VILLAGE ADOPTS BALANCED ANNUAL BUDGET

The Village of Streamwood recently adopted its 2025 Balanced Budget, ensuring that we will continue delivering exceptional services to our community. There are no new fees in 2025, and we are thrilled to maintain our AA bond rating with Standard and Poors. Both are marks of the Village's financial stability.

Later this year, we'll complete construction on the IL-59 Pedestrian Bridge near Irving Park Road, further expanding our pathway connections throughout the community. Additionally, we're moving forward with Phase I of the multi-year Kollar Pond Campus Gateway Project, which promises to enhance the beauty and functionality of our public spaces. We're proud of our "pay-as-you-go" approach to financial management, which has served our community well. By prioritizing our initiatives and using currently available resources, we can complete projects like the pedestrian bridge and Kollar Pond Campus Gateway Project without impacting taxpayers.

WHERE DO YOUR PROPERTY TAXES GO?

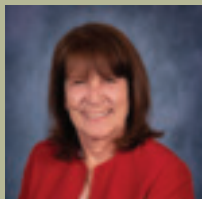
In 2024, the Village received \$12.8 million, or 13 cents of every property tax dollar. Over 60% of your property tax bill is directed to School District U-46. The Village's portion of your property taxes supports essential services like police, fire, and public works. In fact, most of our General Fund budgeted expenditures (\$33.8 million or 82.2%) are dedicated to these core services.

Village Earns Financial Reporting Award

For the 36th consecutive year, the Village has been awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting Award by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA). Streamwood is one of only a handful of organizations statewide to have achieved this milestone. The Village's commitment to transparency and accountability is evident in its annual Comprehensive Financial Report, which has been found to be easy to read, organized, and compliant with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP). This award represents the highest form of recognition for excellence in state and local government financial reporting.

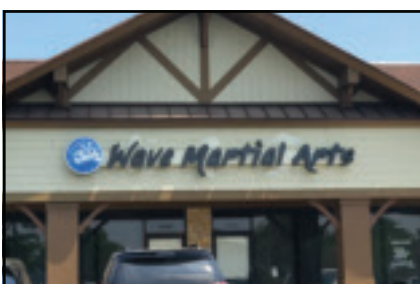

Board Expands Grants for Home Repairs

The Village Board recently renewed two grant programs that support local homeowners with code-correcting home renovations and repairs. The Single-family Home Repair Program provides up to \$25,000 in funding (0% interest) to income-eligible homeowners for large-scale projects. The Handyman Repair Program offers one-time assistance of up to \$1,000 for minor repairs, excluding cosmetic work. Both programs are administered by North West Housing Partnership. Development Assistance Program Helps Local Businesses Thrive



The Village's Business Assistance Program has been renewed for 2025. This program, which uses gaming revenue, provides grants of up to \$25,000 to help local businesses improve their properties with new signage, landscaping, or renovations. Since its launch in 2022, nearly \$200,000 has been awarded to eligible businesses, helping them invest in their facilities with projects such as signage, interior updates, and landscaping improvements. The program offers reimbursement grants for eligible commercial properties, with priority given to sales tax-producing businesses including retail establishments and restaurants. VILLAGE CODE CORNER

Holiday Decoration Removal Reminders

Temporary and holiday lights are beautiful to look at, but if they're damaged, they can pose a serious fire risk. That's why we're reminding residents to remove them within 90 days of putting them up. If you're found to have left your lights up after the 90-day mark, you'll receive a friendly reminder from our Community Development Department. Thank you for doing your part to keep our community safe.

Snow Removal Reminders

When snow falls and temperatures drop, please keep the snow on the parkway to prevent dangerous road conditions. Please shovel or blow snow to either side of your drive on the parkway. Pushing it onto the street is not only prohibited, but it can also create ice slicks and dangerous road conditions.

Parking During Winter Weather

Parking is prohibited from 1-5 a.m. on Village streets, except where noted in specific subdivisions. Parking is also prohibited after a two inch or greater snowfall until streets are fully plowed. Through February 28, vehicles parked in residential driveways may block the sidewalk or parkway from 7 a.m.-9 p.m., Monday through Friday, and from 9 a.m.-9 p.m., Saturday and Sunday. Questions? 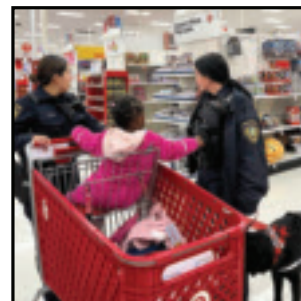
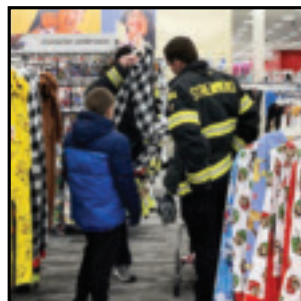

Connecting our Community - Route 59 Bridge Takes Shape

Despite the winter temperatures, construction has continued on the Route 59 Pedestrian Bridge and Boardwalk. Due to supply chain issues, installation of the prefabricated steel bridge component will likely begin in September. The project is still expected to be complete by year-end. Weather permitting, crews have been working to drive the steel foundation piles for the boardwalk, beginning on the east side first and then moving to the west side. Each phase of pile driving lasts approximately three to four weeks.



This multi-use path is a vital component of the goal in our Comprehensive Plan to enhance connectivity and safe transportation options within the Village. As part of this initiative, the Village has been working collaboratively with multiple agencies, including various Village, state, and federal funding sources, such as the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and Cook County.

