PENTECOST

June 9th is Pentecost Sunday! Pentecost is a key moment in the history of the Christian faith. Pentecost (a reference to the 50 days that have passed since Easter) is a peculiar event that took place after Jesus' ascent into heaven. It's described in the second chapter of the New Testament book of Acts. Here's the key part of the account: When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. Utterly amazed, they asked: "Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!" Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, "What does this mean?" On the surface, the Pentecost story is interesting but doesn't seem especially significant. Pentecost is important because Christians understand it to be the long-awaited fulfillment of prophecy. In other words, Pentecost was important enough to have been predicted hundreds of years in advance. In the Pentecost story linked above, the disciple Peter reminds his audience of the Old Testament prophecy that was being fulfilled right in front of them: That prophecy can be found in Joel 2:28-32, and had been made many hundreds of years earlier. But the arrival of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost had also been predicted much more recently by Jesus himself. Just before his ascension, Jesus told his disciples that the Holy Spirit would empower them to preach to the nations of the world: "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." You might be thinking, why is Pentecost so important?" It's important because it infused the small community of Jesusfollowers with the core mission that would define the Christian church to share the message of Jesus Christ with the entire world. Consider that in the weeks following Christ's death and resurrection, many of his followers were undoubtedly still processing the incredible events they had witnessed and were probably wondering what God wanted them to do now that Jesus had carried out his mission. On Pentecost, God made it clear what Christfollowers should do with the news of Jesus Christ: share it with others. And not just with the Jewish communities in which they lived; the multi-linguistic nature of this miracle made it plain that the Gospel message was not confined to one community, nation, ethnicity, or language. Pentecost is when the Christian church received, and was empowered to carry out, its grand assignment of evangelism. For this reason, Pentecost is sometimes referred to as the "birthday of the Christian church." The mission given to Christians on Pentecost still stands, thousands of years later. We are to share the saving message of Jesus Christ with the world and as we do so, we should rely on the presence of the Holy Spirit, who empowered the early church to share the gospel, and continues to do so today.

Anthems for June



June 2ND ~ Seventh Sunday in Easter ~ Acsension

"Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates" by Healey Willan

English/Canadian organist and composer Healey Willan is best known for his religious music, which comprises the majority of his compositional output of some 800 works. His musical style often hearkens back to earlier periods of music history. For example, "Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates" takes on a likeness to some chorale settings of Bach.

June 9TH ~ Pentecost

"If Ye Love Me" by Thomas Tallis

Thomas Tallis, teacher of the Renaissance master William Byrd, managed to successfully deflect the violence that claimed British Catholics and Protestants alike during his lifetime. A consummate churchman, he was memorialized in music of William Byrd and in the liturgical calendar of the Episcopal Church. "If Ye Love Me" is perhaps his most beloved anthem, written specifically for Pentecost. Though nothing remains of his burial site, a brass plate with the following engraving is said to have survived: "As he dyd lyve, so also did he dy, / In myld and quyet sort (O happy man!) / To God ful oft for mercy did he cry, / Wherefore he lyves, let deth do what he can."

June 16TH ~ Trinity Sunday

"I Bind Unto Myself" Traditional Irish

One of early Christianity's oldest surviving hymns, the text to "I Bind Unto Myself" has been considered to have been penned by Saint Patrick (5th century). However, recent scholarship has shown the lyrics may have originated a few hundred years later in the 8th century. The music is assumed to be in the style of a druidic chant for protection on a journey.

June 23RD ~ Second Sunday after Pentecost

"Ave Verum Corpus" by Byrd

"Ave verum corpus" is a short Eucharistic chant that has also been set to music by various composers. It dates from the 14th century and has been attributed to Pope Innocent VI. During the Middle Ages it was sung at the elevation of the sacramental bread during the consecration. It was also used frequently during Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. The poem is a meditation on the Catholic belief in Jesus's real presence in the sacrament of the Eucharist, and ties it to the Catholic conception of the redemptive meaning of suffering in the life of all believers.

June 30TH ~ Third Sunday after Pentecost ~ Independence Sunday

"An American Hymn" arr. Effinger

A perennial favorite at Court Street, "An American Hymn" ("O beautiful, for spacious skies," better known as "America!") is one of Effinger's most appealing choral works. Arranged in 1967 as a setting of "America the Beautiful" for mixed chorus and brass or organ. In a sense this is a traditional "hymn-anthem," but Effinger's expanded harmonic resources and skillful instrumental and choral writing put "An American Hymn" well above the average patriotic arrangement.
