### A Christmas Reflection

*“Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and always.”* With God there is no such thing as time. All of time is totally present to him right now. God’s work among us is always in process, it never comes to an end. In God’s eyes, Christmas is an everyday event that involves Jesus knocking on the door of my heart, seeking admission. The God-dimension never changes, the offer is always there. The good news is delivered with greater consistency than the morning newspaper. What happens after that is totally dependent on whether I accept the offer, open the door, and make my heart available as a manger. One important point: when the shepherds heard the message they said, *“Let us go to Bethlehem and see it for ourselves.”* The life of the Christian is a journey of discovery. It involves coming to find out for myself the truth and the reality of what I had been told by my parents, teachers, or preachers in church. I have to cross that bridge. The gospel is in between two phrases. At the beginning, we are invited to *“Come and see,”* and, at the end, we are instructed to *“Go and tell.”* Many of the early church fathers have written hymns and homilies in praise of the Incarnation. John the Monk, an 8th century writer, in his Hymn of the Nativity, sings of the great exchange in the mystery and wonder of the Incarnation, God becoming man in order to bring man to heaven. Heaven and earth are united on Christmas day, for Christ is born! God has come upon earth, and humankind has gone up to heaven. For the sake of humankind, the invisible one is seen in the flesh. Therefore let us glorify him and cry aloud: *“glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace bestowed by your coming, Savior, glory to you!”* In Bethlehem, I hear the angels: *“glory to God in the highest!”* Glory to him whose good pleasure it was that there be peace on earth! Light has shone on those in darkness, exalting the lowly who sing like the angels: *“Glory to God in the highest!”* Beholding him, Adam, who was in God’s image and likeness fallen through transgression, Jesus bowed the heavens and came down, without change taking up his dwelling in a virgin womb, that he might refashion Adam fallen in corruption, and crying out: *“Glory to your epiphany, my Savior and my God!”*

## Anthems for December



### December 5<sup>th</sup> ~ Second Sunday of Advent

#### **"Of the Father's Love Begotten"** arr. Matthew Lundquist

A classic from the Concordia Church Choir Series, arranged by Matthew N. Lundquist. "**Of the Father's heart begotten**" alternatively known as "**Of the Father's love begotten**" is a doctrinal hymn based on the Latin poem "Corde natus" by the Roman poet Aurelius Prudentius, from his *Liber Cathemerinon* (hymn no. IX). The ancient poem was translated and paired with a medieval plainchant melody "Divinum mysterium. An early version of this chant appears in manuscript form as early as the 10th century, although without the melodic additions, and "trope" versions with various melodic differences appear in Italian, German, Gallacian, Bohemian and Spanish manuscripts dating from the 13th to 16th centuries.

#### **"Build My Life"** arr. Brett Younker

Build My Life is based on **1st Corinthians 3:11** *For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ....* This song is all about the foundation that we build our lives upon, and there is no greater foundation than Jesus Christ. #### **"Good Christian Friends, Rejoice"** arr. by Zabel

Some controversy stems from Neale's original first line of the carol, "Good Christian men, rejoice." Today's standards for inclusive language in reference to humanity result in the change of this line in most hymnals published in the last 20 years. Interestingly enough, the original Latin does not refer to "men" or people at all. The second unusual feature about this carol is the atypical change in meter that takes in its early part: "News, news!" As it turns out, this interjection is the result of an error. According to Carlton Young, Thomas Helmore, serving as the music editor for the volume, "incorrectly transcribed the tune from the old notation and added two notes after each third phrase. To accommodate the change in meter Neale added 'News, news,' 'Joy, joy,' and 'Peace, peace.'" In *The UM Hymnal*, "News, news!" has been maintained for each stanza. All this said, the message of the carol is clear and may be found in the last line of each stanza: "Christ is born today!" "Christ is born for this!" Christ was born to save!"

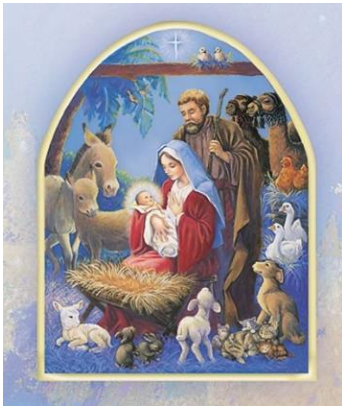

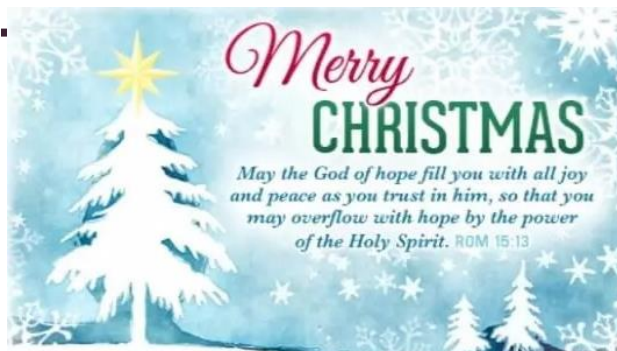
