**Attendance:** 11 members attended the November Meeting at Bernina Stitchin Post, Walbridge, OH.

### **President's Report:**

Deb has more needle felting mats to create felted pictures. She is open to having people over to her house so that she doesn't have to transport materials. Deb will provide lunch (11:30a.m. — whenever). These events are open to all guild members. Let Deb know if you have an interest. At Market Day she will sell felt mats.

### **Committee Reports:**

#### Finance:

- Nancy discussed finances. Nancy currently used an old version of QuickBooks (circa 2014). It would cost \$100 or so/year to upgrade to current cloud-based software. Nancy found some free online budget management programs to check out. She didn't feel that the cost for QuickBooks is worth it for simple accounting that we do. Louise volunteered to assist Nancy with the transition to a new accounting system, if needed, and will work with Nancy to develop a 2026 budget for the guild that will be presented at the April 2026 meeting.
  - Approved: A check will be set to Wood County Park District for yearly membership (\$20). They will post our Market Day in their publication. Susan to follow up with getting them the information they need.
  - Approved: Chris Watson, The Bard Coffee, to serve coffee and help with advertising for Market Day. Deb Y and Leigh Ann to follow up with him to get the cost (last year = \$200).

#### Market Day:

- As of November 11, we have 26 paid vendors and 3 more are expected to pay. We
  have reserved free spaces for Lace Demonstration and Wood County Park District.
  In total, we have 38-39 booth spaces filled out of the 44 available. Space for classes
  are accounted for separately.
- Susan has performed detailed research on area newspapers that she could contact
  for Market Day advertising. She will contact magazines, guilds and online sites.
  Members should print copies of market day flyers and bookmarks from the
  newsletters to pass out starting in January or display at your local libraries and
  stores.
- Colleen will continue to assist with posting Market Day information on our Facebook page. Deb Y and Leigh Ann will follow up with Chris on the posting schedules.
  - Approved: The advertising budget we be limited to what we spent last year,
     \$275. If additional funding is needed, the funds can be requested at our next meeting in January.
- This year we will include a Scavenger Hunt to encourage visitors to stay longer and visit every booth rather than the raffle.
- Denise has been researching the cost of various printing needs. We will proceed to limit spending to match last year.
  - Approved: The printing budet will be limited to what we spent last year,
     \$294. If additional funding is needed, the funds can be requested at our next meeting in January.
- Louise has been updating the website and met with Nancy to research expenses for the past 2 years budget.

Susan led a program on Andean plying. Explained the process of plying and things to note about plying, then demonstrated how to hold the yarn for plying. Andean plying pulls from both ends of the same ball of yarn to ply.

Shirley Flores donated a Spinolution spinning wheel and a warping board to the guild. Pam took the wheel home to make heavier weight yarn for our nalbinding session and Louise took home the warping board.
