# Upcoming Activities On the Water

- OCIWSA DAYSAILS Our Keelboat Daysails are usually held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday each month, weather-permitting, and sailors of all skills levels are welcome to attend. We appreciate our members and friends who volunteer their boats and their time to host CIWSA daysails. We also try to assure that each boat has a capable skipper and first mate before they leave the dock. We welcome your candid feedback afterwards
  - 2nd Thursday Keelboat Daysails: Thursdays, September 8, October 13, November 10, and December 8, approximately 1:00pm 5:00pm, at the discretion of the daysail skippers and their crews. Note these dates coincide with our monthly CIWSA Get-Togethers in the evening at CIYC (see below).
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday Keelboat Daysails: Sundays, September 25, October 23, November 27, approximately 12:00pm - 4:00pm, at the discretion of the daysail skippers and their crews.

- SCYA Women's Boating Event (https://www.scya.events/womens-event/) Friday, September 16 Sunday, September 18, California Yacht Club, Marina del Rey Friday US Sailing, International Offshore, Safety at Sea Seminar; Saturday Coastal Piloting, Cruise to King Harbor, Lunch on a Mooring, Return; Sunday Wide Variety of Classroom and Dockside Workshops; and Great Meals & Opportunity to Network with and Learn from other Women Sailors
- Sailing between Channel Islands Harbor and Marina del Rey I am planning to sail my Tartan 10 WAILANI to and from Marina del Rey for 2 weekend events in September. We'll practice GPS navigation and maintaining a cruising log while underway.

Up to 6 guests are welcome to sail along and up to 3 guests may stay aboard while in MdR for one or both legs of either trip. Contact me directly if you're interested in sailing one or more of the legs.

- Thursday, September 15 & Monday, September 19 This trip is scheduled for WAILANI to participate in the SCYA Women's Boating Event (see above). The best times to travel will likely be mid-morning departure from Channel Islands to Marina del Rey on Thursday and early morning from Marina del Rey to Channel Islands on Monday, depending on weather and sea conditions. It's not a race, so we have the option to motorsail. If we leave early, travel time is approx 8hrs.
- Saturday, September 24 & Monday, September 26 This trip is scheduled for WAILANI to participate in the Channel Islands to Marina del Rey (CI2MdR) Race The starting line will be set northwest of Channel Islands Harbor's detached breakwater, and the first class will start at 11:00am. Boats will sail around Gina before heading to MdR to finish just outside the entrance (approx 45nm). Experienced racers are preferred crew for the race going down, but anyone is welcome to make the trip back (same trip as Monday, September 19, above).

With nearly 40 boats - 24' to 80' LOA - participating in this race last year, it resumed its place as one of the largest races in Ventura County. If you're not racing, try to get to Hollywood Beach or out on the water to watch them start. If you're on the water, please stay away from the boats that are racing and especially near the anchored power boat flying a CIYC burgee and RC (Race Committee) flag.

  - Thursday, September 8 6:30-8:30PM, CIYC Patio, Hybrid (Live + Zoom, link below) North America's Best Kept Secret the Apostle Islands, Speaker Capt Robb Rice The stunning archipelago of 22 islands off Wisconsin's northern tip in Lake Superior is a boater's paradise in summer. The Apostle Islands National Lakeshore is located near Bayfield, Wisconsin on the largest, cleanest, and coldest of the Great Lakes. It is known for its collection of historic lighthouses, sandstone sea caves, old growth remnant forests, and natural animal habitats. Capt Rice grew up in Milwaukee, is a USAF veteran, attended the University of Hawaii, and has 50-years sailing experience around the globe. He captained a 44-foot sailboat on a trans-Atlantic crossing, part of a 13,500 nautical mile journey from Los Angeles to Greece, holds a 100-ton USCG Captain's License, and recently retired from a 35-year career in public affairs and political campaign management. He lives in Goleta, CA.

Dana, Jr. - Director Lauren Copus, Director, will lead this discussion through Chapter 24 of Dana's memoir after a 2-year sea voyage from Boston to California on a merchant ship (1834-36). His great detail about the coastal cities of San Diego, Capistrano Mission, Dana Point, Los Angeles, San Pedro, Santa Barbara, and San Francisco makes it a special treat for those of us who live along the California coast. This book is a classic, worth a re-read, and available in your favorite format. If you use Audible, their version read by Bernard Mayes is highly recommended by Staff Commodore Sarah Freifeld.

Our event was a great success with much help from CIYC for providing and preparing all the food as well as the CIWSA, CIYC, and sailing community volunteers who helped in so many ways! - Channel Islands Maritime Museum Thursday Monday, 12:00PM 4:00PM, 3900
  Bluefin Circle, Oxnard (https://cimmvc.org) Admission free with
  CIMM Membership and for those under 18; otherwise, \$10 Adults and \$5 Seniors,
  Active Military, and College Students.
- America's Boating Course (ABC) Mondays, October 3 November 14, 7:00-9:00PM, Ventura Yacht Club, 1755 Spinnaker Dr, Ventura. Topics include: Safety Equipment, Navigation Rules, Navigation Aids, Light and Sound Signals, Current Regulations (Local, State, and Federal), Water Sports Safety, Trailering, Anchoring, Seamanship Information, Safe Boating Practices and Much More. Each topic will be presented by instructors with experience on boats and in local waters.

This class is for the beginning boater, first mates, and anyone who helps crew on a boat. If you need your California Boaters Card, this class will qualify you. The cost of the class is \$55, payable either by check made out to "VSPS" or by cash, which you bring with you on the first night of class.

Boat Handling and Seamanship (ABC) - Tuesdays, October 4 - November 15, 7:00-9:00PM, Ventura Yacht Club, 1755 Spinnaker Dr, Ventura. This new course emphasizes the basic skills that are required to operate a power boat (or sailboat under power) in our local waters. Topics include: Rules of the Road, Confidence in Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence while Underway, Anchoring with Assurance; Emergencies on Board, and Knots and Line Handling. The instructor has over 20 years of practical experience in skippering her trawler within the Santa Barbara Channel. This class is for boaters seeking to improve their boat handling skills and understanding of essential rules for navigation in inland and coastal waters. This is an interactive class, so be ready to ask questions and meet other boaters from the local area. Prerequisite: The ABC Boating Class (above) or a California Boater ID. If interested in the class, attend the first night and bring cash or a check to "VSPS" for \$55 if a VSPS/USPS Member or \$100 for Non-Members. - To Pay your Dues: Mail a Check to CIWSA, 3600 Harbor Blvd PMB 268, Oxnard, CA 93035, or pay with Zelle (sunglade@prodigy.net). Regular member dues are \$100/year. Associate/Cruising member dues are \$50/year (25 or younger or live outside Ventura, Santa Barbara, or LA counties more than 6mos of the year). Dues at either level are reduced by 75% in July and August, 50% after September 1, and, if paid in December, dues are valid for December (holiday party) and discounted 5% toward the next year.
