 - 5th Sunday Small Boat Daysails: The Small Boat Daysail last Spring was success, so Lauren Copus, CIWSA Director, and Michele Ackerman, CIWSA Director/Treasurer, have teamed up again to host several small boat daysails for

local youth and members of Fairwind Yacht Club-Channel Islands (FYC-CI) and CIWSA. Weather-permitting, we are planning to offer Small Boat Daysails on October 30, 2022, and in months in 2023 with a 5th Sunday, ie, January 29, April 30, July 30, and October 29. When feasible, FYC-CI Catalina 14s may be sailed in the "pond" behind the Vons shopping center at Wooley and Victoria or Catalina/Capri 22s or other small keelboats may be sailed in the harbor and on the ocean. Isolation over thousands of years has created unique animals, plants, and archeological resources found nowhere else on Earth, and helped preserve a place where visitors can experience coastal southern California as it once was.

Ethan McKinley grew up in Littleton, Colorado and has a bachelor's degree in international business and French from the University of Denver. He is an Eagle Scout and takes any opportunity to play in the great outdoors (hiking, camping,

mountain and road biking, climbing, and mountaineering), frequently exploring national parks in his free time. He is a self-professed history buff and enjoys photography.

"Ethan is one of the few National Park Service superintendents who has experience building a new national park from the ground up," said Stan Austin, regional director for the National Park Service's Pacific West Region, when Ethan transferred here a few years ago. "With this unique perspective and his passion for building strong relationships with community stakeholders, I am confident he is the right fit for Channel Islands."

• Sailing-Related Webinars, Videos, and Movies - We will resume streaming a variety of video programs on the big screen at CIYC. We don't send invitations or reminders for video streaming, and no RSVP is necessary. Check the public CIWSA Google calendar to see what's playing:

We can change the calendar and add more webinars and movies. If the Google streaming schedule doesn't work for you, let me know when and what you'd like to watch, and we'll try to work something out. Unfortunately, these programs don't Zoom well and live attendance is required (at CIYC or WiFi elsewhere with my computer). Currently available for streaming:

- Marine Weather University: Fundamentals of Marine Weather & Wind Shifts - Meteorologist, pro sailor, and America's Cup veteran, Chris Bedford, presents the 8-part "Fundamentals of Marine Weather," akin to a college-level, introductory meteorology course. Each lesson builds on the last, so it's helpful to see them in sequence and multiple times!
- ASA/PredictWind: Departure Planning and Weather Routing Whether you are a daysailer or passagemaker, weather routing and departure planning remains an important factor. Learn how to use PredictWind for planning your passage and for weather routing while underway. This 1.5hr online session with Nick Olson covers setup and step by step instructions for using the PredictWind Offshore App. Nick has been sailing for 40 years, from dinghies, to Olympic classes and double-handed offshore racing. He has worked at PredictWind for 8 years in software development and customer education for the PredictWind Offshore App.
- ASA/North U: Sail Trim Bundle This on-demand, online bundle consists of 3 subjects presented by Bill Gladstone Upwind Sail Trim (approx 3.5hrs), Symmetrical Spinnaker Trim (approx 1.5hrs), and Asymmetrical Sail Trim (approx 2hrs). Each subject has multiple segments of variable duration (15min-1hr), which we can parse into 1-2hr intervals.
- ASA: Introduction to Marine Diesels Presented in two 2-hour sessions this
 on-demand online course provides an overview of the mechanism of marine
 diesel operation as well as practical aspects in their use.

 ASA/Cruising World: Docking Made Easy - This 25min guide with Peter Isler gives practical pointers for docking under sail and power, upwind and downwind.

- Channel Islands Boating Center CIBC (https://www.ciboating.org) is staffed by students and faculty from CSU Channel Islands. When adult courses are offered, they teach small boat sailing, kayaking, and standup paddleboarding (SUP).
- America's Boating Course (ABC) Mondays, October 3 November 14, 7:00-9:00PM, Ventura Yacht Club, 1755 Spinnaker Dr, Ventura. Topics include: Safety Equipment, Navigation Rules, Navigation Aids, Light and Sound Signals, Current Regulations (Local, State, and Federal), Water Sports Safety, Trailering, Anchoring, Seamanship Information, Safe Boating Practices and Much More. If you need your California Boaters Card, this class will qualify you. Contact Bob Stine at bobstine@verizon.net or 805-458-2491. This course is already underway!
- Boat Handling and Seamanship (ABC) Tuesdays, October 4 November 15, 7:00-9:00PM, Ventura Yacht Club, 1755 Spinnaker Dr, Ventura. This new course emphasizes the basic skills that are required to operate a power boat (or sailboat under power) in our local waters. Topics include: Rules of the Road, Confidence in Docking and Undocking, Boating with Confidence while Underway, Anchoring with Assurance; Emergencies on Board, and Knots and Line Handling. Prerequisite: The ABC Boating Class (above) or a California Boater ID. If interested in the class, contact Bob Stine at bobstine@verizon.net or at 805-458-2491. This course is already underway!

• To Pay your Dues: Mail a Check to CIWSA, 3600 Harbor Blvd PMB 268, Oxnard, CA 93035, pay with cash to a Board Member, or pay with Zelle (sunglade@prodigy.net). Regular member dues are \$100/year. Associate/Cruising member dues are \$50/year. Dues at either level are reduced by 75% in July and August, 50% after September 1, and, if paid before January, dues are discounted by 5% and valid for the remainder of 2022 and all of 2023!
