ITEMS OF INTEREST

- The department received the two new Morgan utility sheds. One is being used as a temporary evidence holding for large items and the other one will be used for our new evidence room. The new evidence room will now meet our needs because of previously limited space.
- Our Texas recognition program is progressing well. We have adopted a new set of policies and procedures and are beginning the process of submitting the policies for review and approval. The Texas Municipal League has paid the \$1,200 cost for the first year review and hopefully in the next couple months we will have our site visit and site inspection.
- The movies in the park program has continued to draw larger than previous year's crowds. Most people are bringing their own food and drinks with them and all is going very well so far. We believe that with the printing of the 13,000 movie cards given to school children at our community schools may have helped bolster attendance.
- We have had two dispatchers leave our employment and are in preparation to hire replacements.



COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION

The Communications Coordinator began the process of revising standard operating procedures for the communications division. As a developing agency, we began to set forth new policies for the purpose of creating a consistency in work functions and attendance. Dispatchers have been recently reviewed the newest policies and procedures for the police department. The Horizon City Police Chief, Communications Coordinator, and Shift Supervisor met with 911 CAD Administrators, and ESD1 and 2 representatives to prepare for the 4th of July holiday and to review current operations. The Communications Coordinator attended the ESD1 and ESD2 Commissioners meetings to provide a monthly communications report and to stay informed with their current events.



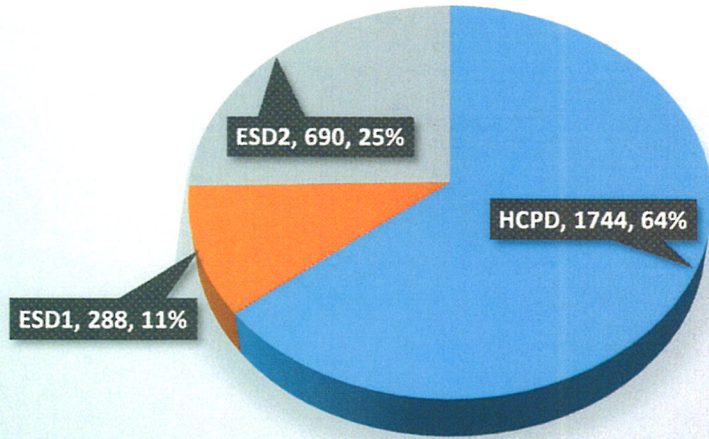
Dispatchers handled calls for service that ranged from civil issues, domestic violence, to manslaughter. Some calls for service required a dispatch for more than one department for different purposes. For example, we received a call for a motor vehicle accident that occurred at the intersection of S Darrington Rd and Antwerp Dr. The caller stated the vehicles were blocking the roadway and that the passengers were injured. The dispatcher handling the police channel dispatched officers to assist in traffic control and/or gather information for reporting purposes. The dispatcher handling the ESD1 channel dispatched Horizon City Fire Department to provide aid to the injured parties and assist in picking up debris.

In another example of a call requiring more than one department, communications received multiple reports of a residential fire in San Elizario. The ESD2 dispatcher dispatched the San Elizario Fire Department and requested assistance from the El Paso Sheriff's Office through our ICAD system. Call takers were advised a total of seven people had evacuated within a minute from the first call and it was unknown what caused the fire. At the time of dispatch, comments stated the flames were large. It took firefighters seven minutes to control the fire. The on call Fire Marshal was dispatched for investigative purposes.

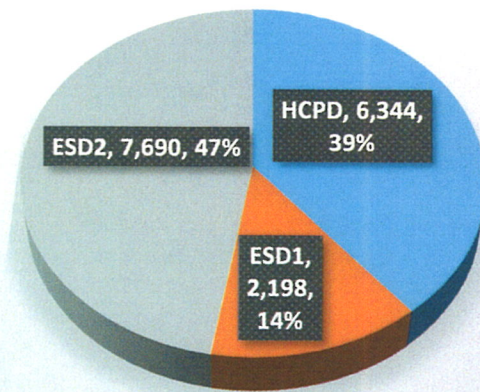
The Emergency Service District #2, activated two phone lines for their emergency and non-emergency lines. The two new phone lines were installed in the VESTA phone system and is ready for use. This will allow for any reporting party such as alarm companies to reach dispatch immediately rather than getting transferred from the El Paso 911 center. The front window was upgraded for security purposes. The new window has a slim opening for the passage of paperwork to prevent anyone from trying to reach inside and will soon have a tint placed.

Dispatchers have put an importance to keep the public informed with our current events. We keep our front desk filled with flyers for "Movies at the Park", copies of city ordinances, and ride along forms. Dispatchers filled bags with coloring books, crayons, stickers and informative pamphlets related to law enforcement for children who walk into our station. Dispatchers continue to post a daily activity report on our Facebook page to keep citizens of Horizon and surrounding areas informed.

Crime Prevention/ Community Outreach

There were no community outreach activities during the month of June.

HCPD Police Explorer Program

The HCPD Police Explorers continued their monthly meetings training and building their skills via scenario-based training. During these scenarios, role players act as victims, offenders, and sometimes injured parties. The members of the explorer program have been crucial to the success of our Movies in the Park program, every Saturday the team gathers and handles up hundreds of pounds worth of outdoor cinema for the enjoyment of our community. We could not do it without them.

Evidence

No discrepancies to report. Approximately 600 items have been inventoried during preparations to move the evidence to the new storage room. During June, the new evidence storage shed was outfitted with drywall and prepped for the installation of an air conditioning unit scheduled for early July. The shed is expected to be fully operational thereafter.

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS

Detective L. Medina assisted the Texas Comptroller in conducting a search warrant of a business. The owner of the business was illegally obtaining vehicle registrations and selling them to customers who attempted to circumvent the process of registering vehicles with salvage titles.

Detective A. Labrado conducted four backgrounds, one for Police Officer and three for communication specialists. The backgrounds consist of neighborhood canvas of the candidates and meeting with individuals associated with the candidate either by employment or personal references.

Detectives attended a training with Homeland Security Investigations for the investigation of financial crimes.

Cases received for the month of June theft, credit card abuse, unauthorized use of motor vehicle, burglary of habitation, and burglary of vehicle. 6 cases were assigned, 17 cases were closed, and 10 cases remain actively open.

EMPLOYEE TRAINING

In-Service Training on Policy and Procedures (4 hours): Officers and dispatchers reviewed the new policy and procedures manual. Attended by Telecommunicators Acevedo, Lozano, Garcia, Acosta, Cardoza, Molina, Officers Nunez, Braziel, and Vasquez.

Taser Recertification (2hours): Officers took a refresher course on how the Taser operates and its proper use. Officers also covered the use of force continuum and the applicability of the Taser. Attended by Sgt. Rosas, Officers G. Rodriguez, Campos, Hernandez, JC. Rodriguez, and Jacobo.
