Horizon City Police Department Monthly Report

This report is designed to provide statistical information illustrating the Horizon Police Department's operations and administrative functions. The statistical information reported will provide staff with guidance for operational planning, workload assessment and statistically compare our productivity to the previous year. It serves to make necessary adjustments in policies and procedures to meet state and national standards for accreditation.

Demographics

The Horizon City Police Department is comprised of 30 officers and 20 communication specialists. The Police Department are entrusted to patrol approximately 8.5 square miles and provide public safety services for approximately 22,000 residents. Our Communications Division is charged with providing emergency phone and dispatch services to the Police Department and approximately 170,000 residents for Fire and Emergency Services under Emergency Management District #1 and Emergency Management District #2.

Staffing

The Chief of Police oversees the Assistant Chief and the Communications Manager. The Assistant Chief of Police oversees the 2 Lieutenants and oversees the Detectives and other investigative personnel. The Patrol Lieutenants oversee the Patrol Sergeants. The Communications Shift Supervisors report to the Communications Manager. The Department consists of primarily Four operational divisions.

- Communications Division overseen by the Communications Manager





Patrol Division

The Patrol Division is commanded by Lieutenant Jesus Ortega for night shift and Lieutenant Kaycee Valdez for day shift. It is comprised of 2 Lieutenants, 3 Sergeants, 3 Corporals and 12 Patrol Officers. They operate 24 hours a day 7 days a week on rotating shifts. The shifts rotate every 56 days while days off rotate every 28 days.




Month to Month Comparison



Sex Offender Registration and Tracking

Sierra continues to be to attend SORT every Monday every two weeks to assist El Paso County Sheriff's Office with the entering of new sex offender registrants or to update any information sex offenders report. Every Monday, officers working at SORT can expect to assist approximately 25 to 30 sex offenders from the El Paso Multi Use Facility. Officers register new sex offenders as they have been recently released from prison, or they register those sex offenders that have moved from out of jurisdiction. Officers are also in charge to deregister sex offenders when they advise they are moving to a different city. The goal is to keep track of every convicted individual to be aware of their whereabouts and keep them from reoffending no matter where they are at.



IDEA Explorer Presentation

On Tuesday, June 13th, 2023, both Community Relations Officers, H. Sierra and V. Hernandez, attended IDEA School and met with approximately eight classrooms to speak about the Explorer Program that Horizon City Police Department offers. Officer H. Sierra reached out to IDEA School to see if both CRO's could speak to their seventh and eighth graders who are approximately in between the ages of 12 to 14 years of age.
