

#### The Invisible Priest

A comment reported on the Portland, Maine TV station, Channel 6:

"We could take a cue from Orthodoxy, whose priests stand with their backs to their congregation, leading a liturgy that is neither clever nor impassioned, but simply beautiful, like stone smoothed by centuries of rhythmic tides. It's an austere ritual, in the sense of - there's nothing new here; it is sublime, in the sense of creating a clearer view into heaven. The priest can be any priest. Who he is, what he looks like, how he speaks, and what he thinks matter little. He hasn't written the service that he officiates. It isn't about him or his prowess. He's an interchangeable functionary, draped in brocaded robes, obscured by incense, and as such, never points to himself, a flawed human, pointing ever and only to the Perfection of the Mysterious Divine. That is the role of every priest or preacher invisibility, while making God seen."

# Vacation Planning – Make a List

- Location of Orthodox Churches to attend on the Gunday(s) you are away.
- Give some thought to visiting Orthodox Churches or Monasteries on vacation.
   They may be on the way to where you are going.
- If you are prepared to receive the Holy Mysteries in a church you are visiting, communicate with the priest of the church before the Sunday you are there. It is considered improper to just come to the chalice, without the priest knowing you in advance, who you are, what parish you belong to and when you last went to confession.
- On vacation, God is still with you; we should be sure we are still with Him as exemplified in our conduct, speech and sense of purpose.
- Pack an icon, prayer book and Bible.
- Fasting days: SS Peter & Paul (June 20-29) & Dormition (August 1-14) are observed even on vacation.
- Remember your parish offering while you're gone!
