

House and Ground Rules

Classes of Membership

GENERAL

1. Membership is open to only adult persons. No membership will be sold to a business or a corporation.
2. All persons applying for a membership are requested to contact the club secretary.
3. Any damage caused by any member shall be repaired and billed to the member's account.

REGULAR MEMBERSHIP:

1. A regular membership entitles the member, spouse, unmarried minor children, and unmarried adult children in college to all club privileges based on individual dues. (See below)
2. A regular membership certificate may be purchased from the club for \$750 + tax
3. A regular membership may be sold or transferred only through the club. Members who wish to sell their membership are responsible for their dues until the membership is sold.
4. A transfer fee of \$100 will be charged by the club to the transferee of a membership certificate.

Dues and Accounts

GENERAL

There are two types of membership based on dues:

Social memberships shall have the full use of the club house and swimming pool.

Resident members - \$158 Non-Resident members - \$140.92

Full memberships shall have full use of all the facilities of the club.

Resident members - \$215.64 Non-Resident members- \$140.92

DELINQUENT DUES AND CLUB CHARGES:

All membership dues shall be payable in advance. If a member fails to pay his dues or other charges for the prior month, by the 20th day of the month, the secretary or manager of the club shall notify the member of such default. If the member fails to pay such dues or other charges by the 15th day of the following month, then his membership, and all of the rights and privileges incident thereto, shall thereupon become suspended without any action on the part of the club. Any member who is in arrears after 60 days from the date of billing in an amount of \$500 or more is automatically suspended from use of the club. The member will be so notified. If payment is not made in thirty days, the membership will be forfeited and cancelled. After a membership is forfeited, the former members are still responsible for all charges to his account.

A list of all members whose dues or charges are delinquent for a period of 60 days from date of billing shall be posted in the club house.

19th Hole Bar

No one under the age of 21 is permitted in the 19th Hole. No mixed beverages served until Bartender is on duty. Beer will be sold through the Pro Shop on a serve-yourself basis until bartender comes on duty. In compliance with the Texas Alcohol Beverage Commission, no alcoholic beverages shall be brought on or taken off the club premises by a member or guest. Anyone who brings alcoholic beverages onto the club premises will be suspended from all club facilities for one month.

Guests

1. A member has the privilege of inviting guests at all times, except as otherwise herein provided. The guest must be accompanied by the member or authorized in advance by a member.
2. Members who invite local guests to parties may pay double the price charged to members.

Club Rentals

1. Club facilities may be rented only by members.
2. Rental of club facilities by organizations may be secured by request and under the sponsorship of an active member. An application form must be signed by the head of the organization and the sponsoring member. The sponsor must be present at the function and must accept responsibility for the rental charge and any damage to the club property.
3. A club member whose daughter or son is to be married, may rent club facilities for the use of the non-member family of the bridegroom or bride.
4. Request to rent the club facilities must be made in advance through the club manager and previously scheduled club activities shall have preference over requested rentals.
5. A fee shall be charged for rental of the club facilities based upon the portion of the facilities rented.
6. An additional clean-up fee shall be assessed as deemed appropriate by the manager.
7. Furnishings and equipment shall not be rented or loaned to the club members for use off the premises.

Golf Course

The golf course may be rented for private tournaments, at such times as may be deemed appropriate by the Board of Directors.

Swimming Pool

The swimming pool may be rented for private parties only during club hours, and at such hours when the life guard is not on duty. A rental fee of \$35.00 shall be charged for the use of the pool for a 3 hour period.

Ballroom and Dining Room

The ballroom and dining area shall be available for rental for private parties during regular club hours only. All food served must be prepared and served by the club's kitchen staff, or arrangements made for such service through the Restaurant Manager and billed to the member on the appropriate monthly statement. Decoration of the club house shall be confined to such rules as the Entertainment Committee may adopt. All doors and windows shall be kept closed during all parties. Either the main dining room or private dining room shall remain available to serve the general membership at all times except during club parties.

19th Hole and Game Room

The 19th Hole cannot be rented for private parties.

SWIMMING POOL:

1. The swimming pool shall be open from Memorial Day to Labor Day of each year.
2. The life guard will be on duty from 12:00 noon to 7:00 p.m., Tuesday through Saturday, and Sunday, from 1:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Club members or club member's children may not be employed as life guards.
3. Children under 10 years old and younger, and all children who do not swim, must be accompanied by and under the constant supervision of a parent.
4. Each member may bring out-of-town guests for a fee of \$2.00. One in town guest per family per day for a fee of \$2.00.
5. No one shall be allowed in the club house (other than locker rooms and rest rooms) in wet swimming attire. No one shall be allowed on the putting green, golf course, restaurant, bar, tennis court, or driving range in swimming attire.
6. Adult members who wish to swim when the life guard is off-duty may do so at their own risks; however, minors (Anyone under 18 years of age) must be accompanied by and under the constant supervision of one or both parents.
7. Boisterous conduct will not be permitted. Any violation of the following rules or failure to follow instructions of the life guard may result in the withdrawal of pool privileges for such periods as may be deemed appropriate by the club manager.
 - ..a. There will be no running around the pool walks or porch.

- ..b. NO more than one person on the diving board at a time.
 - ..c. Do not push or throw others into the pool.
 - ..d. No bottled drinks or glasses permitted around the pool area. Paper cups will be provided.
 - ..e. There will be no abuse or misuse of the pool furniture or loungers.
- (Any person may appeal the suspension of pool privileges for an infraction of the pool rules to the Board of Directors.)