The majority (80%) of this project's cost is funded through grants. The Village's portion has been earmarked and saved through careful financial management to ensure that there is no direct impact on our taxpayers. Coming Soon! Campus Gateway Project

Residents will soon see activity as the Campus Gateway project comes to life! Located at Kollar Pond on Irving Park Road, just east of the Police Station and Village Hall, this open space will undergo significant improvements. This spring, construction will begin on a bike path along the west side of the property (adjacent to the Police Station) while the remaining design work is completed.

Thanks to community input at multiple workshops that guided the plan, the Campus Gateway will include trails, improved water quality, gathering spaces, landscaping, retaining walls, a pavilion, public art, and other features.

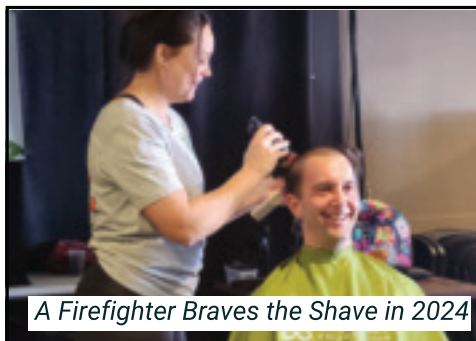

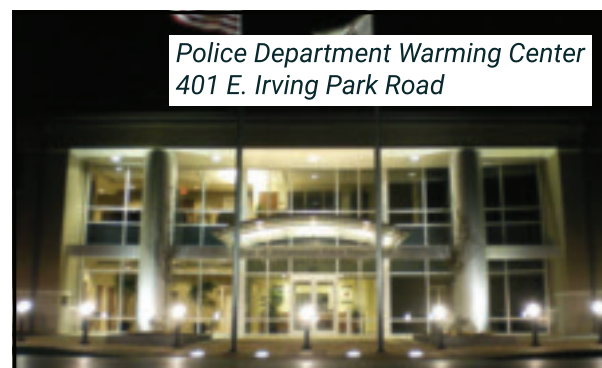
Freezin' for a Reason

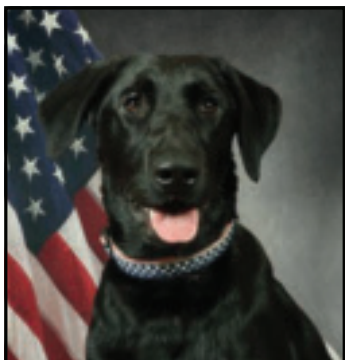
We've Got You Covered: Local Warming Centers

Police Department Expands Public Outreach Program



The Police Department continues to expand its public outreach efforts, which includes the K-9 Comfort Dog program. Hope was sworn into service in December 2021 and has become a familiar sight at schools, events, nursing and assisted living homes, and more. She is trained to provide comfort to people in times of crisis. Hope is so popular and has been so well-received, that the Police Department is evaluating adding a second Comfort Dog in the near future! Grant Funds Awarded to Combat Unsafe Driving

The Police Department was awarded over \$36,000 in grant funds from the Illinois Department of Transportation to continue traffic enforcement campaigns in 2025. This funding will support approximately 450 hours of enforcement on our roadways with a focus on keeping impaired drivers off the road. This is part of the Department's broader effort to reduce the number and severity of accidents and injuries caused by unsafe driving. The Public Works Department operates and maintains the Village's water and sewer systems, as well as 100 miles of streets. Public Works manages all streetlights, sidewalks, parkway trees, snow removal, and construction. They also monitor water quality through management of our storm and sewer systems, and maintain the Village's fleet of over 100 vehicles. Public Works Director Matt Mann and the rest of the team operate out of the Public Works facility on Bartlett Road. Questions? Call (630) 736-3850.

Improving Our Infrastructure

The Village continues to invest in and improve our community's infrastructure. The Public Works Department is currently working on our 2025 Road Program. The Village has continuously invested over \$3 million per year to complete six miles of street improvements. This year, we'll also see the final section of Irving Park Road widened west of Route 59. Winter Road Problems? Here's Who to Call

Our Public Works Department works hard to clear Village streets throughout storm events. If you see an issue with Village roads, call Public Works at (630) 736-3850 or report it through the 3-1-1 system on our website. However, the Village does not plow State of Illinois or Cook County roads. If you see an issue with those roads, please help us report it by calling:

Prevent Frozen Pipes



Freezing temperatures can cause pipes to crack and burst if the water within them freezes. Protect the pipes in your home by following these simple tips:

- Leave a small pencil-sized stream running for faucets that share an exterior wall.
- Open cabinet doors to expose pipes to warm air.
- If pipes freeze, use the master shut-off valve to cut the water flow to the home immediately and call a licensed plumber. Never try to thaw a pipe with a torch or open flame.

Help Keep Fire Hydrants Accessible

When winter weather hits, ice and heavy snowfall can obstruct access to fire hydrants. In an emergency, every second counts. Fire hydrants that are blocked, hidden, or difficult to access can create challenges for our firefighters. Fire trucks carry a limited amount of water, so one of the first tasks at a fire is to locate and connect to a water supply from the nearest hydrant. If they're covered in snow or difficult to locate, it can waste valuable time. In addition to removing snow and debris covering the hydrant itself, you can help by clearing a three foot area around the hydrant. This helps firefighters connect hoses quickly, prevents them from kinking, and ensures a sufficient water supply when it's needed most.



50/50 Tree Program is Open for Orders



The Village of Streamwood's 50/50 Parkway Tree Program is now open! Purchase up to three trees per address at 50% of the cost - the Village pays the other half! The Village also offers tree planting on private property for the full price of the tree plus a \$25 service fee per tree. Choose from a variety of trees with a one-time replacement guarantee. Orders must be submitted by **March 10**. Planting starts in late April through June.
