BERT ATWOOD AT BCT JANUARY 22, 2012

Our own NorCal member **Bert Atwood** provided our annual membership business meeting with a varied program of music, largely from the mid-20th century.

Having an Allen GW4 Special theatre organ at home obviously gave Bert the confidence to take charge of our monster console, which he has christened *Roxy*, in honor of the theater for which it was built, which was very briefly named the *RKO Roxy*, but was renamed the Center Theater after the Roxy Theater objected to using that name.

Bert presented interesting historical facts about most of the selections. I was especially impressed by Bert's encore number, the difficult *Bumble Boogie*.

I would have enjoyed the ballads more if they were played at a quicker tempo, but for a non-professional artist, Bert entertained us very well and was well received by the audience.

BITS AND PIECES FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING

Bill Schlotter started the meeting off with a 'Show & Tell' regarding the work that has been done so far, and what more needs to be done to the BCT to make it ready for Public Concerts. There is no time line for work completion. Bill explained that the handicapped lift's operation is unlike any other normal elevator you might have seen elsewhere. One starts out by pushing 'Up' to go 'Down', and *vice-versa*; then the door opens and lets you in to the lift.

Robert Woodworth became the Elevator (handicapped lift) Operator, and gave some members a ride.



Chair **Bill Coale** introduced New Board Member **Warren Lubich**, and returning members for a second term, **Elbert Dawson** and **Jud Owens**. He thanked outgoing Board Member **Frank La Fetra** for his service, especially as Treasurer for the past several years.

Chairman Coale also thanked our many returning members for continuing on during the BCT's closure. He pointed out that it is very hard to attract new members without Public Concerts.

Associate Members take note: You are entitled to ALL of the Chapter's benefits, with the single exception of voting. By ATOS' By-Laws you must be a current member of ATOS to vote in Chapter elections. Associate Members, aka Friends of NorCal are IMPORTANT MEMBERS of our Chapter.

Frank La Fetra said Membership Booklets will be mailed to all those who signed up to be included. Anyone wishing to be added to later editions should contact Neal Wood.

Crew Chief **Bill Schlotter** assured us

that first class artists love to play here, so even without Public Concerts he hope to have members programs with great artists this year. He pointed out that the BCT's organ is one of the best in the world, and is especially notable because EVERYTHING WORKS! It actually is concert ready at any time. He also pointed out that the Crew has continued quietly working every weekend all year, not only maintaining the organ, but helping maintain the building.

Neal Wood, who has accepted the post of Treasurer, pointed out that monetary contributions by members was about \$3,600 last year, and almost matches our membership dues. Matching Funds are included in that figure (but timing of deposits may have put the 'gift' and 'match' in different years). Wood encourages everyone to use any matching funds that are available to them.