Minors

The supervision and entertainment of children is not the responsibility of the club manager or staff. Parents of minors or sponsors of any group of minors using the club facilities will be responsible for proper chaperonage and shall be liable for any and all damage caused by such minors.

Tennis

1. One set limit not to exceed 1 1/2 hours if players are waiting.
2. Tennis attire required. (No bathing suits, jogging shoes, or cleats.)
3. All tennis players must register at the Pro Shop when playing during club hours.
4. The last player to leave the course at night will cut off the tennis court lights. Failure to do so will result in a \$20 charge.
5. Members who do not pay for full membership will pay \$3 each time the court is used. Non-members fee is \$4.00
6. For maintenance purposes, no tennis may be played from 8:00 to 3:00 on Monday.

Racquetball

1. All players must register at the Pro Shop before playing.
2. Doors to the racquetball area will remain locked at all times. Players and observers must check out a key from the Pro Shop or Bartender to obtain admittance.
3. Playing time may not exceed 1 hour when others are waiting.
4. Shoes must be gym or tennis shoes not worn on the street or into the club house.
5. The last player to leave the course will turn off the court lights. Failure to do so will result in a \$10 charge.
6. Members who do not pay for a racquetball or full membership will pay \$3.00 each playing period. Non-member fee is \$4.00

Golf Course

1. No more than six players in one group at any time.
2. From March 31st to October 31st, groups of less than 3 players or more than 6 players may not tee off between the hours of 11:00a.m. and 2:00p.m. on weekends or holidays.
3. No one shall be on the putting green, except to practice.
4. No practice is allowed on any green other than the putting green.
5. All golf carts must be operated to conform to cart control markings. No more than two players to each cart.
6. No one under 18 years of age shall be permitted to rent or drive a cart, unless they have a valid driver's license.
7. Players will not be permitted to play in bathing suits or tank tops.
8. No boots or ripple-sole shoes permitted on greens.
9. Please repair all ball marks on greens.
10. Always rake sand traps before leaving them.
11. No one is permitted to start on #7 tees if players on #6 are in sight, without the Pro Shop consent.
12. NO one is permitted to cut in front of players on any hole unless they are out of range and will not delay any players.
13. From March 31st to October 31st, no one high school and under is permitted to start between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on weekends and holidays, unless accompanied by a parent or adult.
14. Children 13 years of age and older may play Tuesday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon, without an adult.
15. The following fees shall be charged for golf play:
 - ..a. Green Fee Non-member:
 - Tuesday-Thursday: \$25.00 for 18 holes ** \$12.50 for 9 holes
 - Friday, Saturday/Sunday: \$40.00 for 18 holes ** \$25.00 for 9 holes
 - N/C for full or golf memberships.
 - ..b. Cart Fee:
 - Member - \$10.00 for 18 holes
 - Non-Member - \$15.00 for 18 holes
 - ..c. Locker Fees:
 - Men's locker room \$5.00 per month + tax
 - Women's locker room \$1.00 per month + tax
 - Outside bag storage: \$1.00 per month + tax
 - Electric bag storage: \$5.00 per month + tax

Alcoholic Beverages Policy

The Graham Country Club will comply with all Texas liquor laws. Violations of these Liquor laws shall not be acceptable and could result in possible suspension of membership at the discretion of the Board of Directors. The following outline of rules is club policy.

1. No alcoholic beverages shall be sold or served to minors.
2. Members or guests shall not be permitted to bring alcoholic beverages of any kind on the premises. Moreover, state law also prohibits the taking of alcohol beverages off the club premises.
3. No alcoholic beverages of any kind shall be sold, served, or provided to any member, guest, or person who at the time appears to be obviously intoxicated to the extent that he or she presents a clear danger to himself or herself or others.
4. Members or guests shall not give or otherwise provide alcoholic beverages of any kind to employees of the club.
5. The club shall not favor or encourage the consumption of alcoholic beverages over the consumption of non-alcoholic beverages, but shall offer or promote both types in a similar fashion.
6. The club shall arrange and provide, at its own expense (Although it may later request reimbursement) alternative transportation of any member, guest, or other person to whom alcoholic beverage service has not been so halted is driving or otherwise furnishing alternative transportation.
7. The club manager shall be responsible through means which he considers appropriate for instructing bartender, waiters, and waitresses in making initial determination of the obvious intoxication of an individual in accordance with this policy. When such determination has been made, the staff person shall communicate with the manager on duty. If possible, the manager shall personally observe the individual concerned. The manager shall then make the decision to cease or not to cease service to such person. He shall communicate a decision to cease service in a diplomatic manner to the individual concerned if he or she is a member, or if a guest, to the host member who shall be responsible in turn for advising his or her guest. It shall be the policy of the club that members not reprimand or abuse staff under circumstances where the staff's judgement indicates alcohol service to an individual should cease. It shall be the club's policy to support the staff in the implementation of its policy on alcohol service.
8. Any disciplinary action growing out of violation of the club's policy on alcohol service shall be at the discretion of the Board of Directors.

Appropriate alcohol service is a matter of interest to all members of the club who share mutual desire that such service be consistent, not only with proper decorum, but also with the law. Therefore, this policy has been established by the Board in a desire to benefit members, their guests, and staff, and to bring into focus their respective responsibilities on the matter.
