state-of-the-art equipment, transferred from mint condition and unplayed copies.
