Jake and I started right away to figure out the best way to make it happen. We connect with our missionary friend, Megan Mowdy who has adopted this young lady in her heart as a daughter. Short story, the insulin pump makes it to the Dominican. Megan shares with us how this young girl's doctor knows all about this type of pump and that t will necessary for both of them to do some training and then she can set them up to use the pump.

Last week, as I opened Facebook, Megan posted a picture of this young girl helping with a medical team that had just arrived to serve the people of the DR. I zoomed in on the picture, curious as to what was on the table and see that this young lady had the insulin pump on her hip!! Wow! I immediately texted my friend who has generously donated this pump and shared the picture with her. This is what I wrote:

"Oh friend, I can't contain the joy! I sure hope you can sense it. God is using us to affect lives across the world."

"Oh, Wow, Lord," my friend replies. "Thank you, Lord, for the opportunity to do this and for the random fluke that made it possible. Lord, you ARE in the tiniest of our daily life circumstances!!!!! Hallelujah!"

We're on the same page, 'random fluke'; an action or event leads to something, it causes that thing to happen or exist; 'tiniest details'.

So, it does relate to the mission work of both Food For Life and Raise the Roof.
