

### ITEMS OF INTEREST


- On June 19, 2018, the Horizon City Police Department received the award of “Recognized Law Enforcement Agency” from the Texas Police Chiefs Association Law Enforcement Recognition Program. The Recognition Program begun in 2006. The program evaluates a Police Department’s compliance with over 166 Best Business Practices for Texas Law Enforcement. These Best Practices were carefully developed by Texas Law Enforcement professionals to assist agencies in the efficient and effective delivery of service and the protection of individual’s rights. These Best Practices cover all aspects of law enforcement operations including use of force, protection of citizen rights, vehicle pursuits, property and evidence management, and patrol and investigative operations.
- Facilitated continuing planning meetings concerning the 30-Year Anniversary Celebration Event. The total dollars raised by local stakeholders was \$21,700.
- Chief McConnell attended a severe weather workgroup meeting at the El Paso County Emergency Operations Center.


## Police Dispatched Calls




## All Fire Dispatched Calls

### COMMUNICATIONS DIVISION

#### *Together as One*

Nearly all telecommunicators attended The Power of Resilience: How to Beat Dispatcher Burnout Course held at the El Paso Regional Communications Center. The course offered tools and strategies to beat the feelings of burnout that can affect telecommunicators. The course also highlighted the importance of resilience at both the personal and organizational level. The second and third shift supervisor attended the Communications Training Officer course. The course covered the necessary tools and guidelines that are needed when training a new hire. The communications morning supervisor attended the Emergency Operations Center meeting at the El Paso Regional Communications Center. The meeting covered major weather related events that affect the city and county areas.

The West Valley Fire Department responded to a motor vehicle accident involving two semi-trucks and one SUV. Two adults and one child were trapped inside the vehicle. Three patients were transported to the hospital by Life Ambulance. The West Valley Fire Department responded to a vehicle on fire across the Federal Correctional Institution, La Tuna. The vehicle was unoccupied and pulled over to the side of the road. The fire was extinguished within minutes of the fire department arrival. The Anthony Police Department and West Valley Fire cleared the scene approximately one hour later.


The West Valley Fire Department responded to a vehicle fire in Anthony Texas. Upon arrival, units found a pickup truck and an RV fully engulfed. In addition, two propane tanks exploded. The travel center was evacuated. The fire was extinguished within twenty minutes and the travel center was partially reopened to the public.

Socorro and Clint Fire Departments responded to a semi-trailer on fire on I-10 east Clint ramp exit. A second incident was reported at the same location regarding a motor vehicle accident involving two vehicles with injuries. I-10 east and westbound lanes were closed by the Socorro Police Department and State Troopers. The incidents lasted approximately eight hours.


Horizon, Socorro, and Clint Fire Departments responded to a structure fire in Horizon City. Upon arrival, the fire department advised the fire was located in the attic. The El Paso Sheriff's Office, El Paso Electric, Life Ambulance, American Red Cross, and a Fire Marshal responded to the incident as well. The fire was extinguished in approximately 90 minutes with major damage to the structure.

### **WARRANTS DIVISION & FLEET OPERATIONS**

The Warrants Officer received twenty-one summons for service. All summons were executed. During the month of June, six people were arrested for traffic warrants. Collections were made on traffic warrants and those unable to post bond, were booked into the El Paso County Jail. The Warrants Officer reviewed seven Child Protective Services cases. The cases were reviewed and closed, or filed with the corresponding case due to allegations of neglect. The Warrants Officer took five vehicles to the shop for oil changes and repairs. Bailiff duties were conducted during court proceedings.

### **CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIONS/EVIDENCE**

During the month of June, Detective Nunez and Detective Labrado investigated cases ranging from runaways to criminal mischief. Detective Nunez was assigned to investigate a sexual assault that occurred two years ago. An investigation was conducted. It was determined during the forensic interview the incident occurred out of state. The case was forwarded to proper authorities. The case load for CID included child in need of supervision, burglary of habitation, and an unattended death that was closed out as natural medical reasons. Lieutenant Ortega attended monthly meetings with the JOIC, STARS, Gang, and SHOCAP. Lieutenant Ortega and Detective Labrado assisted Sergeant Mitre with a car seat giveaway working in partnership with the Horizon City Walmart.

### **FORENSICS UNIT**

The evidence technician conducted four open record requests for video from the officer's body cameras. The District Attorney's Office submitted seven requests for videos from cases ranging from DWI to assaults. Ten items of evidence were submitted to the Texas Department of Public Safety for drug analysis. The evidence technician processed an unattended death.

### **CRIME PREVENTION ACTIVITIES**

#### **Child Safety Seat Event**

Several officers of the Horizon City Police Department participated in child safety seat event held at Wal-Mart for the Horizon City community. The event was hosted by the Texas Department of Transportation and the Safe Riders program. Approximately 21 child passenger safety seats were distributed to area parents who attended the event. The purpose of the event is to educate parents on the proper installation and use of the child safety seat. The process begins with an inspection of the existing car seat (if any) and issuing a replacement accordingly.

### Explorer Program

Enrollment and participants of the Explorer Program remained stable throughout the month of June with approximately 12 members in the Junior Explorer group and 10 members in the primary program. The junior explorers are children who are enrolled in 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Other members are 13 – 21 years of age and attend high school, early college programs, or college and university programs.
