Robert (Woodworth) and I are so-o-o glad we hung around for this. Bill started on one manual, eventually two, then he started hand registering, and finally used three manuals. He played from about 5:30 to 7:00 PM. It was not long before he got into the old swing. He played dozens of great numbers, including the best Old Man River I think I have ever heard – not strident or preachy. A long and very thoughtful Evergreen. Some of Warsaw Concerto. (He was using the grand piano as well as the Allen by now.) The Full Moon and Empty Arms theme from either **Rachmaninoff**'s 1st or 2nd piano concerto (whichever).

This was about the time the moon came up over the lake.



A wonderful set. We all paid rapt attention. (David appeared to be paying very close attention.) A second truly magic hour and a half a music on the same day!

This annual concert, sponsored jointly by *Grant Alumni* and *Sierra Chapter* has become one of the Bay Area's premier events.

It honors the legendary Theatre Organist George Wright, who attended Grant Union High School and got his start there.

The concert is also well known for the excellent artists who are featured each year. This year, **Martin Ellis**, follows in that tradition.

Ellis was the winner of the first *ATOS Young Organists Competition* in 1986 and was a featured artist in the *1987 ATOS Convention*.

From there his career has taken off; and he is well known throughout the world for his abilities on Theatre Organs, as well as on Classical Organs. He is featured in symphony concerts; and has maintained his playing in churches, as he has moved about the country. Moreover, he was the Senior Staff Pianist/Organist for the *Indianapolis Children's Choir*, a touring organization with more than 2,000 children.

Throughout the years he has continued his love of Theatre Organs, acting as Staff Organist for various Pizza Parlors, and was invited to become a fourth member of the *Trio con Brio* by **Donna Parker, Tom Hazleton**, and **Jonas Nordwall**. He became a permanent member after Hazleton's death.

Locally, Ellis was last heard at the 2010 Pops Concert at Ironstone Vineyards.

This is definitely a concert not to be missed!

It is with a heavy heart that I report the passing of our long-time and dear friend and colleague, **Chris Gorsuch**, who, after courageously battling cancer, passed away peacefully in his sleep just before midnight on October 17th. As you all know, Chris earned widespread admiration as a brilliant organist, arranger, and technician. In 2008, he received the honor of the *American Theatre Organ Society's Organist of the Year*.

Those of us who had the great honor of knowing him will always remember his gregarious, fun-loving, outgoing nature and will deeply miss his friendship.

(*Active Members are those with current Memberships to NorCal and ATOS.)

In addition, any Active NorCal member may nominate other Active NorCal members after assuring that they are willing to serve. Such nominations must be submitted to the nominating committee in writing no later than **November 15**th, and must include the nominee's consent to serve, if elected and must include the signatures of at least two active members besides that of the nominee.

Our Board of Directors consists of nine members, three of whom are elected each year for a term of three years. A director may be re-elected one time without a gap of at least one term. Members whose terms are up are:

Bill Coale (eligible for re-election), **Art Woodworth** (eligible for re-election), and **Gordon Pratt** (not eligible for re-election).

In accordance with our By-laws the nominating committee will propose a slate of candidates for election to the board, after assuring that those nominated are willing to serve in that capacity. The names of all qualified nominees are passed to the Secretary by December 1st. If the number of names match the number of vacancies, an election is not required. If there are more nominees than vacancies, the Secretary prepares and sends out ballots before December 15th. Ballots when needed, are counted at the Annual Member's Meeting.
