Editor's Note: I couldn't resist copying this delightful writeup from the Cinema Organ Society website They are at http://www.cinemaorgans.org.uk. Don't let Mr. Hills' classical qualifications worry you - you will hearing him play great theatre organ arrangements on our Mighty Wurlitzer!

Richard Hills is one of the very few musicians truly to have bridged and mastered the divide between the world of the classical organ and that of the theatre organ. Having commenced classical organ studies under William Whitehead at Rochester Cathedral, he became Organ Scholar at Exeter College Oxford, studying with David Sanger. Further organ scholarships followed at Portsmouth Cathedral, where he studied with Rosemary Field and at Westminster Abbey.

He now pursues a freelance career and is Organist at St Mary's, Bourne Street, London. His career in the theatre organ world has been equally prestigious. He has numerous prizes and awards to his credit, both in this country and in the USA, where he was named 'Organist of the Year' in 2010 by the American

Theatre Organ Society. He has appeared many times on national and international TV and Radio, including solo appearances on programmes as diverse as Radio 3 Choral Evensong and Radio 2's 'Friday Night is Music Night', and has several recording credits. His most recent solo recording was made on the magnificent dual-purpose Compton organ of Southampton's Guildhall.

When not on the bench Richard serves as Musical Advisor to the Cinema Organ Society and maintains a practical interest in organ building.

JONAS NORDWALL CONCERT REVIEW

On Sunday, March 24th, NorCal featured one of our longtime favorites, Jonas Nordwall, in concert. Jonas is a master at our console having played several concerts and having made several recordings here over the years at Berkeley. The concert began with "This Could Be the Start of Something Big" which was an appropriate theme for the entire program that day. We can always count on a most varied program from Jonas. His musical expertise

covers all styles of music. He is comfortable with all genres, from the well-known standards, jazz stylings, as well as both light and heavy classical material. As the concert progressed we heard a medley including: "Sugartime", "Around the World in 80 Days", and "Rag Mop." Later we visited the red light district during a sultry "The Birth of the Blues."

Another great medley included three by Nacio Herb Brown: "Doll Dance", "Temptation", and "American Bolero." As a contrast, in the second half, we were offered: "Scherzo" by Ellsasser, and "The Emperor's Fanfare" by Soler. Selections from the iconic "My Fair Lady" followed next. Towards the end of the concert Jonas really "tested" the abilities of our Wurlitzer when he played "La Belle Helene" Overture by Offenbach. Warm, appreciative applause at the end brought Jonas back for an encore of "Valencia." As always, Jonas provided the widest variety of musical selections performed with flawless technique. A big thank you to Jonas for sharing these musical gifts with us!

The appreciation shown for our Wurlitzer organ by people who know and understand theatre pipe organs is a tribute to the work of our theatre organ crew.
