Lenten Reflection, Spring Cleaning

Each household has its own set of routine chores that needs to get done. Vacuuming, sweeping, making the beds, doing the laundry, and so on. However, many families will set aside a time for a deeper and more thorough cleaning of the home. Spring cleaning. Spring cleaning is a time to undertake the chores that we don't make time for on a day-to-day basis. Lent is the spring cleaning of our interior lives. In its eternal wisdom, the Church calendar gives us a yearly preparatory time to take a richer and more holistic examination of the entire universe that is within us. Each of us has wounds that stretch down deep inside of us; painful experiences, insecurities, fears, jealousies, and many other things that keep us from the eternal joy of God's Kingdom. These things can debilitate us, rendering us unable to be as joyful, as loving, and as compassionate as the Lord calls us to be. We make poor decisions, we find it harder to love those that hate us, we stress out and have anxiety, and we miss out on the glory of the Kingdom. How much time do we spend worrying about the external world? How much do we care about nurturing social images and external appearances? Unfortunately, our obsession never strikes us as being abnormal because all around us people are doing the exact same thing. While we keep busy trying to manipulate everything going on around us and spend so much energy on our "outer garments", we completely neglect the temple made in God's image, that is divinely placed within us. "The Kingdom of God is within," the Lord tells us in Luke 17:21. Ask almost any Christian what the goal of the Christian life is, and they will almost certainly say, "heaven." If Christ, our Lord, and our God, says that the Kingdom is within us, why don't we go there? We are scared. There are thoughts we don't understand, feelings we cannot articulate, and an entire universe that we do not know how to navigate. When those things are brought to the surface, we mistakenly think that our problems are outside of us. We blame other people and lash out at them, we spread gossip, and we try to change everything outside of us without ever considering that maybe the problem lies within. Lent is our time to reorient ourselves and to remember that there is quite possibly more work to be done inside of us than there is to be done outside of us. Without the internal work of Lent, we will be unable to love perfectly. If we are unable to love perfectly, then nothing else matters. So, we must dig deep, and begin the journey within. How do we do this? 2,000 years of spiritual literature covers this topic. Read and study your Bible. Make time for silent prayer and reflection as an integral part of our spiritual practice. Turn off the TV, close Snapchat, and Instagram, and simply take time to be still. The Psalms tell us to "be still and know that I am God." Just as a family takes the time to clean their home more thoroughly, we as Christians take Lent as a time to be more intentional in our spiritual practice, so that we might find deeper healing for our infirmities. May this Lent be our spiritual enlightenment. May we answer the Church's call to dig deeper within ourselves. May we seek the everlasting Kingdom of God within ourselves.

Appreciation for Music in Sunday School



Did you know that using a piano for singing hymns in Sunday School at Court Street was not always a reality? In the Court Street Courier, May 2006, church historian Lewis Averett wrote,

In 1890, there was a minor crisis in the church with the question of whether to use a piano for accompaniment in Sunday school. Nearly all in attendance at a meeting called to answer this question were reportedly in favor of using both piano and organ, but if they could not get both, preferred the piano. This question was referred to the Board of Stewards, who on April 6, 1890, reported that they had "no objection to using the piano in school but were not willing to do away with the organ and could not furnish means from the church to purchase a piano." At that point, advocates of the piano began a fundraising campaign, and on October 26, this committee had raised \$425.00 for the purchase of a piano.

Today the Adult Sunday School Class is especially grateful for the privilege of piano accompaniment; for the piano, given by Dee and Ray Booth; to Kristian Jackson and others who play; and to Richard Chaffin, teacher, who carefully selects hymns to enhance the Bible study.

LIYA MUSIC CAMP AT COURT STREET




