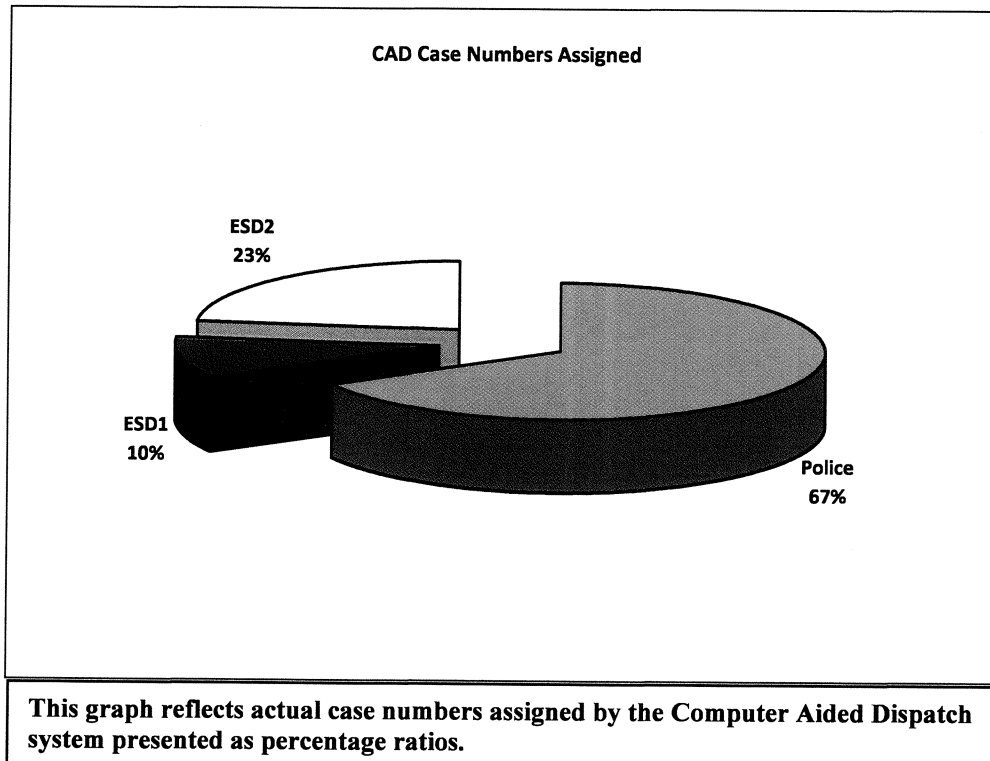
COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION

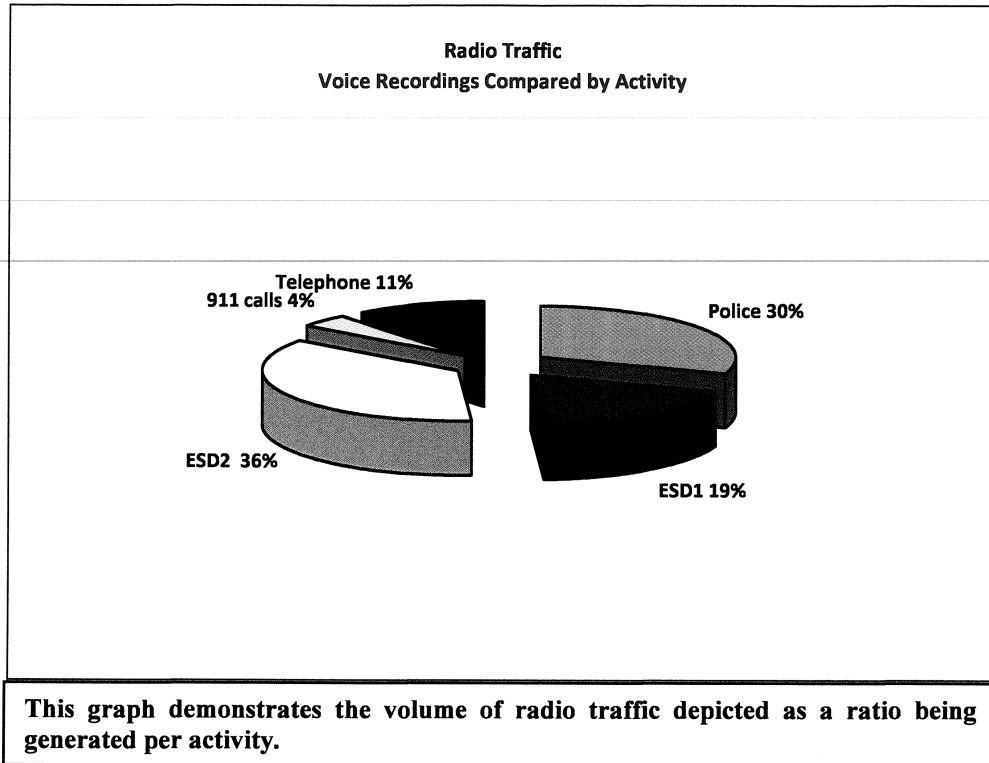
During the month of November, the communications division participated in several seminars and training courses for continued training. The communication supervisors met to discuss upcoming plans for the year 2016. They discussed policies and procedures, and briefed major calls for service that occurred within the month of November.



