REVIEW OF MARK HERMAN

at BCT NOVEMBER 3, 2013

I believe this was **Mark Herman's** third appearance at Berkeley Community Theatre, as our Annual Meeting concert artist in 2008 and for a concert in November 2010. Mark's career as a touring artist has advanced rapidly and he is an exciting example of a young theatre organist.

As he has shown in previous performances, Mark's talent is outstanding. His arrangements are especially well suited to a large theatre pipe organ, and his playing is crisp and (as far as I noted) flawless. He is good at left-hand melody while playing ornamentation with his right hand. He also uses smooth *segues* and introductions. His registrations are light, featuring various voices of the instrument without suffering from 'muddy' excesses. Mark's selections were a good mix of old favorites and some little known pieces. His talent for jazzy interpretations was evidenced in several numbers.

I enjoyed his inclusion of a composition by contemporary **Lyn Larsen**, as well as one of *his own* compositions, written in the 'novelty' style of **Zez Confrey** and named for Mark's dog, *Jarvis*!

Mark displays a wide smile and appears very comfortable in the close setting of our on stage seating. I thought this was one of our best 'stage door concerts' and it drew a good crowd, right around 100!

We were pleased to see **Walt Strony** in the audience, too. He knows a good thing when it comes along! And, by the way, Walt will be our concert artist in February! — Don Ravey
