- MONTHLY MEETINGS We meet on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of most months (not in July or August). Live attendees will congregate at Channel Islands Yacht Club (CIYC, 4100 Harbor Blvd, Oxnard) on the downstairs covered patio with propane heaters and a bigscreen monitor. We usually bring in a dinner option from a local restaurant. RSVP for food using the Google Form Meeting invitation, which you should receive by email 5-7days before the meeting.
  - Thursday, March 10 6:30PM to 8:30PM, CIYC patio Live Meeting with Video Stream Only (No Zoom) - Onboard with Outboards - We will stream video(s) about Outboard Engine Operation and Maintenance, with hands-on demonstration using 3.5hp 2-stroke and 9.8hp, 4-stroke outboards.
  - Thursday, April 14 6:30PM to 8:30PM, CIYC Patio Hybrid (Live + Zoom) -Marlinespike: Knotwork for Art and Function - Marc Casebolt will share his 50yr interest in knot-tying and marlinespike seamanship. Although he never lived near the ocean nor learned to sail, at age 12, Marc discovered a copy of "The Ashley Book Of Knots" on his father's book shelf and was immediately hooked on the illustrations. He started tying some of the less intimidating knots and soon learned to tie more difficult knots. At 18, he got a real marlinespike, which he still uses today.

- Thursday, May 12 6:30PM to 8:30PM, CIYC Patio Live Meeting with Video Stream Only (No Zoom) - Docking Made Easy, presented by Cruising World and American Sailing Association - CIWSA Commodore Jane Thomas will stream a 30min program presented by America's Cup veteran Peter Isler with tips on docking under sail upwind and downwind as well as with a single engine and twin screws.

- DAYSAILS Sailors of all skills levels are welcome to attend our Keelboat Daysails, usually held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday each month, weather-permitting. We rely on our members and friends to volunteer their boats and their time for daysails, and we try to assure that each boat has a capable skipper and first mate before they leave the dock.

- CIWSA BOOK CLUB Director Lauren Copus will lead the Book Club Discussions via Zoom (Zoom link above) in April, June, and August. The following 3 nonfiction sailing stories have been selected for discussion:
  - Tuesday, April 5, 6:30PM to 8:00PM: <u>Flying Cloud</u> <u>The True Story of America's</u> <u>Most Famous Clipper Ship and the Woman Who Guided Her</u>. Written by David W. Shaw. In 1851, Eleanor Creesy served as the navigator on the maiden voyage of the clipper ship Flying Cloud. They sailed from New York to San Francisco in only 89 days and set a world record that went unbroken for more than a century. Illustrated with original maps and charts as well as historical photographs, Shaw's compelling narrative captures the drama of this maritime adventure. [Paperback ISBN 0-06-093478-6]
  - Tuesday, June 7, 6:30PM to 8:00PM: <u>A Sail of Two Idiots: 100+ Lessons and Laughs from a Non-Sailor Who Quit the Rat Race, Took the Helm, and Sailed to a New Life in the Caribbean</u>. Written by Renee Petrillo. "It was the best of dreams, it was the worst of dreams, it was an age of consulting the nautical experts, it was the age of landlubber foolishness, it was the epoch of determination, it was the epoch of despair, it was the season of hurricanes, it was a spring of beachcombing..." Renee and Michael had no boating experience when they started out on their cruising catamaran and learned everything the hard way. They managed to get from Miami to Grenada, eventually dropping anchor at the island of their dreams. - Tuesday, August 9 6:30-8:00: <u>Two Years Before The Mast, A Personal</u> <u>Narrative</u> Written by Richard H. Dana, Jr. This is Dana's memoir after a 2-year sea voyage from Boston to California on a merchant ship (1834-36). Living on the coast of California, this is especially a treat because he writes in great detail about the coastal cities of San Diego, Los Angeles (San Pedro), Capistrano Mission, (Dana Point), Santa Barbara, and San Francisco. - SAILING-RELATED TRAINING VIDEOS/WEBINARS I plan to stream a variety of videos and webinars on the big screen, live at CIYC (no Zoom). There is no charge for CIYC and CIWSA members, but donations will be accepted for CIWSA's Youth Sailing Scholarship Fund and/or the CIYC/CIWSA J24 & Laser Expense Fund. Refer to the current CIWSA calendar for multiple repeats of each session over the next few months. As more online courses become available, I will add them to the CIWSA Calendar.
  - Marine Weather University: Fundamentals Course & Wind Shifts CIYC Downstairs Patio (Live Attendance Only) - This 8-part online training program is presented by Chris Bedford, who is a meteorologist with over 35yrs experience, a pro sailor, and a marine weather consultant respected by the world's most accomplished sailors for his marine meteorology expertise.

Be prepared for a college-level introductory meteorology course. Each lesson builds on the last, so it's important to see them in sequence and multiple times! Additionally, we will stream a 2-part webinar about **Wind Shifts**; completion of the first 3 sessions of the *Fundamentals* course (above) is recommended before viewing.

- **ASA Intro to Marine Diesel** Each of the 2 parts is 2 hours long and will be streamed at CIYC.