The communication supervisors attended a meeting with the Chief of the Horizon Fire Department to discuss structure fire calls and the terminology needed for our communication reports. The Communications Coordinator attended the ESD2 District meeting to provide the monthly report. The Communications Coordinator and Police Chief attended a Regional Agency Board Meeting along with other El Paso County 911 agencies. The Communications Coordinator participated in the Citizen's Academy instructing a class on the topic of Communications.

The communications division is now able to listen and patch with the El Paso Fire Department channels for situations when ESD1 and ESD2 need assistance. The division also upgraded versions for the NCIC/TCIC equipment used on a daily basis. The communications coordinator attended an NCIC/TCIC course provided by Officer J. Monicvaiz to learn how to teach the class to become an instructor for future classes.

COMMUNITY POLICING

Citizen's Police Academy

The Citizen Police Academy Class III commenced on October 26th. The class consists of an eight week curriculum which includes tours, equipment demos, and presentations by officers and personnel who specialize in their respective fields such as communications, investigations, traffic enforcement as well as an introduction to less than lethal weapons. The class is scheduled to conduct a graduation ceremony for participants on December 14th.

Career Day Presentation

Sgt. Mitre conducted career day presentations at Desert Hills Elementary School on November 18, 2015. Sgt. Mitre met with approximately 120 elementary school students. Children received giveaway items promoting prudent use of 9-1-1 emergency communications, and a metallic police badge sticker.

Shopper Safety Awareness

The Horizon City Police Department released shopper safety/ security awareness material via social media and to local businesses. The HCPD also re-released the video produced promoting the same concept last Christmas shopping season. In the video, a car thief brags about how easily he obtained valuables which were left in an unsecured vehicle, in the same poetic meter as "A Visit from St. Nicholas".

CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION (CID)

In November Detective Labrado conducted 2 child safety seat installation seminars. In November detectives investigated a motor vehicle theft assigned from the patrol division. HCPD Officers responded to a vehicle theft call in Horizon City. The reporting party stated her car was stolen from her driveway of her residence without her effective consent. The vehicle was placed into TCIC/NCIC by the responding officers. Detectives were contacted a few days later by EPPD stating they had located the vehicle the date it was reported stolen. EPPD officers advised the vehicle had been involved in a motor vehicle accident and abandoned at the scene of the incident in El Paso. EPPD officers advised they had contacted reporting party and she provided them with a statement that she was the driver of the vehicle at the time of the incident and had fled the scene on foot. Based on the information received from EPPD, Detectives worked up charges against her for filing a false report to a police officer. The case is currently being reviewed by the El Paso County District Attorney's Office.

Other cases received during the month of November were thefts, harassment, sexual assaults, burglary of vehicles, and fraud. Detective B. Campbell and Detective Labrado attended the JOIC and HIDTA meetings on a weekly basis.

EMPLOYEE TRAINING

Personal Development (16 Hours) :Course covers lessons in personal change. This course focuses on being proactive, personal leadership and management, paradigms of interdependence, emphatic listening skills, synergistic success, and wellness with the law enforcement viewpoint. Attended by M. Rico, L. Medina, J. Mitre

Arrest Search and Seizures Intermediate: (16 Hours) : Required course, officers will be able to explain the various circumstances when authorized by law to arrest a person. The course will additionally provide the student with the skills to describe and explain suspicious activity and probable cause, search warrant requirements, and among other topics dealing with arrest search and seizure. Active Shooter (16 Hours): Students will be able to define the term active shooter and will be able to discuss the history of active shooter incidents, and recent trends. It will cover the responsibility in handling these incidents as a true first responder, including proper questioning and instructions to give during an Active Shooter incident. Att. By Off. R. Jacobo, G. Rosas

Effective Leadership (8 Hours): Help the student become a better effective leader. The workshop is designed for telecommunicators through executive management. Att. By A. Chairez, E. Ramos

TCIC /NCIC (16 Hours): HCPD hosted required training for Officers and dispatchers. Other agencies were invited to attend.
