- SAVE THE DATE: Saturday, August 13 NWSA/CIWSA AdventureSail® Day We're excited to announce our inaugural AdventureSail® Day for underserved girls (9-14 years old), Saturday, August 13, as a new CIWSA community service event in partnership with Channel Islands Yacht Club (CIYC) and other local individuals and organizations. The National Women's Sailing Association (NWSA, https://womensailing.org) created AdventureSail® Day decades ago and published these goals:
 - To enrich the lives of America's young underserved girls through sailing, with an emphasis on diversity and inclusion
 - To open girls' eyes to a multitude of life's positive possibilities, and through continued participation in sailing:
 - Provide a positive activity that will encourage affirmative life choices
 - Develop self-confidence to overcome adverse living conditions
 - Introduce career paths and opportunities that involve the marine industry,
 marine related sciences and their local waters

Following the NWSA example, and with diversity in mind we hope to host approximately 25 young girls for an AdventureSail® Day in our local waters.

They were able to retrieve the rudder and keep the boat off the beach/rocks, but without a rudder the outboard motor took them in circles, so they contacted the Harbor Patrol for a tow. When they heard Tina hailing the Harbor Patrol, Lauren and crew headed back to the dock.

Though it wasn't the fun sail they had planned, those onboard through SWEET DEAL's ordeal reportedly remained calm, worked together to get back safely, shared the pride of effectively handling the emergency, and built their mutual trust in one another. After all that excitement, Tina, Lauren and 3 crew members enjoyed a nice lunch together at Chipotles.

Past News

74th Newport to Ensenada (N2E) Race (April 22-23): If you remember March and April, you'll remember having lots of days with small craft and gale force winds! About 10 days before the race I was nervously watching the forecast, reconsidering the safety and comfort of my crew, dreading the beat uphill after the race, and seriously considering withdrawing WAILANI (33ft 7100lb) from the race. From a mutual friend I heard that half of the N2E crew on RASCAL (37ft, 14,400lb, Capt Kathy St Amant, SCCYC) had bailed out at the last minute and Kathy was going to withdraw. So we combined forces and raced with 4 crew from RASCAL (Kathy, Monica, Tim, and Jake) and 4 from WAILANI (Jane, Kelly, Alison, and Dawnita) on the bigger boat.

We saw 17-19kt winds at the start with 25kts through the afternoon and into the evening. Multiple boats shredded their spinnakers (eg, WAHOO, 5150, et al) or had other problems in the high winds, and we all had to work hard to control our boats in the high seas. It was a rhumbline, broad reach from the start to the outside the Coronado Islands, which we reached before dark, and the wind and waves subsided until the following morning.

Many of the maxis, multi-hulls, and ultra-lights went out a bit further for more wind and a better angle to Ensenada. They saw the biggest wind and waves and many made records for elapsed time! RIO 100 (StFYC) set a new N2E elapsed time record of 7:02:17 (7hrs 2min 17sec to sail 123nm!!), and 5 other maxis beat the previous 2016 record. WAHOO's (Bill Gibbs, PBYC and NOSA Staff Commodore, Shionning catamaran) elapsed time was only 9:23:19, which set multiple personal bests and swept the top 3 trophies for the 5th time. CHRONIC (Lonnie Jarvis, Farr 400M, CIYC) took 3rd in ULDB-class, and UHAMBO (David Chase/Carlos Brea, VYC) took 1st place in PHRF-A class.
