

HIGHLIGHTS JUNE-AUGUST

I. COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

 ABCD provided support for the Juneteenth Celebration, African American Festival, Football Hall of Fame Parade, Stark Country Minority Business Association and Metamor5sis.

II. COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Crystal Park Project

- Renovations are well undergoing to the former Rotunda Bank Branch soon to become ABCD's Administrative Headquarters.
- Financial plans are being finalized for the remainder of the project which will include: a vehicle storage and training center; 24 unit apt complex for the elderly with commercial space at the lower level and a restaurant.

III. HOUSING

- Liberty Lofts construction has started outside of Youngstown. This is a 42 family units complex for the elderly. Financial primarily by LIHTC and the Federal Home Bank AFP program.
- Closing should be within the next 30 days on Roberts station, a 50 unit complex for the elderly at 26th and Roberts and the Pointe at Walker Mill, a 50 unit complex for the Elderly in Boardman.
- Discussions are underway concerning ABCD selling its share of Massillon Homes II to East Akron neighborhood Development Corp. who also serves at the managers.

IV. TRANSPORTATION

- Hiring a communication specialist
- Received approval of \$80,000 to purchase a 16-passenger van with (2) wheelchair seats and \$96,531 in operating funds to assist with transportation of ADA.
- Canton workforce Transportation continues to expand.






50TH ANNIVERSARY



















Spotlight: Ashley Herring




