The annual Newport to Ensenada Race (N2E) begins Friday, April 22, as 120 boats attempt the 123nm course to Ensenada while another 50 will sail to Dana Point (N2DP) or San Diego (N2SD). This year, your Commodore and CIWSA crew (Kelly Sloan and Alison Rowe) have 'jumped ship' from WAILANI, my Tartan Ten, and will be racing with Capt Kathy St Amant, SCYA Rear Commodore and Women's Boating Event Chair, on RASCAL, a Hunter Legend 37.5, in PHRF-C Class. To follow us online and cheer us on, download the application "YB Races" to your android or iOS device and add the "Newport to Ensenada 2022" race for a slightly delayed display of every boat's position and statistics! Other competitors from Ventura County include PARADISE FOUND (also PHRF-C), UHAMBO (PHRF-A), TAZZY (CRUZ-SPIN-B), KASTOR POLLUX and WAHOO (ORCA-A), and CHRONIC and 5150 (PHRF-UL-B).

We recently traveled to Newport and met a number of CIWSA members and prospective members at Gail Hine's 32nd Sailing Convention for Women, which was postponed from February 6 to April 2 and canceled altogether in 2021 due to COVID. - MONTHLY MEETINGS AND OTHER LAND-BASED EVENTS We meet on the 2nd Thursday of most months (except July and August). - SAILING-RELATED TRAINING VIDEOS/WEBINARS I plan to stream a variety of videos and webinars on the big screen, live at CIYC (no Zoom). There is no charge for CIYC and CIWSA members, but donations are welcome for CIWSA's Youth Sailing Scholarship Fund and/or the CIYC/CIWSA J24 & Laser Expense Fund.  - Marine Weather University: Fundamentals of Marine Weather & Wind Shifts CIYC (Live Attendance Only) – This 8-part online training program is presented by Chris Bedford, who is a meteorologist with over 35yrs experience, a pro sailor, and a marine weather consultant respected by the world's most accomplished sailors for his marine meteorology expertise. Be prepared for a college-level introductory meteorology course. Each lesson builds on the last, so it's important to see them in sequence and multiple times! Additionally, we will stream a 2-part webinar about Wind Shifts after completion of the first 3 sessions of the Fundamentals course.
 - **ASA Intro to Marine Diesel** Each of the 2 parts is 2 hours long and covers the history, theory, and practical aspects of modern marine diesel engines.
