September, 1947 - August 22, 2014

He was a delight to work with, and had a great sense of humor. **Don** will be greatly missed by all.

Aura Edwards

August 30, 1923 - August 23, 2014

For many reasons **Aura Edwards** was a well known resident of the East Bay.

The **Contra Costa Times** stated, "To say Aura marched to a different drummer would be a significant understatement".

Among other gifts, Aura was one of the few female professional theatre pipe organists in the United States and worked for 11 years at the Bella Roma Pizza Parlors in Concord and Martinez. Long time NorCal members will recall the many Sunday picnics she hosted for us, and the lovely organ in her home.

Earth Quake News

An Email from Chris Nichols

Today [August 28] **Neal Wood** and I went over to Berkeley to check on the NorCal organ. We started in the basement and worked our way up. We have some things stored in the basement including some manual chests which are for sale. Everything seemed fine and nothing looked out of place. We checked the blower room. Nothing looked out of place. There was a pile of moving blankets and they had not fallen over. We didn't start the blowers because we wanted to check the chambers first.

We then went up to the balcony. Everything there seemed fine. In the back corner we have a set of 16' Viola Diapason pipes. They were fine and it didn't look like they had moved. Things on the balcony looked undisturbed. We turned on the separate blower for the 32' Diaphone and manually activated some of the pipes and some of the trap doors at the tops of the pipes. Everything worked as expected. Neal checked the piano shelf and all seemed in order there.

We then went up to the chambers. We checked in each of the chambers for any

pipes which might be askew but found none. Everything looked OK. Neal climbed up the small ladders used to climb into the organ. From up there he had a good view of the pipes and everything appeared normal.

We checked the work room and the upper relay room and they both seemed fine. We did not find anything out of place.

We turned on the blower and wind came up as usual. We played several notes manually and all seemed OK. Neal went out into the fan to check the unenclosed percussions and traps and said all looked OK.

We came back down to stage level and I played a few ranks from the computer. We did a few computer playbacks of songs and the organ behaved and sounded fine. At the next work party we will hook up the console and check out all the ranks. I suspect that if we find something it will not have been caused by the earthquake.
