## HOW DO INDIVIDUAL PLAYERS CAPTURE MATCH RESULTS TO-WARDS THEIR DUPR?

You can enter individual matches if you are playing anywhere, anytime, any day.

How to enter scores into DUPR as an individual player:

- 1. Open the DUPR app on your phone or go to the DUPR website and log in to your account.
- 2. Select "Add a Match" in the upper left-hand corner of the screen.
- 3. Enter the location of the match. You can start typing the city name, and a dropdown box will appear for you to select the correct location.
- 4. Choose the "Score Format" by tapping on the drop-down menu. For example, select "1 game to 11" if that's how you played.
- 5. Select the match type, such as "Doubles".
- 6. Your name will automatically appear in the first player box. To add your partner and opponents, tap on "Add Player" and search for them by name.
- 7. Enter the final score of the match.
- 8. Submit the match results.



9. All players involved in the match will need to validate the submitted scores for them to count towards your DUPR rating.

# **SCORE VALIDATION**

To validate scores if you are not the one entering the scores, here's how the validation process works:

- 1. After a match, one player (typically from the winning team) enters the match details and scores into the DUPR app.
- 2. The other players involved in the match, particularly someone from the losing team, need to validate the score.
- 3. To validate a score, players log into their own DUPR account, either through the app or website.
- 4. Once logged in, they scroll down to their recent matches and look for the match that needs validation.
- 5. They then select the "Validate" button for that specific match.
- 6. The match is not considered officially recorded until it has been validated by at least one player from the opposing team.

It's important to note that currently, matches do not automatically validate after a certain time. They remain pending until someone from the opposing team takes action to validate the score. DUPR is considering ways to improve this process, such as pre-registering matches to make score entry and validation easier.

Remember these important points:

- You should always ask your opponents if it's okay to submit the match to DUPR before playing.
- Some players may decline to verify scores, especially if they lose.
- Self-posted recreational matches do count towards your DUPR rating, but they carry less weight than club or tournament matches.
- Consistently entering scores from various partners and opponents will help improve your rating's reliability.

By regularly entering your match results, you'll contribute to a more accurate DUPR rating that reflects your current skill level.
